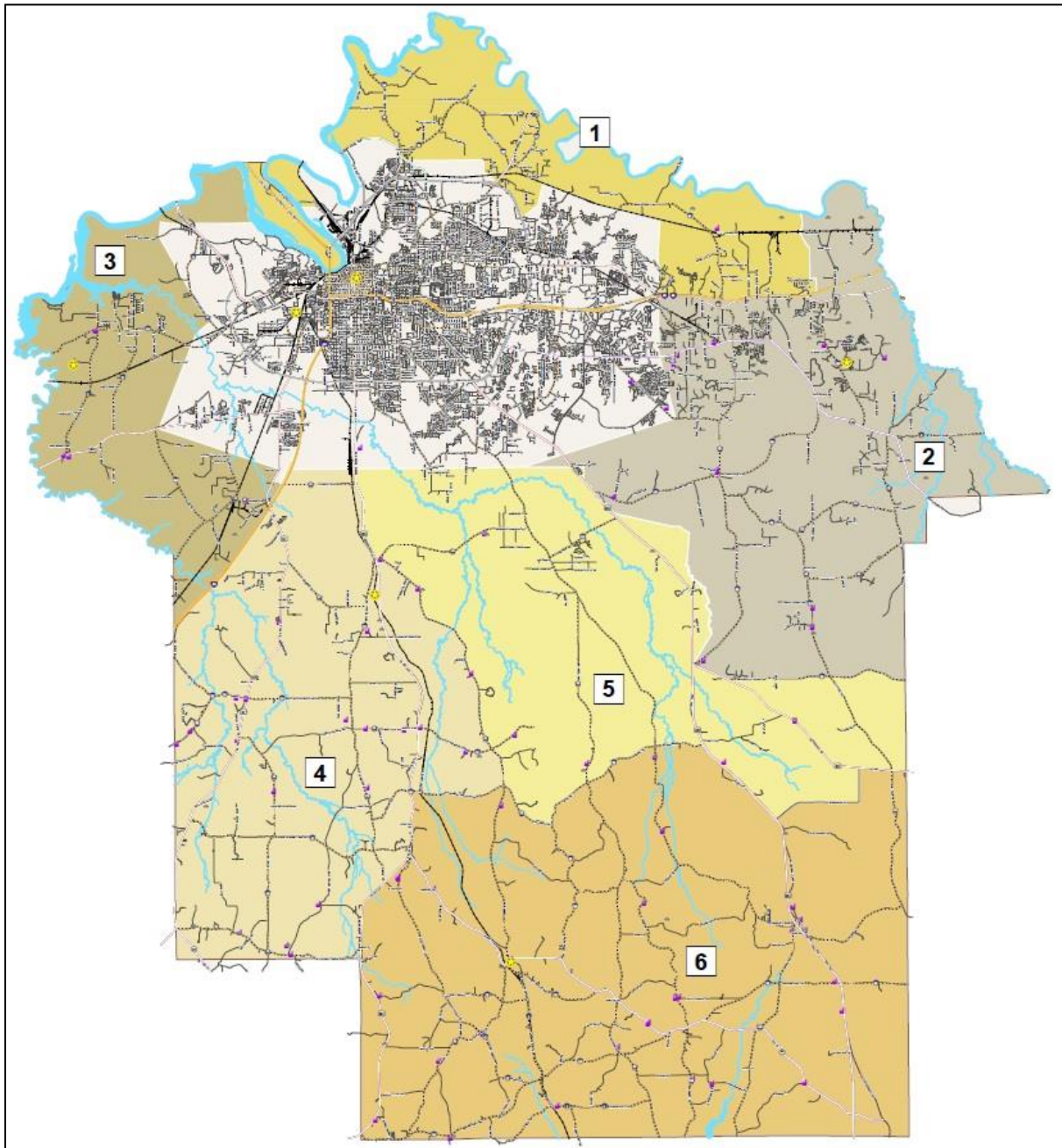

Map showing the patrol districts of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office

