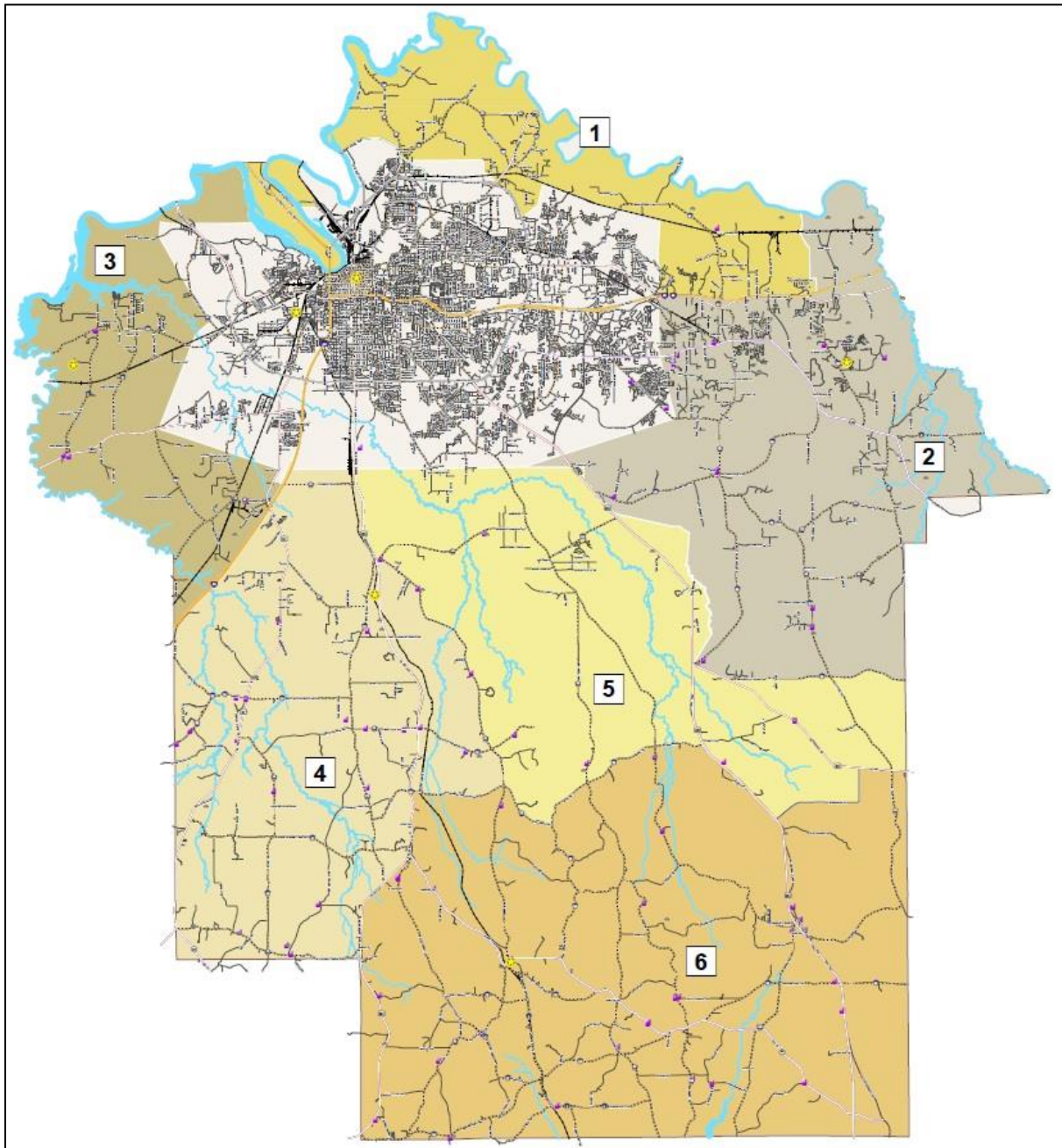

On December 1, 2016, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office Training Facility and Firing Range was officially dedicated to retired Sheriff D.T. Marshall. Sheriff Marshall's sister, Ms. Annie Pease, and other family members are shown here unveiling the sign.



