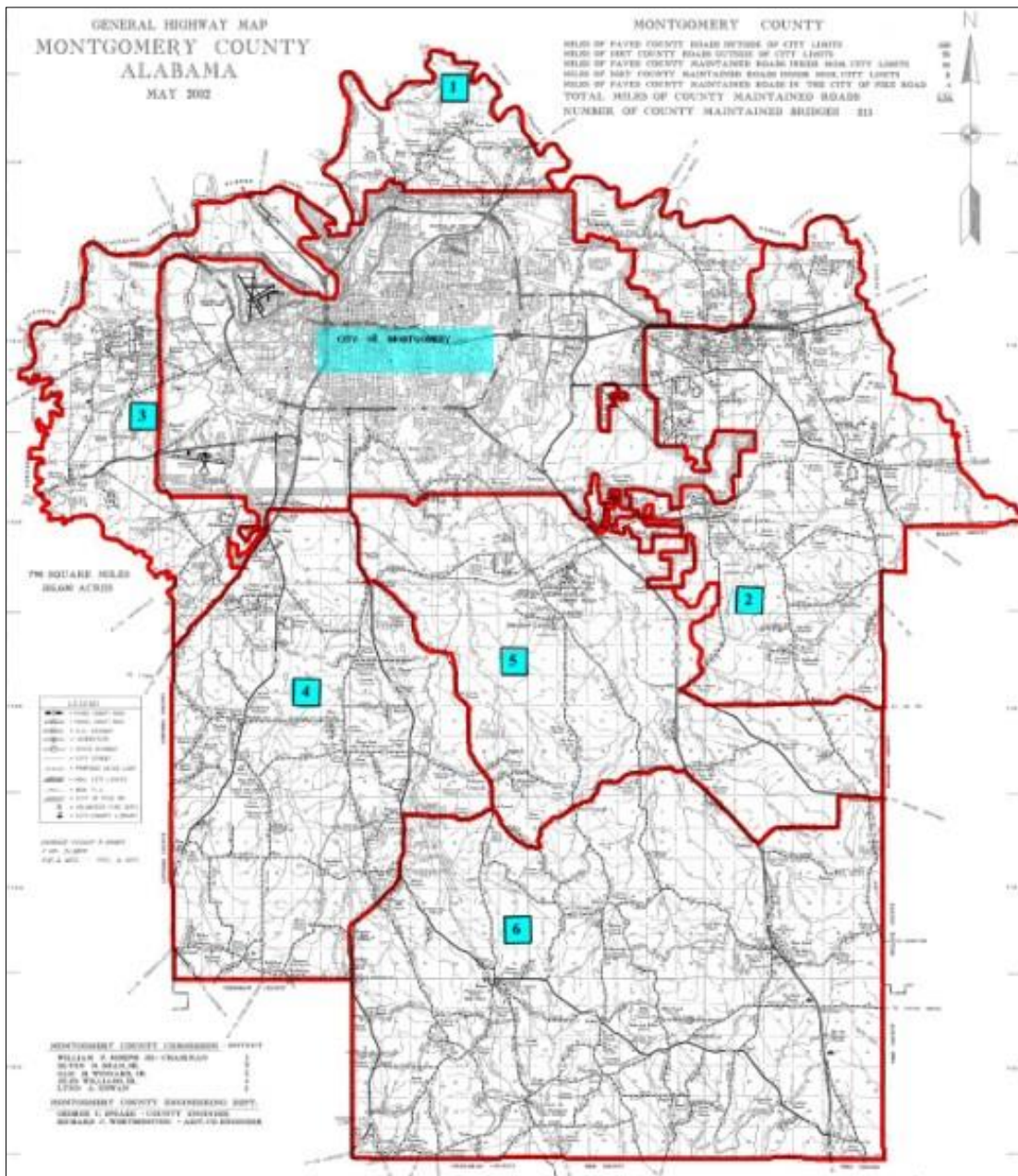

In Memoriam

Sheriff David Thompson "D.T." Marshall 1950-2016



Sheriff Marshall moved to Montgomery when he was 16 years old. He graduated from Sidney Lanier High in 1968 and joined the United States Army where he served for 8 years and received an honorable discharge. He joined the Montgomery Police Department and later became the Commander of the Robbery-Homicide Unit of the Detective Division. When he was working as a detective with the Montgomery Police Department, Sheriff Marshall was instrumental in helping start up a nationwide program with Neighbor's INC. (locally Neighbors who Care), where a clean-up committee of citizens remove biological/hazardous waste that is left behind at a serious violent crime scene. He was a recipient of the award for Officer Of The Year in 1985.