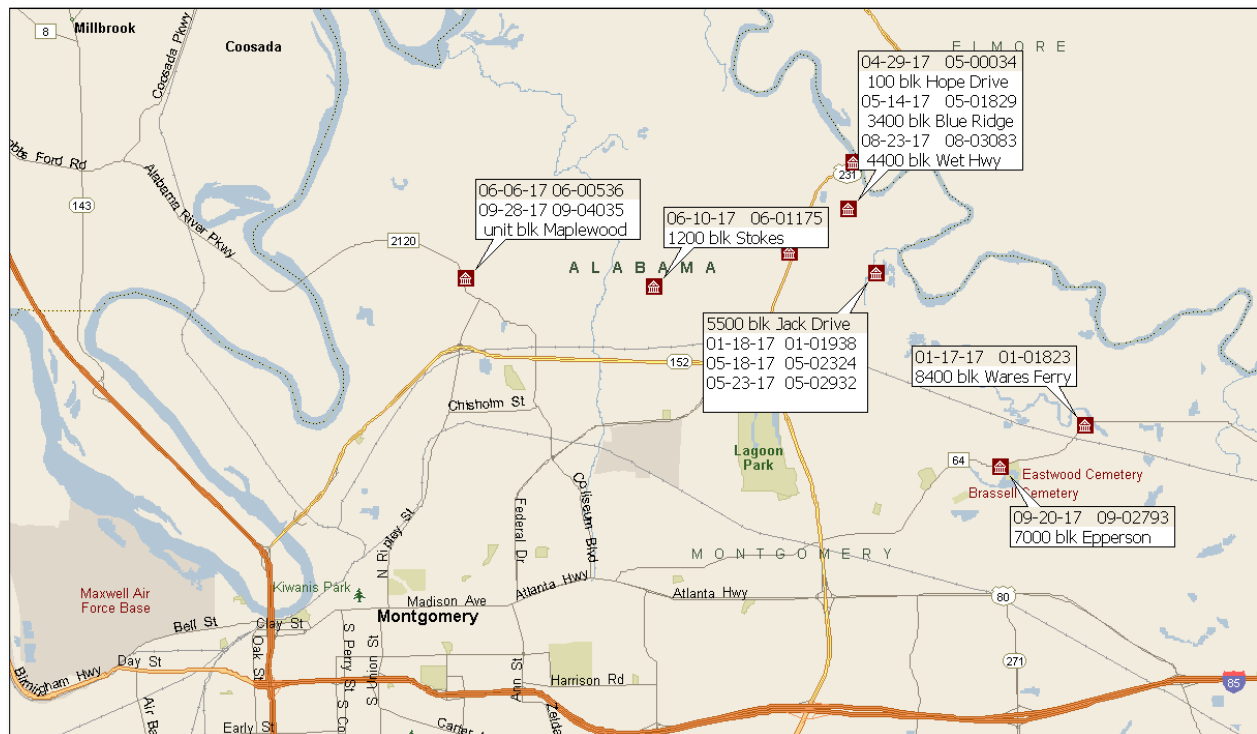

Deputy Moore was working the midnight shift when checking a District 1 business which had been a victim of frequent burglaries. Moore opted to check the area on foot and surprised a burglar who had broken into a shed behind the business.

Cpl. Jeff Davis is to be commended for excellent follow-up investigation of a burglary of a District 1 business and the theft therefrom of several vehicles. The victim provided a lead as to the whereabouts of one of his stolen vehicles and Cpl Davis notified area law enforcement. The vehicle was subsequently located and recovered by Montgomery Police.

Another of the vehicles stolen in the District 1 burglary was recovered by Montgomery Police when a victim called them to report she had been kidnapped by two men. She had managed to gain control of her kidnappers' vehicle and was shot at by her captors as she fled. Montgomery Police found her escape vehicle was one of those reported stolen in the Montgomery County District 1 burglary.

At about the same time as the kidnapping, Montgomery Police were notified by a local hospital of a gunshot victim being treated. Montgomery Police investigating the gunshot case determined he was one of the kidnappers and had been wounded as the kidnap victim made her escape.