Alabama State Representative Dimitri Polizos (shown here with Sheriff Cunningham and Ms. Pease) was among the speakers at the dedication. Following the unveiling above by Ms. Pease, Representative Polizos on behalf of the Alabama, House of Representatives, presented her with Resolution HR 236 *"MOURNING THE DEATH OF RETIRED MONTGOMERY SHERIFF DAVID THOMPSON MARSHALL"* The resolution in part notes:

"WHEREAS, it is with deep sorrow and regret that we note the lamentable death of David Thompson 'D. T.' Marshall on March 23, 2016 at the age of

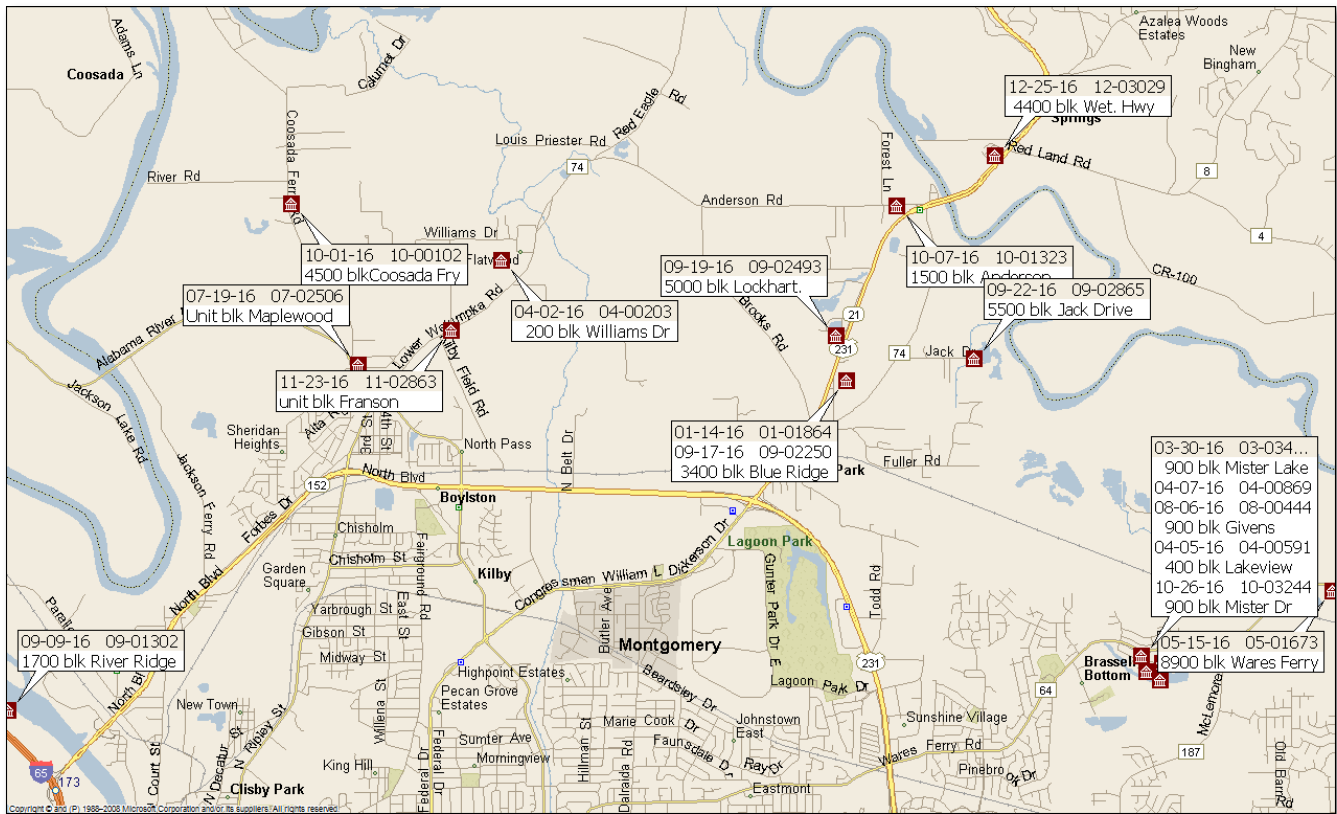

District 2 Arrests

Montgomery Police alerted local law enforcement to a description of a vehicle wanted in several burglaries in their jurisdiction. M.C.S.O. Lt. S. Cone spotted the suspect vehicle in District 2 and when he discovered the driver had given false information as to his identity arrested him. He then transported the subject to MPD's Criminal Investigations Division where it was determined his clothing was the same as witnesses described the suspect in several of their B&E of vehicles and two business burglaries. The below was eventually charged in the cases.

