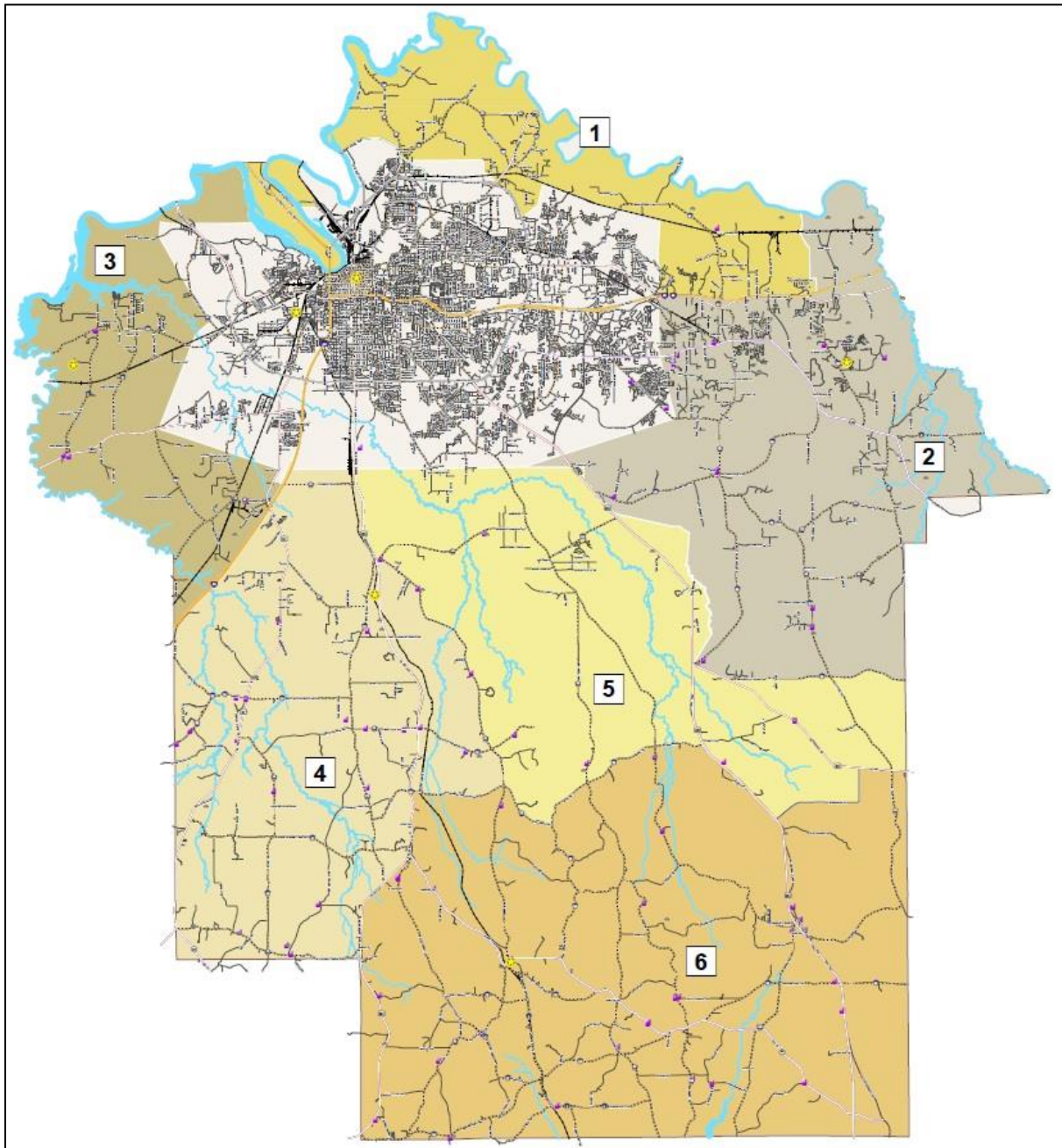

Map showing the patrol districts of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office