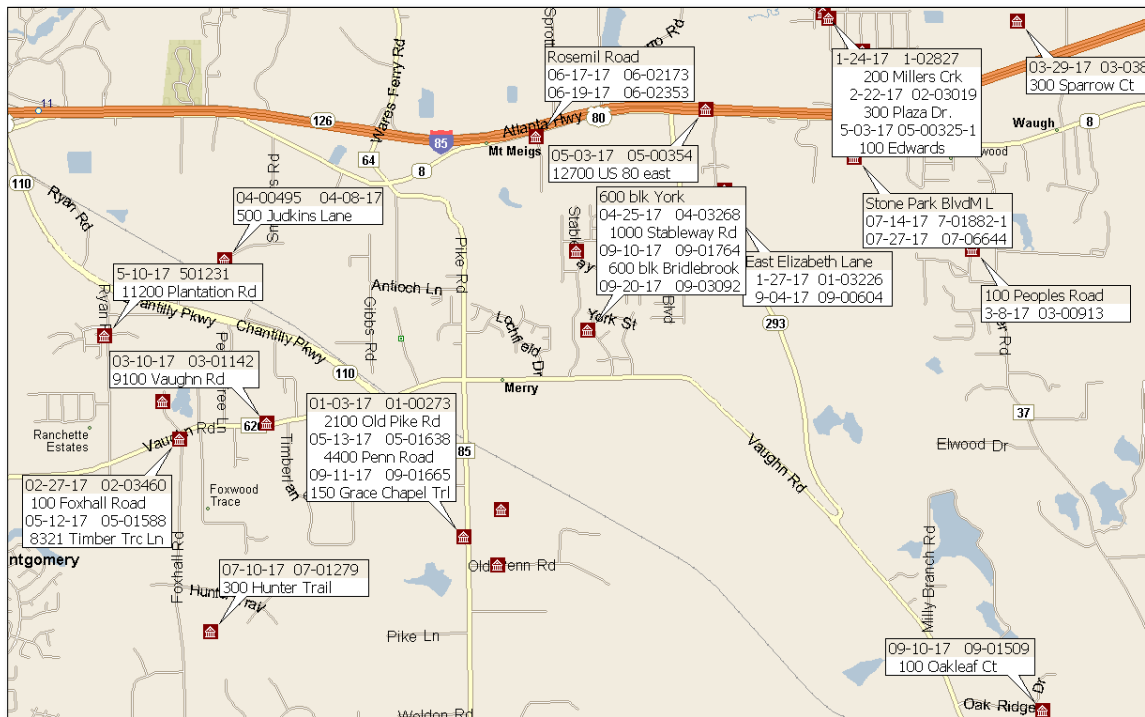

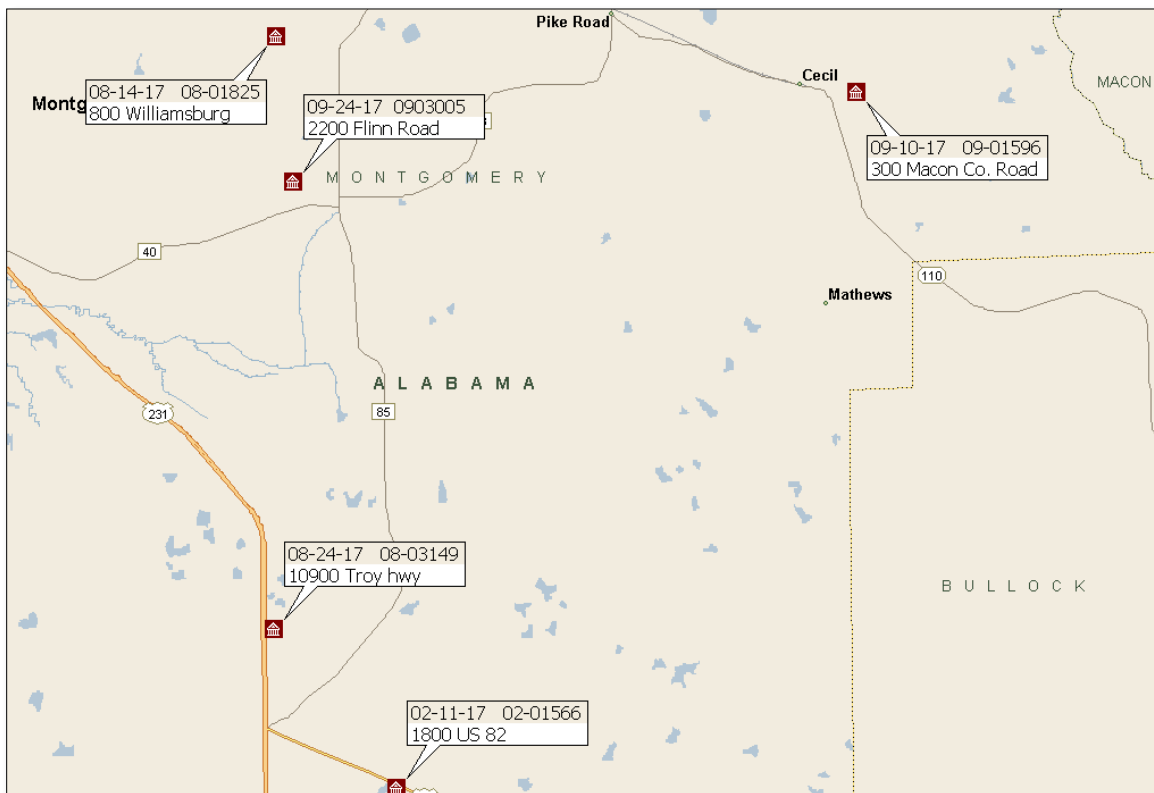

In early August M.C.S.O. Cpl. A. Pouncey responded to a District 2 neighborhood to investigate a suspicious vehicle reported by a resident of the neighborhood. Pouncey located the vehicle and upon further investigation the below adult and four juveniles were charged in a series of Unlawful B & E of vehicles which occurred earlier.