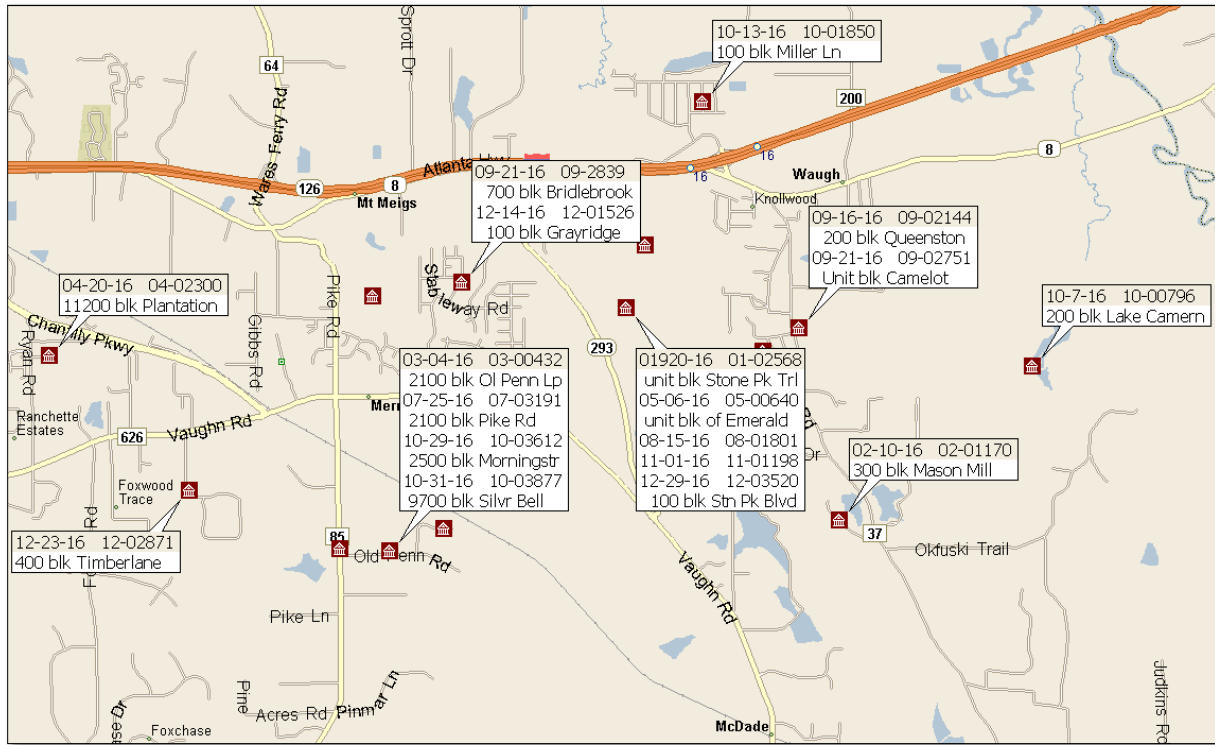
Arrested: Freddie James Moss age 48, of Montgomery.
Charges : Giving False Identification to Law Enforcement Officer
 Burglary III (3 counts) Auto Burglary (4 counts)

In January, a juvenile's family member called Montgomery Police when she saw the juvenile with a firearm. Police responding to the residence developed information connecting the juvenile to a shooting incident in the Waugh community. M.C.S.O. was notified when it was learned the gun was stolen in a January burglary of a residence in the Pike Road Community. Both agencies working together identified and arrested other juveniles who participated in the burglary.