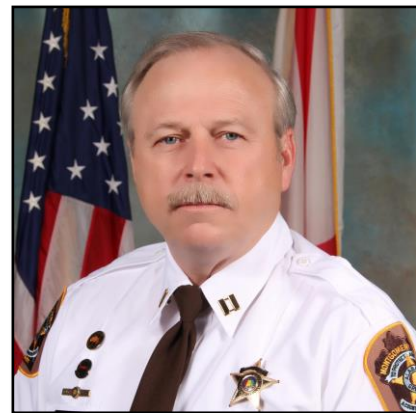
Leadership Montgomery

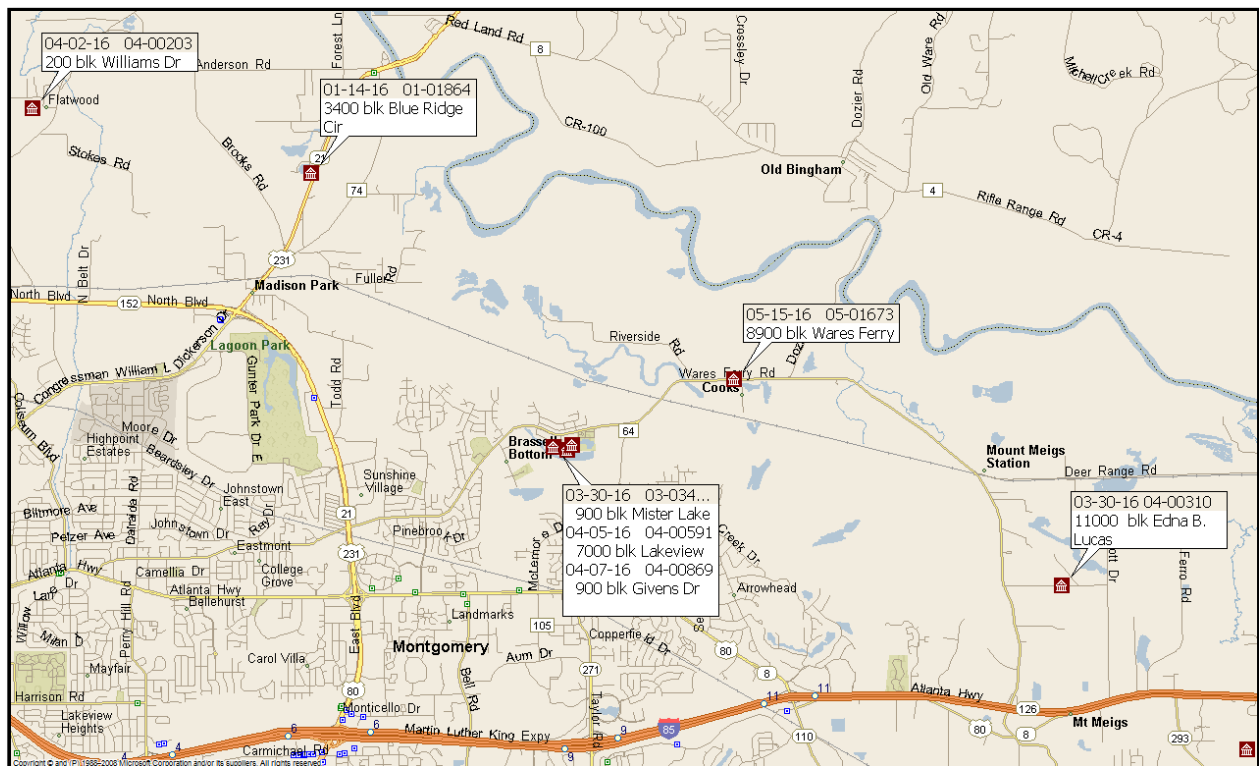

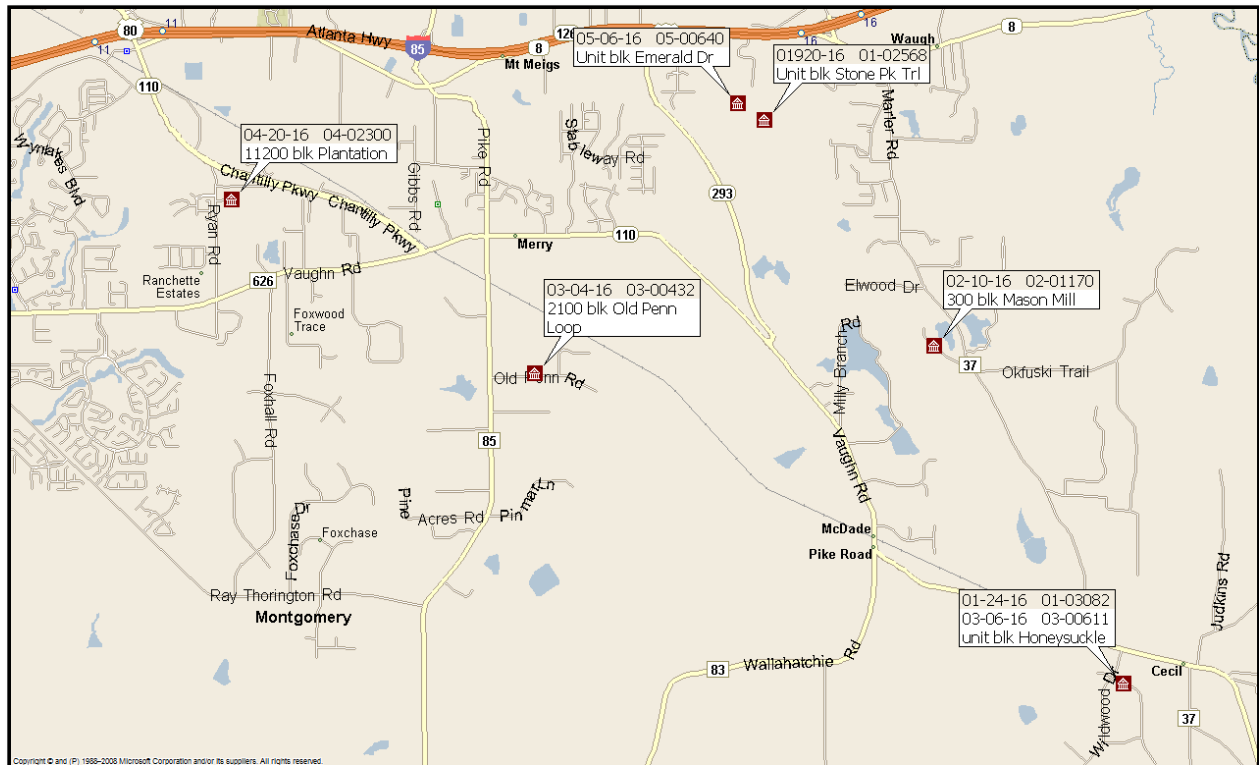

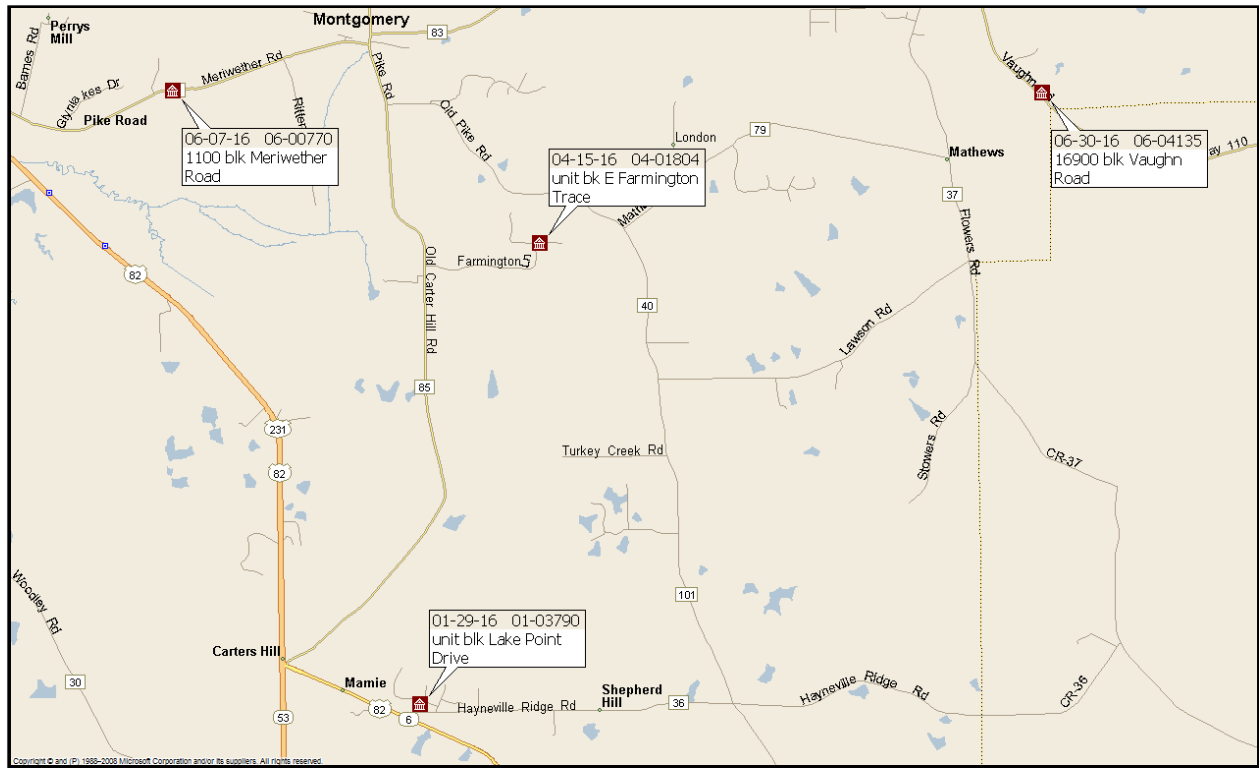

District 2 Arrests

Cpl. J. Shepherd following up on a district 2 burglary noticed a vehicle that he saw in a video that matched a suspect's vehicle in a case of Breaking and Entering of a Vehicle in district 2 which he was also investigating. Following up on the lead, Cpl. Shepherd was able to clear both cases with the arrest of the below suspect.

Arrested: Akili Khalil Tarver age 20 of Montgomery

**Charges: Burglary III (1 count) Theft I (1 count)
B & E Vehicle (1 count) Theft II (1 count)**

Lt. Scot Cone of M.C.S.O. third shift Patrol spotted a suspicious vehicle on an early July morning but was unable to investigate due to being out of service on a previous call. He alerted other patrol units who located the vehicle in the parking lot of a local 24-7 grocery store. The vehicle was occupied by the female shown below who alerted two of her associates who were inside the store. The two males shown below fled out a rear door of the business to avoid being detained. It was determined the vehicle was stolen. M.C.S.O. personnel were assisted by state tracking dogs; Alabama Law Enforcement Agency personnel on the ground and in a helicopter above; and district two residents who reported sightings of two males; eventually led to the suspects being located and arrested.

Jaymes Owens was also charged with Attempting to Elude, Resisting Arrest.

