EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2017- 2018 COUNTY CLASSIFICATION AND PAY STUDY

Origin of Study

On average, every three years, the Personnel Department conducts a competitive market pay analysis of the current county pay plan in order to determine the degree of competitiveness with other jurisdictions, and the fair market value of the county's pay structure.

Setting

The previous pay plans study was conducted in 2014. This was a six-month study which resulted in pay changes and was adopted by the Montgomery County Commission.

Study

In order to conduct a market comparison analysis, jurisdictions needed to be identified to be studied. In selecting participants, three main points were taken into consideration: what jurisdictions are similar to Montgomery organizationally; what jurisdictions have similar jobs and pay plans, and what jurisdictions are similar in size and demographics. Based on these criteria, eight jurisdictions were identified to participate in the comparison. The eight jurisdictions are: Mobile County, Jefferson County, Madison County; cities of Tuscaloosa, Dothan, Birmingham, Mobile, and Montgomery.

The next step was to gather pay plans from the participating jurisdictions. These pay plans included job pay ranges and pay plan structures (e.g., numbers of pay steps and ranges, and percentage increases between pay steps).

Next, the analyst identified benchmark jobs that could easily be compared to jobs in other jurisdictions. These benchmarks were established for each pay grade in the county pay plan. The benchmarks were chosen based on their ubiquitous nature across jurisdictions. Using these benchmarks, the analyst determined the starting pay, midpoint, and ending pay

for each of the eight jurisdictions. Then, the analyst calculated the average starting pay, midpoint, and ending pay for each pay grade, which were then compared to the corresponding pay grades in the county pay plan.

Findings and Recommendations

Overall findings showed that Montgomery County is fairly competitive, with the exceptions listed in the following recommendations:

- A. Increase the Corrections Pay Plan salaries by 4%.
- B. For every promotion within a series, grant a salary increase ranging from 7-10%* without exceeding the top pay step. A series is defined by a group of classifications that have a linear relationship of supervision and increased responsibility (e.g. deputy sheriff, civil engineer technicians, service maintenance workers, administrative support, etc). These series have classifications that are frequently titled I, II, and III.
- C. All sworn employees' salaries will be adjusted to the new minimum pay step if recommendation B is enacted (see Public Safety Pay Plan).

*Current step multiplied by 10% then move to the step in the new pay grade that does not exceed the 10% calculation.

CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT

THIS CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT made and entered into as the 18th day of June, 2018, between Troy Cablevision, Inc. of Troy, Alabama and Montgomery County Commission, Montgomery, Alabama.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Troy Cablevision, Inc. owns and operates a business and agrees to furnish high-speed data network to extend from downtown Montgomery County Facilities to the Probate/Revenue East in accordance with all provisions and specifications of Invitation to Bid No. 51965-18B-021, as issued by the Montgomery County Commission on May 14, 2018 (hereinafter referred to as the Invitation to Bid, a copy of which is attached hereto).

WHEREAS, In Consideration thereof, Troy Cablevision, Inc. and Montgomery County Commission agree as follows:

1. That all terms, conditions, and specifications of Invitation to Bid are incorporated herein by this reference.
2. That the period of the contract will be for three (3) years, beginning June 18, 2018 and ending June 17, 2021. That prices stipulated in the bid by Troy Cablevision, Inc. shall remain firm for the three (3) year period.
3. That Troy Cablevision, Inc. shall at all times be in compliance with all specifications and special provisions within the Invitation to Bid.
4. That Montgomery County Commission or Troy Cablevision, Inc. may terminate this agreement at any time during the contract period by giving a thirty (30) day written notice to the other party.
5. That Troy Cablevision, Inc. agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold the Montgomery County Commission and its employees, agents, officers and servants free and harmless from any and all losses, claims, liens, not limited to, the amounts of judgments, penalties, interests, court costs, legal fees, and all other expenses incurred by the County arising in favor of any party, including employees of Troy Cablevision, Inc., death or damages to property and without limitation by enumeration, all other claims or demands of every character but only on the proportion of and to the extent such losses, claims, liens, demands and causes of action arise out of the negligent acts or omissions of contractor, its employees, agents and officers. Troy Cablevision, Inc. agrees to investigate, handle, respond to, provide defense for and defend any such claims, demand, or suits at its sole expense. Troy Cablevision, Inc. also, agrees to bear all other costs and expense related thereto, even if the claim or claims alleged are groundless, false or fraudulent.