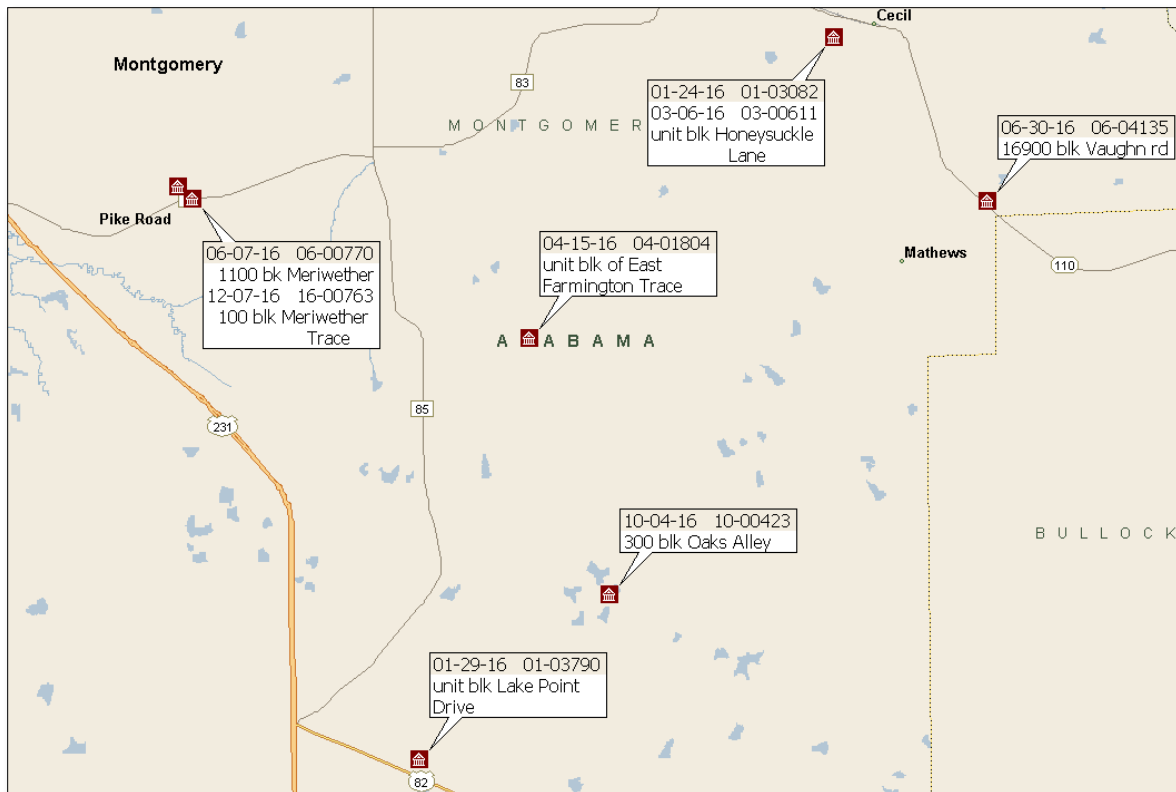

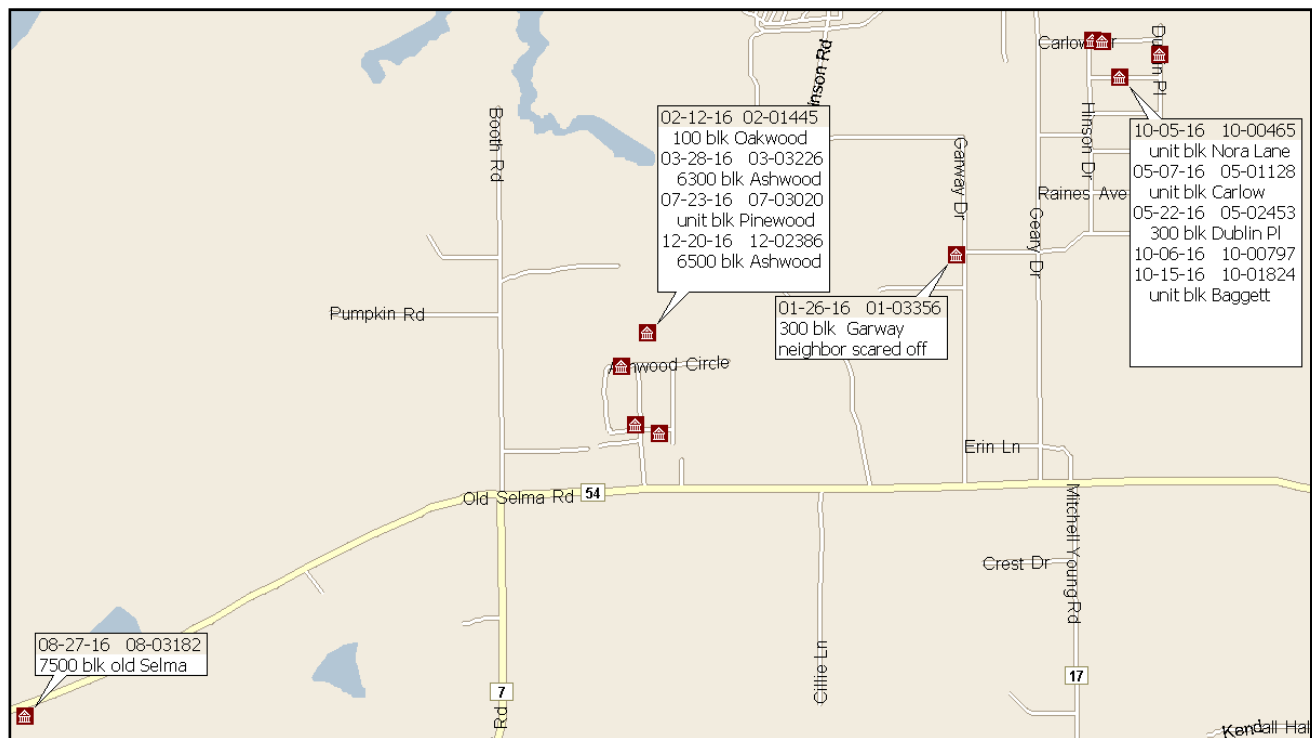

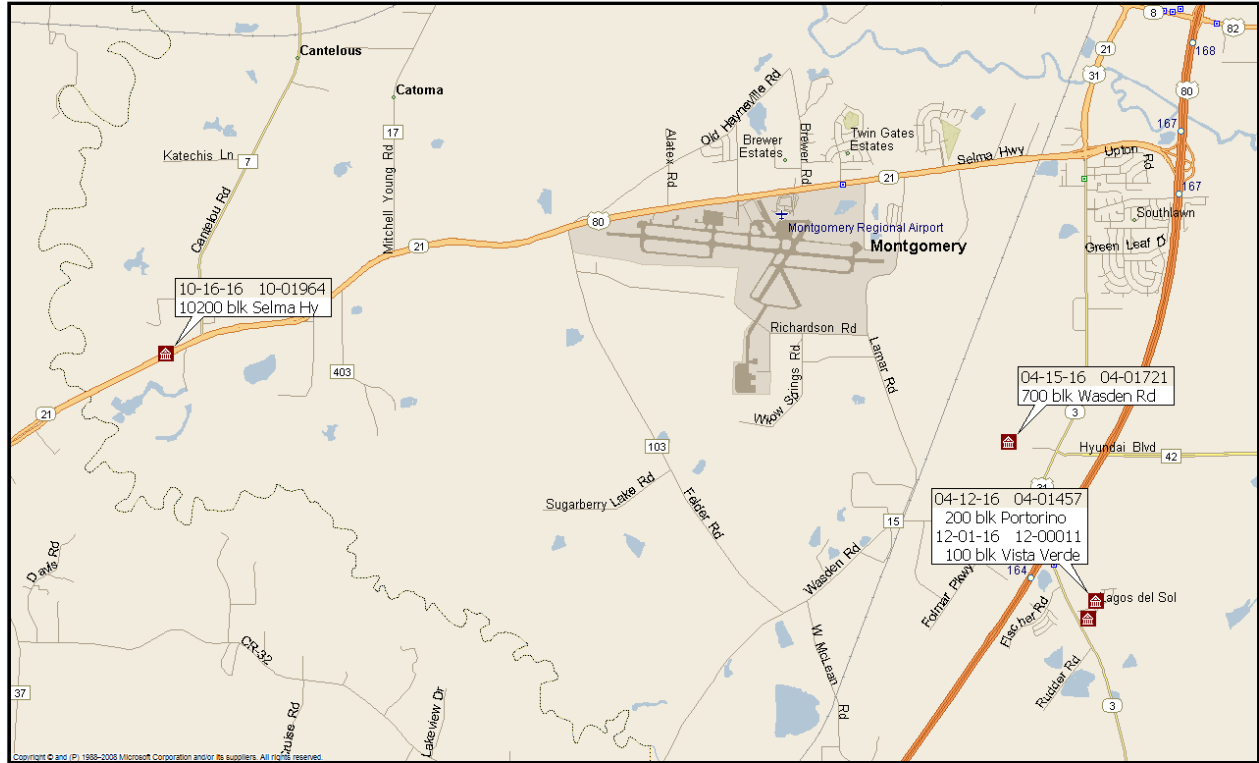