He retired from the Police Department after 20 years of service and in 1999 was sworn in as the 38th man to hold the office of Sheriff of Montgomery County. Sheriff Marshall had an open-door policy and welcomed new ideas and incentives. His average work day was 10 to 12 hours long, seven days a week. He was open minded and participated in every aspect of the Sheriff's Office often personally patrolling the communities and streets of Montgomery County; answering calls and assisting his deputies by working side by side with them and with other personnel.

Sheriff Marshall was a member of the Neighborhood Crime Watch Program of Snowdown and actively participated in other community Neighborhood Watch Programs. He participated in programs with outside agencies such as Crime Stoppers, Crime Victims Compensation, VOCAL, Volunteer Fire and Rescue Departments as well as other Law Enforcement Agencies. He was voted VOCAL's Law Enforcement Officer of the Year for 2005-2006. He was a Master Mason with the Andrew Jackson Masonic Lodge and a long-time member of Snowdown United Methodist Church.

He retired after serving sixteen years as Sheriff and having served four consecutive terms from 1999 to 2015. In the November 10, 2014 issue of The Alabama Gazette, Sheriff Marshall wrote: "...I leave this office with mixed emotions...After 36 years it will be really difficult to get up in the morning knowing that I will not have the challenge that law enforcement gives. I really enjoyed doing the work that I have done for the citizens that I have done both at the Police Department and at the Sheriff's Office. I realized after 4 elections it was time to step down and pass the torch to someone with a fresh mind. I believe that one of the problems with elected officials who homestead a position is that they lose their focus on why they first ran for office. They become complacent and take their position for granted. I did not want this to happen to me because too many people depend on the Sheriff and what he can do for all citizens. I leave knowing that I did my very best for Montgomery County...It is time for this old Sheriff to go out to pasture and to relax and maybe to do some fishing..."

Sheriff Marshall died at home in his sleep on March 23, 2016 after a year and a half bout with cancer. Upon learning of his death, Montgomery County Sheriff's Office Chief Deputy (and retired Montgomery Police Chief) Kevin Murphy in an interview with Advertiser reporter Andrew Yawn remembering their time together at the Montgomery Police Department said: "He (D. T.) was a good law man...He knew the streets. He knew people. He could work a case, solve it. He was a phenomenal investigator and a good guy...could put a name to a face and never forget it...D. T. wasn't the kind of guy who took off a lot. He'd be (at the office) on weekends and late at night. This was his life. This was his family." Rest in peace Sheriff.