6. If a dispute arises out of or relates to this Agreement or its breach, the parties shall endeavor to settle the dispute first through direct discussions and negotiations. If the dispute cannot be settled through direct discussions or negotiations, the parties shall endeavor to settle the dispute by non-binding mediation. The location of the mediation shall be Montgomery, Alabama. Either party may terminate the mediation at any time after the session, but the decision to terminate must be delivered in person to the other party and the mediator. Engaging in mediation is a condition precedent to any other form of binding dispute resolution. If the parties cannot agree on a mutual resolution then any disputes not resolved by mediation shall be decided in the Circuit Court of Montgomery County, Alabama and governed by the laws of the State of Alabama between the Montgomery County Commission and Troy Cablevision, Inc.
7. By signing this contract, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the agreement, that they will not violate federal immigration law or knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama. Furthermore, a contracting party found to be in violation of this provision shall be deemed in breach of the agreement and shall be responsible for all damages resulting therefrom.

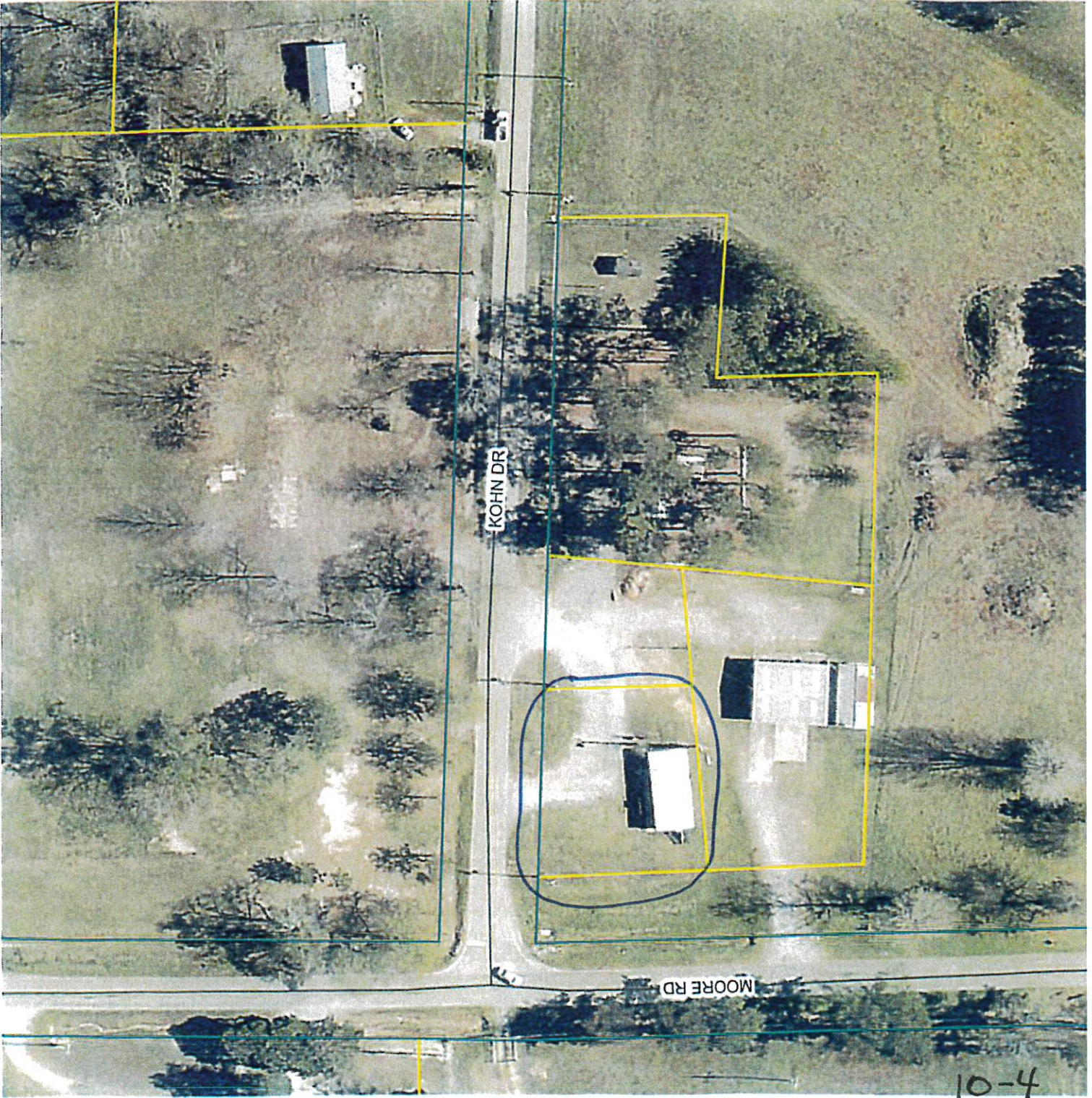