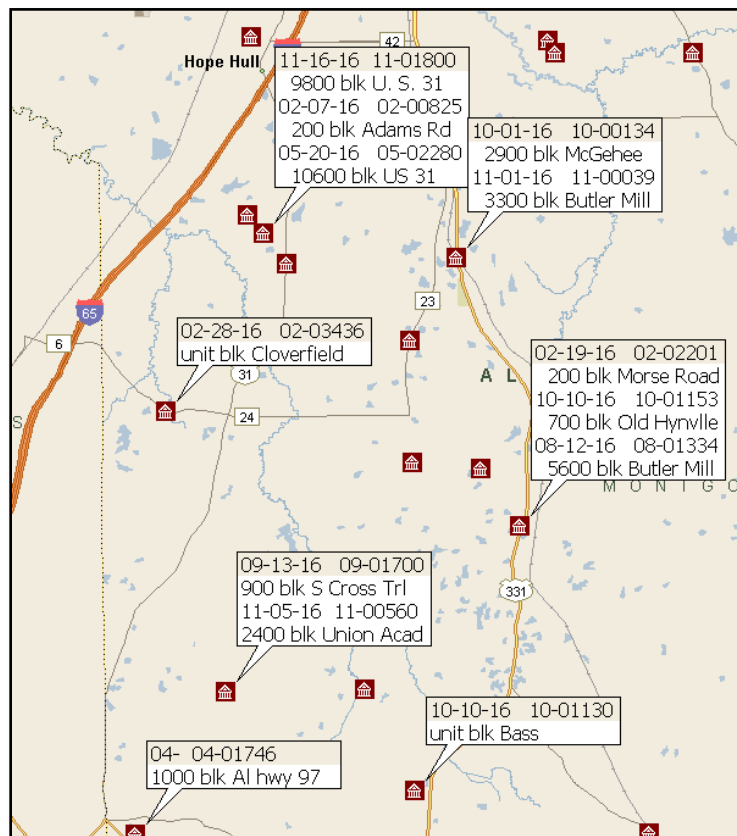

Warrants were signed and the case cleared by arrest.