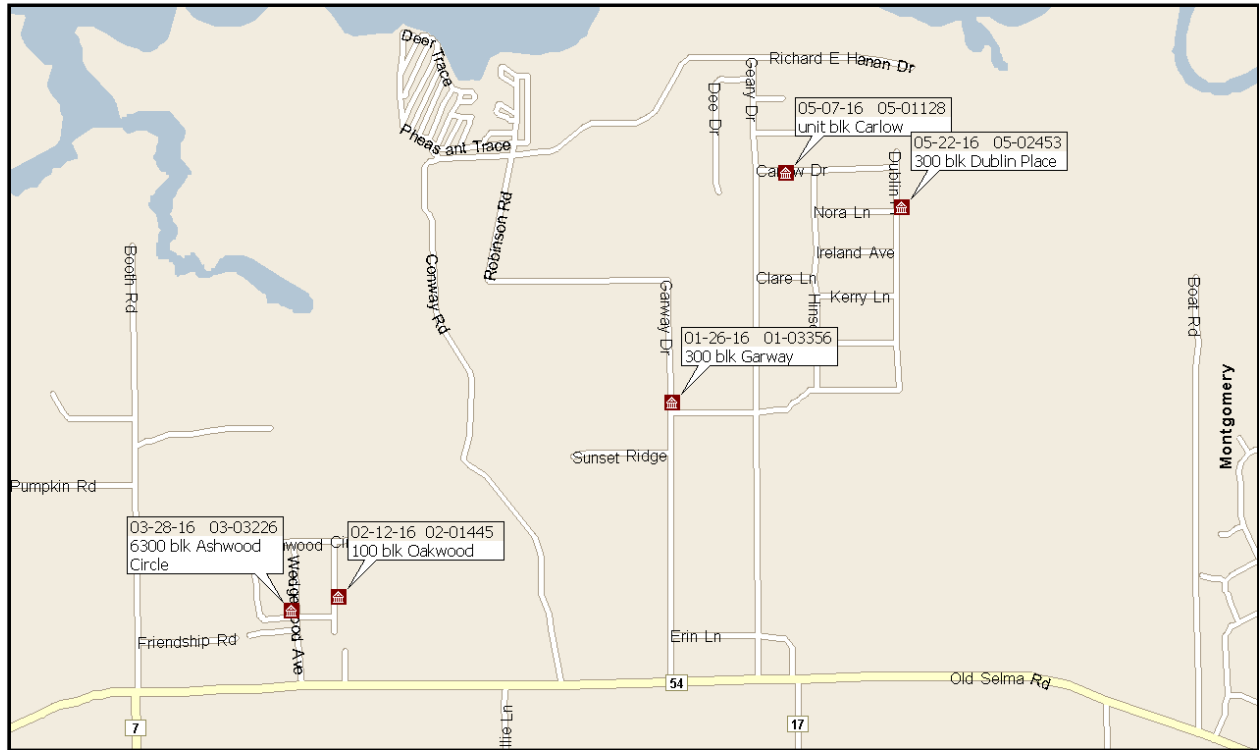

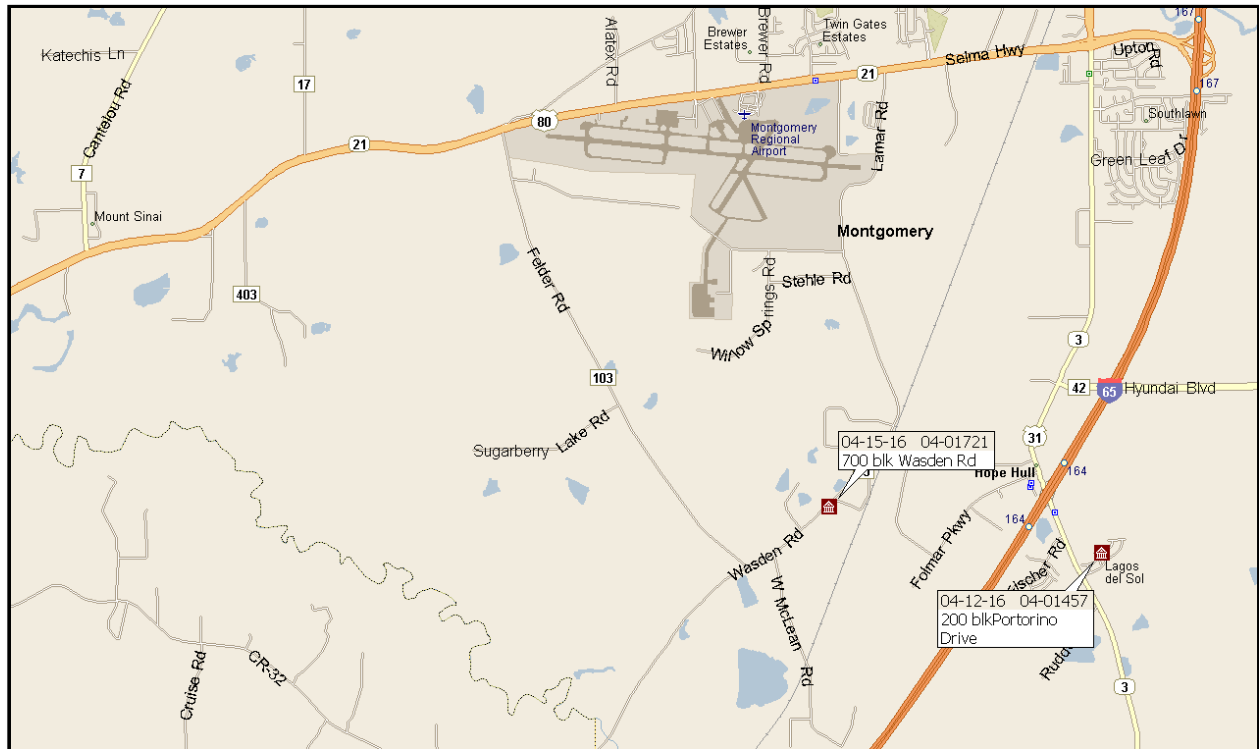

Map showing 2016 Residential Burglaries in South half of District 3



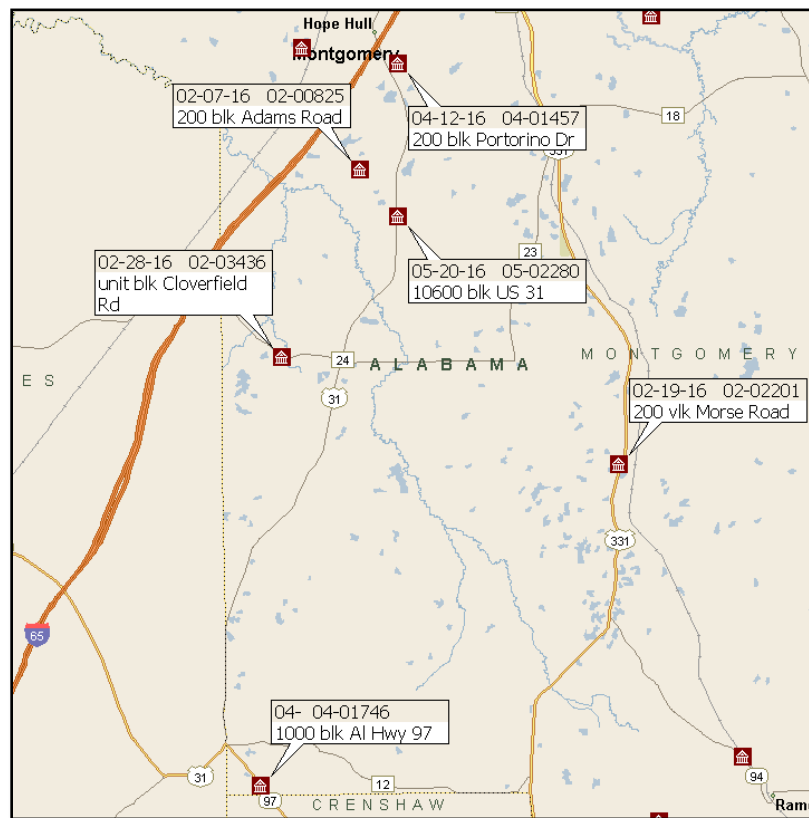

Neighbors of a resident of district 4 alerted M.C.S.O. Dispatchers to a possible burglary in progress in late May. Deputies responding to the residence arrived as the two burglars fled the residence and escaped into the woods. Deputies established a perimeter to contain the suspects and State helicopters, Troopers and tracking dogs from Kilby responded to help search. The suspects eluded capture during the initial search of the area but the next morning one of the suspects was spotted in the area by alert residents. Upon arrival of Deputies, the suspect (R. Rivers) again fled into the woods but was taken into custody after a brief footrace. M.C.S.O. Investigators continued to follow-up on the case and were able to identify the second subject (M. Jackson) who has now also been charged. The case has been cleared by the arrest of the below listed people.