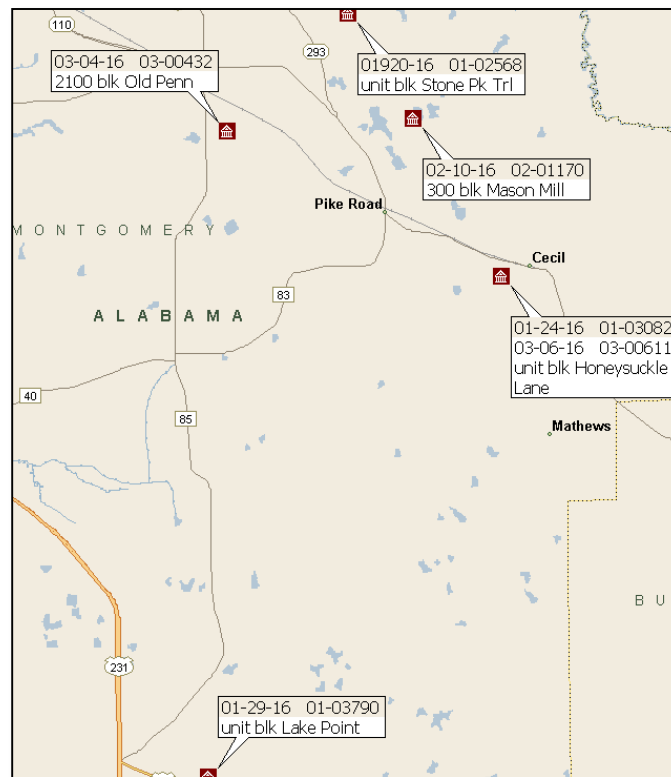

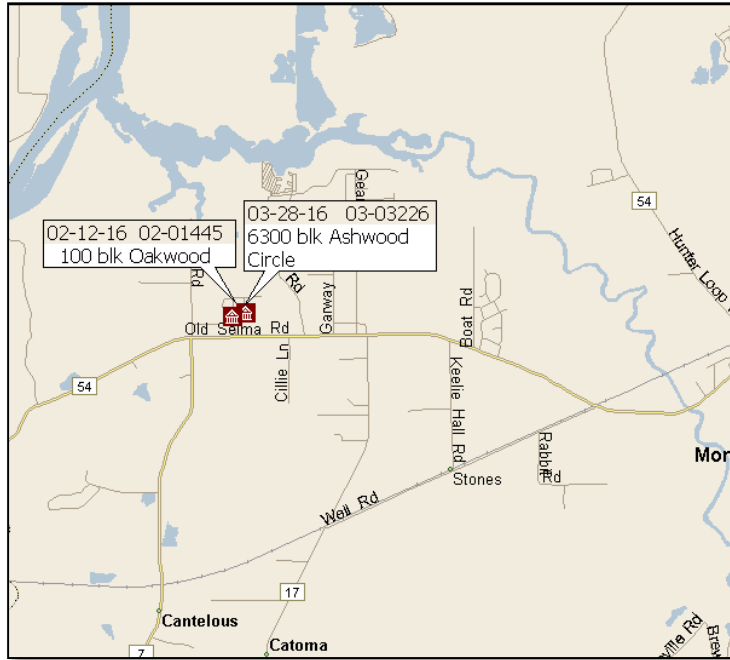

Travis Smith was on bond for Robbery and Property theft at the time he participated in the attempted burglary. His bond on those cases was revoked.