Map showing 2016 Residential Burglaries in District 4



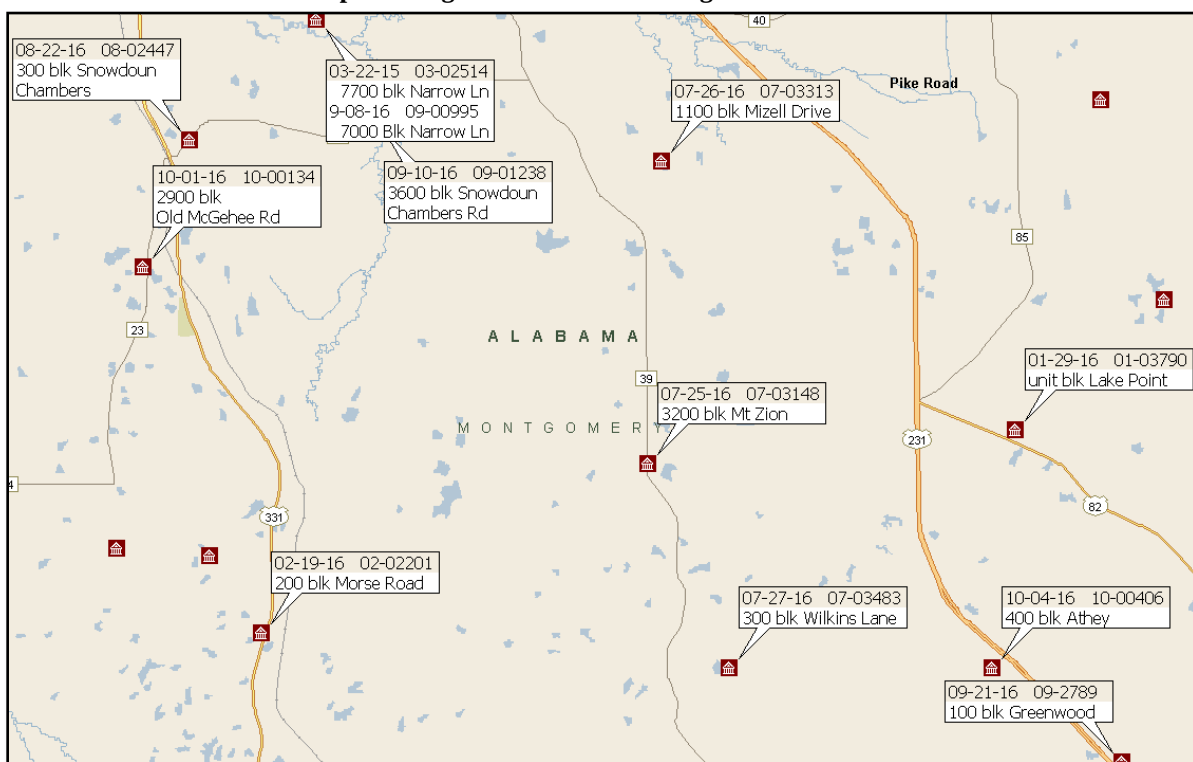

Arrested: Joshua Dwight Thrasher age 27, of Montgomery

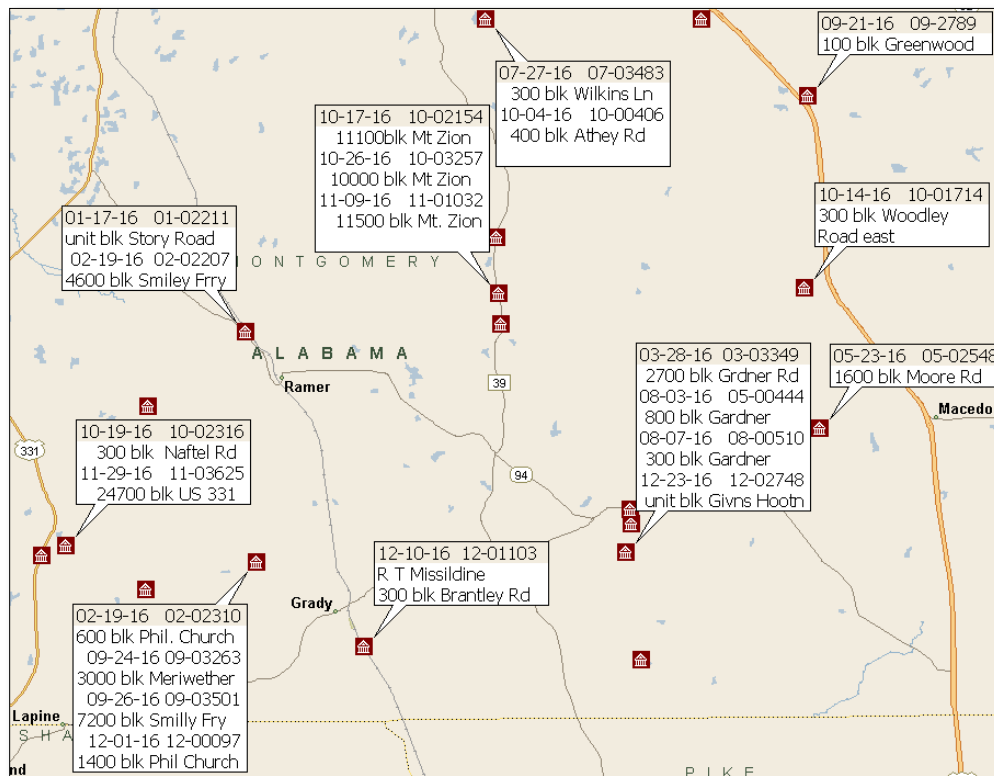

2016 Supervisor of the Year



Captain Beasley, Criminal Investigations Division Commander, in recommending Lt. R. Pollard for this honor writes: “Lt. Randy Pollard...In addition (to) being the Assistant Division Commander of Criminal Investigations, he also serves as the Tactical/SWAT Commander for our agency, while still making time to instruct and educate Deputies and Citizens alike...Lt. Pollard has consistently been one of the ‘Go to Guys’ for many years and has always had a very positive attitude when it comes to teaching others...Lt. Pollard has held several Run, Hide, Fight courses for the Montgomery County Commission, Medicaid, Job Corps, Carmike Cinemas, 20/20 Ophthalmic Center, Montgomery AIDS Outreach and South Montgomery County Volunteer Fire Dept....

...a citizen who had recently taken his Run, Hide, Fight Class...excerpt of this (citizen’s letter)...truly express the general public’s appreciation of his service. ‘This training was mandatory for all of our staff, which was over 300 people. He conducted three classes, two of which had 100 participants...He (Lt. Pollard) did an excellent job, the training was everything I wanted and then some. It was a difficult subject matter, but he gave hope and motivation. I received nothing but praises about his class...We are all determined that whatever happens, we will fight to survive!! 2016 Deputy of the Year



In nominating Cpl. B. Harrison for this award Patrol Division Commander Captain G. Beaudry writes: “...on 2-14-16 a Robbery occurred...upon responding to the scene...Cpl. Harrison observed a key piece of evidence on the counter...Cpl. Harrison immediately cleared the crime scene or patrons and other Law Enforcement officers who could have potentially contaminated the evidence...crime scene technicians were able to obtain fingerprint evidence ...that led to the arrest of one subject for Robbery.