Charges: Burglary III (1 count) Property Theft I (1 count)

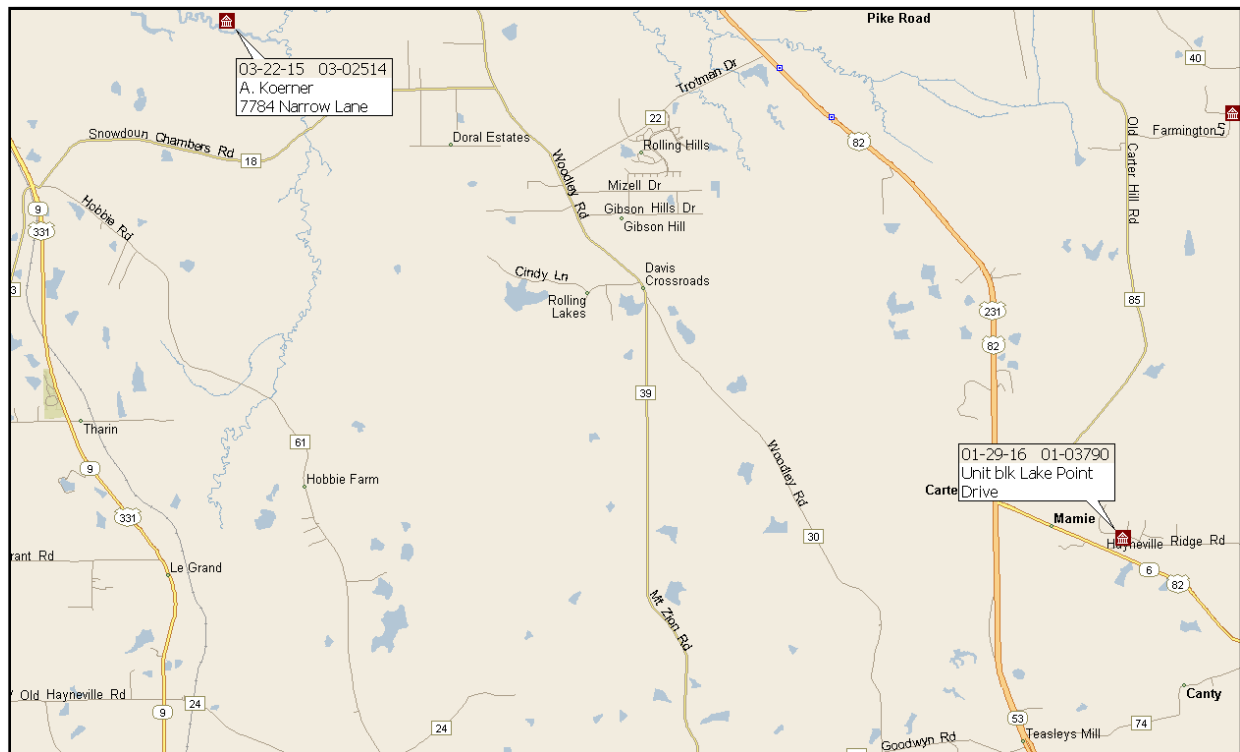

Map showing 2016 Residential Burglaries in District 5



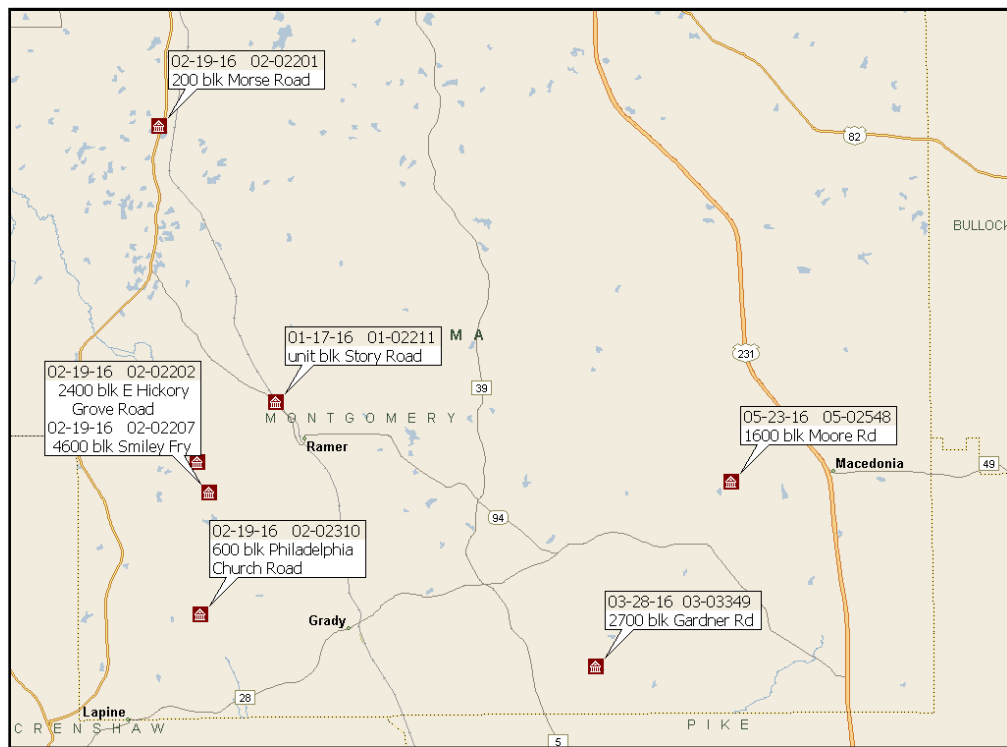

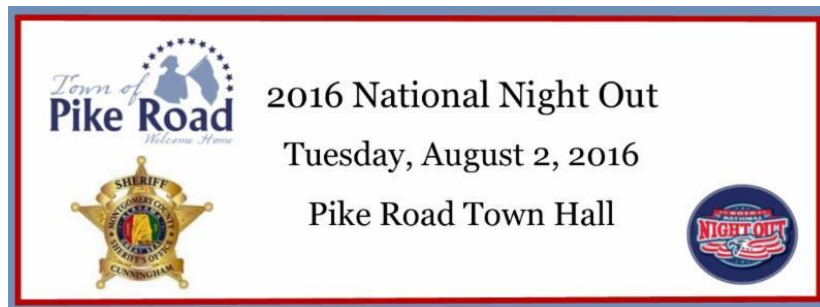
National Night Out

MCSO Firearms Familiarization Course



We have already begun our firearms course to “familiarize” Montgomery County citizens about the laws and proper use of a firearm. We know that learning how to protect yourself is very important in today’s world. Our course is held one Saturday a month and has been scheduled for the following dates:

The class is held at our Firing Range and lasts all day and is **FREE** to Montgomery County citizens with a current pistol permit! The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office is now accepting applications for our *Citizens Academy*. The Citizens Academy was established in 1997 to educate the citizens of Montgomery County on how the Sheriff's Office operates and to promote public safety among our community members. Classes are designed to be interesting as well as informative. Citizens are given an opportunity to ride with a Deputy on patrol, tour the County Jail, volunteer at events that are sponsored by the Sheriff's Office as well as train on the Firearms Training Simulator. The course is a 'free' 6-week course that meets on Monday evenings from 6:00-7:00 p.m. at our office, located at 115 South Perry Street and is taught by Sheriff's Office deputies and/or Correctional Officers. All material will be discussed during the meetings and neither homework nor physical activity is required.