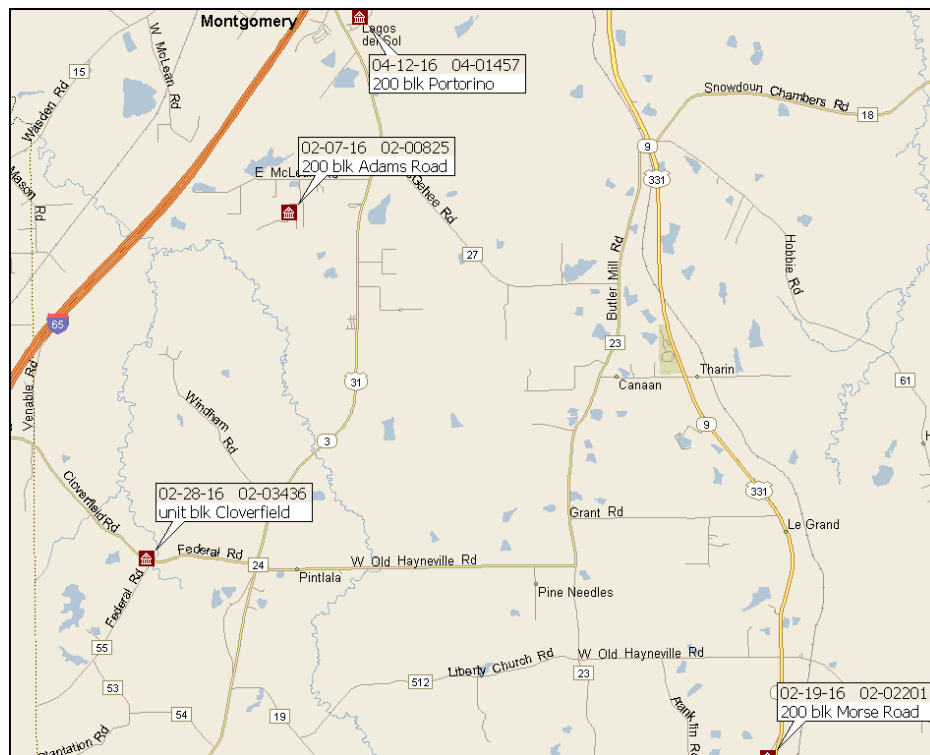

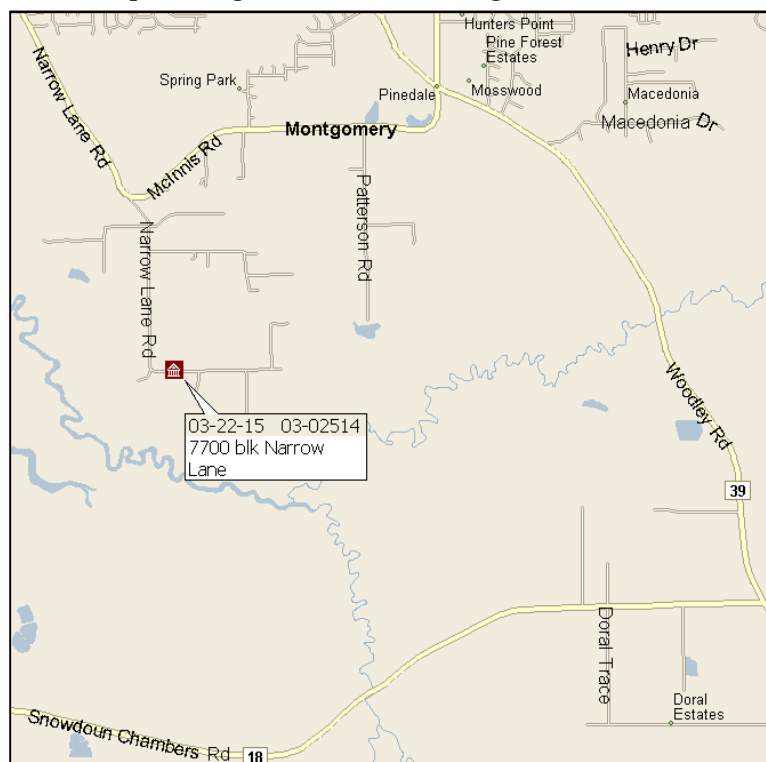

Map showing 2016 Residential Burglaries in District 5



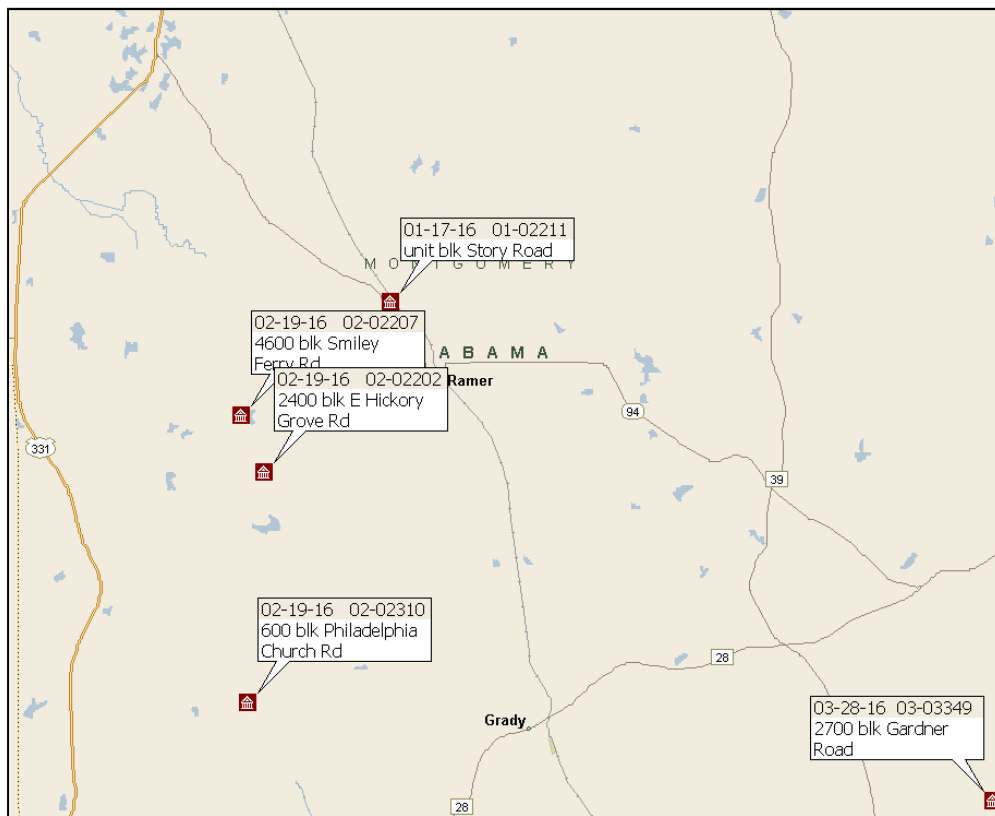

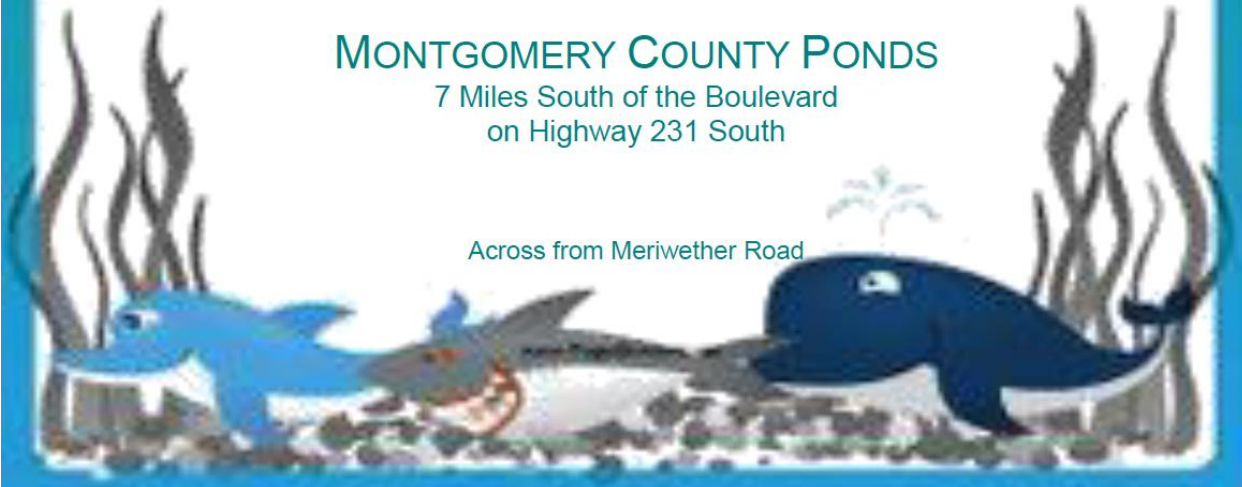

Firearms Familiarization Course

We have already begun our firearms course to "familiarize" Montgomery County citizens about the laws and proper use of a firearm. We know that learning how to protect yourself is very important in today's world. Our course is held one Saturday a month and has been scheduled for the following dates:

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office is now accepting applications for our *Citizens Academy*. The Citizens Academy was established in 1997 to educate the citizens of Montgomery County on how the Sheriff's Office operates and to promote public safety among our community members. Classes are designed to be interesting as well as informative. Citizens are given an opportunity to ride with a Deputy on patrol, tour the County Jail, volunteer at events that are sponsored by the Sheriff's Office as well as train on the Firearms Training Simulator. The course is a 'free' 6-week course that meets on Monday evenings from 6:00-7:00 p.m. at our office, located at 115 South Perry Street and is taught by Sheriff's Office deputies and/or Correctional Officers. All material will be discussed during the meetings and neither homework nor physical activity is required.