On 2-14-16 a robbery occurred...Cpl Harrison was able to obtain a partial tag number for a suspect vehicle. With the partial tag number and description he was able to use computer resources along with a call to an outside agency in Ashford, Al in order to develop a suspect. This information led the investigators to filing charges on a subject for robbery.

The above summaries are just two examples of the outstanding attention to detail and thorough primary responder investigations that Cpl. Harrison conducts regularly...Harrison is also one of our senior Field Training Officers...he goes above and beyond and spends extra time covering topics with the trainees in order to ensure that they are prepared to work alone while on patrol. The trainees that complete the program under the watch and guidance of Cpl. Harrison tend to be some of the most prepared deputies when they are assigned to their permanent shifts. Cpl. Harrison has volunteered to sit on the Sheriff's Office Steering Committee and works hard to come up with ideas and plans to help advance the progress of the Sheriff's Office. Cpl. Harrison is a true leader amongst his peers and is an asset to the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office..."

2016 Fourth Quarter Deputy of the Quarter



In his commendation of Cpl. J. Davis Investigation Division Commander Capt. T. Beasley wrote "...Cpl. Davis has worked many difficult cases throughout his career in law enforcement and his level of experience is quite extensive. His contributions to the Criminal Investigations Division are to be duly noted as he consistently works each case with the same vigor as the last. Cpl. Davis's knowledge of fact was proven to be most valuable in a recent Death Investigation, where an arrest was made in less than 24 hours.

On October 27, 2016 at approximately 10:00 AM, M.C.S.O. Dispatch received a call...Cpl. J. Davis arrived shortly thereafter and began ascertaining all the known facts...aided by Crime Scene...and Patrol...provided vital information as to the identity of the deceased. Once the identity was confirmed... (Cpl. Davis) followed up on any possible lead that unfolded...numerous pieces of crucial evidence were recovered and key witnesses discovered.

The following morning Cpl. Davis hit the ground running and began interviewing potential witnesses and issuing vehicle BOLO's...These many hours of hard work paid off and an arrest was made within a 24 hour period...it was his thorough investigation that ultimately led to such a quick arrest and confession. It should also be noted that Cpl. Davis has cleared several tragic death related cases this year and is to be commended for these acts as well. In closing I would like to sincerely express my appreciation to Cpl. Davis for his dedication put into recent cases over the past year. These efforts shall not go unnoticed, and should be recognized by all..."

2016 Civilian Employee of the Year



Chief Deputy Murphy in recommending Ms. Crenshaw for this award writes: “Ms. Lisa Crenshaw has been employed by the Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office for approximately two years. During this period of time, she has exemplified herself as an outstanding employee. Ms. Crenshaw has been assigned greater responsibilities during her tenure. The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office is now accepting applications for our *Citizens Academy*. MCSO Firearms Familiarization Course



We have already begun our firearms course to “familiarize” Montgomery County citizens about the laws and proper use of a firearm. We know that learning how to protect yourself is very important in today’s world. Our course is held one Saturday a month and has been scheduled for the following dates:

The class is held at our Firing Range and lasts all day and is **FREE** to Montgomery County citizens with a current pistol permit! The morning session is classroom instruction on firearm safety and firearm laws. The afternoon session allows citizens to practice shooting on our Firing Range for the remainder of the class. All classes are under the instruction of the Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office Range Master.

Sheriff's Office APP

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has a new phone app called "Montgomery County AL Sheriff" that can be accessed through your phone's app store. Once you have added this app to your phone, you can easily set your phone up to receive important push notifications. Push notifications are quick, important messages that can notify you of road closure(s), blocked road(s), anything pertinent to your travel, escapee, etc. While our app can help you with many things including checking to see if someone is in the county jail, it is most helpful to receive push notifications. After you have downloaded the app, go through the follow steps to make sure your phone is set up to receive the push notifications:



- Go to your phone's setting icon
 - Scroll down and click "Applications"
 - Scroll down to "MCSO" or "Montgomery County Sheriff"
- OR
- Click "Application Manager", if it doesn't take you directly to the location
 - Click "Notifications"
 - Turn 'on' "Allow Notifications" and "Previews in pop-ups"