Arrested: Jaderian Wendell Thornton, age 18 of Montgomery & 4 juveniles.

Charges: Breaking & Entering a Vehicle (5 cts.), Theft II (1 ct.)
Theft IV (4 cts.)

All of the victim vehicles had been left unlocked. The M.C.S.O. cannot stress enough the importance of locking your vehicles, especially overnight.

A vehicle stolen from a District 2 resident in mid-July was later seen at the scene of several breaking and entering of vehicles in the city of Montgomery. One of the victims in the city cases responded to his car alarm and confronted the suspects, who shot at the victim as they fled.

M.C.S.O. Deputies spotted the stolen vehicle in District 1; chased it a short distance when the driver refused to stop; and cornered the vehicle causing the suspects to abandon the vehicle and flee on foot. Evidence in the vehicle provided leads which led Montgomery County Investigators working with Montgomery Police Investigators to arrest the below suspects within a week of the incident.

Arrested: Danfernee Jonee Bennett, age 19 of Montgomery
Leon Pierce, age 27 of Montgomery.

Charges: Auto Burglary (13 cts.), B&E Vehicle (2 cts.) Theft I (2 cts.),
Robbery I, Theft II, Theft III

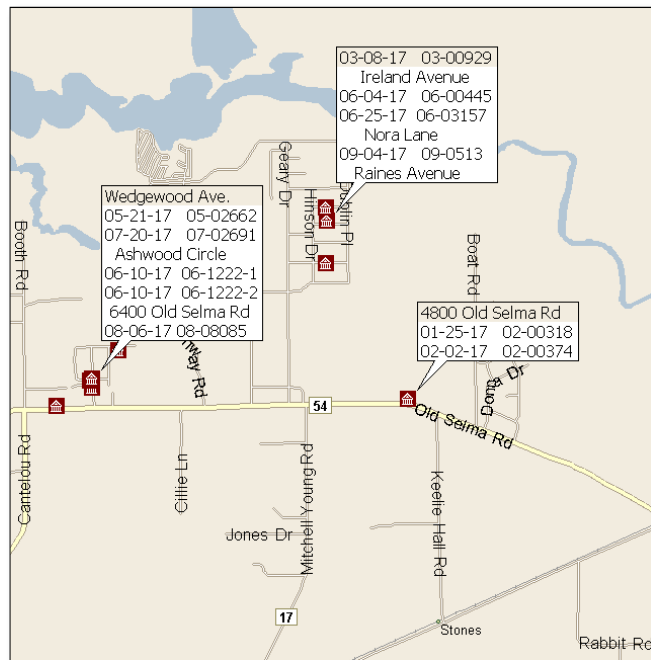

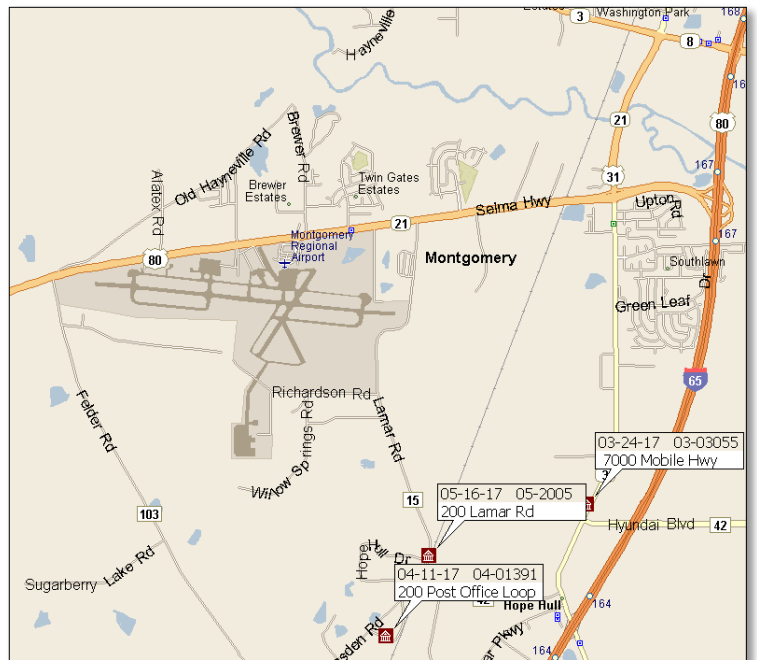

A neighbor of a District 3 resident saw a suspicious vehicle at the victim's home taking items from a shed of the victim. 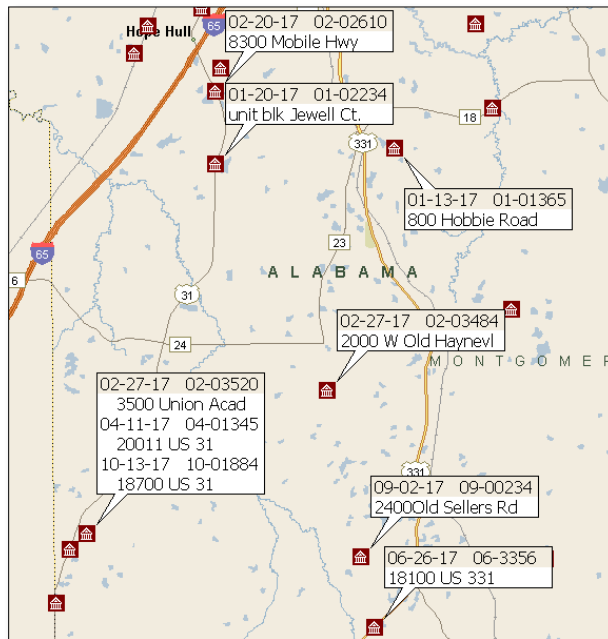

Map showing 2017 Residential Burglaries in District 4



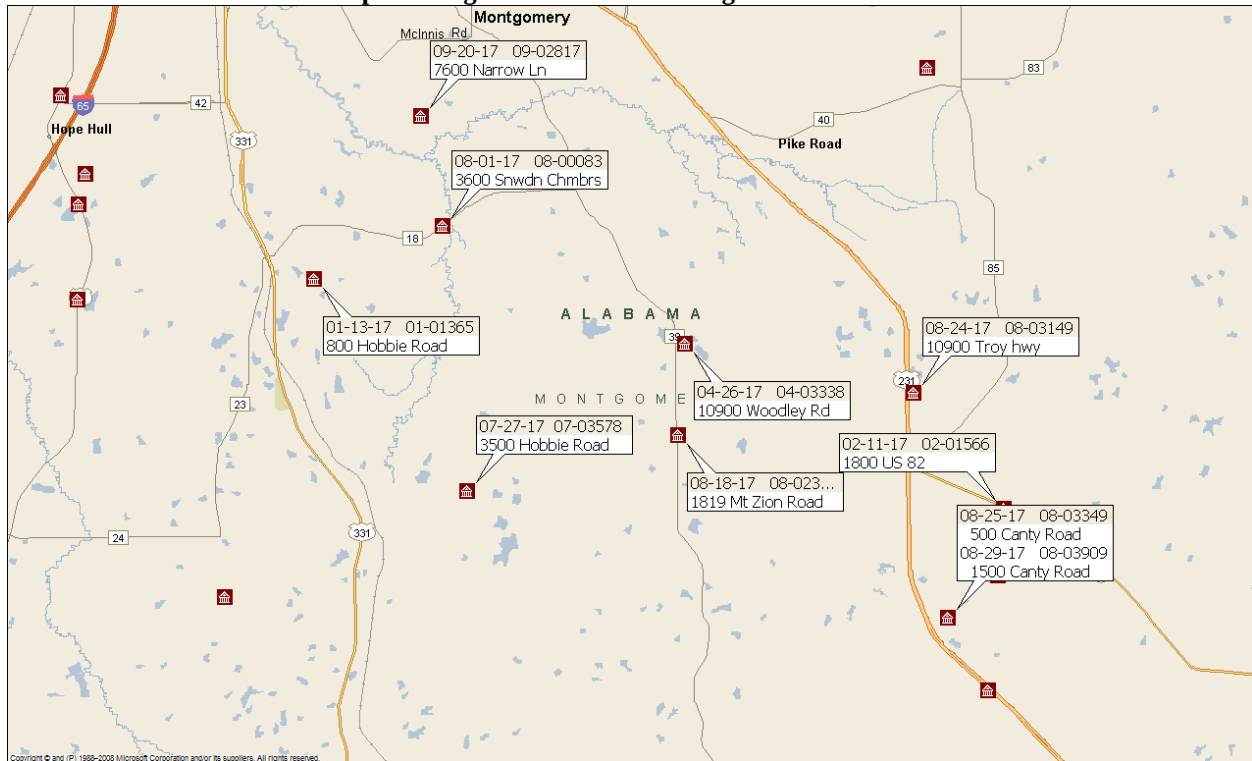

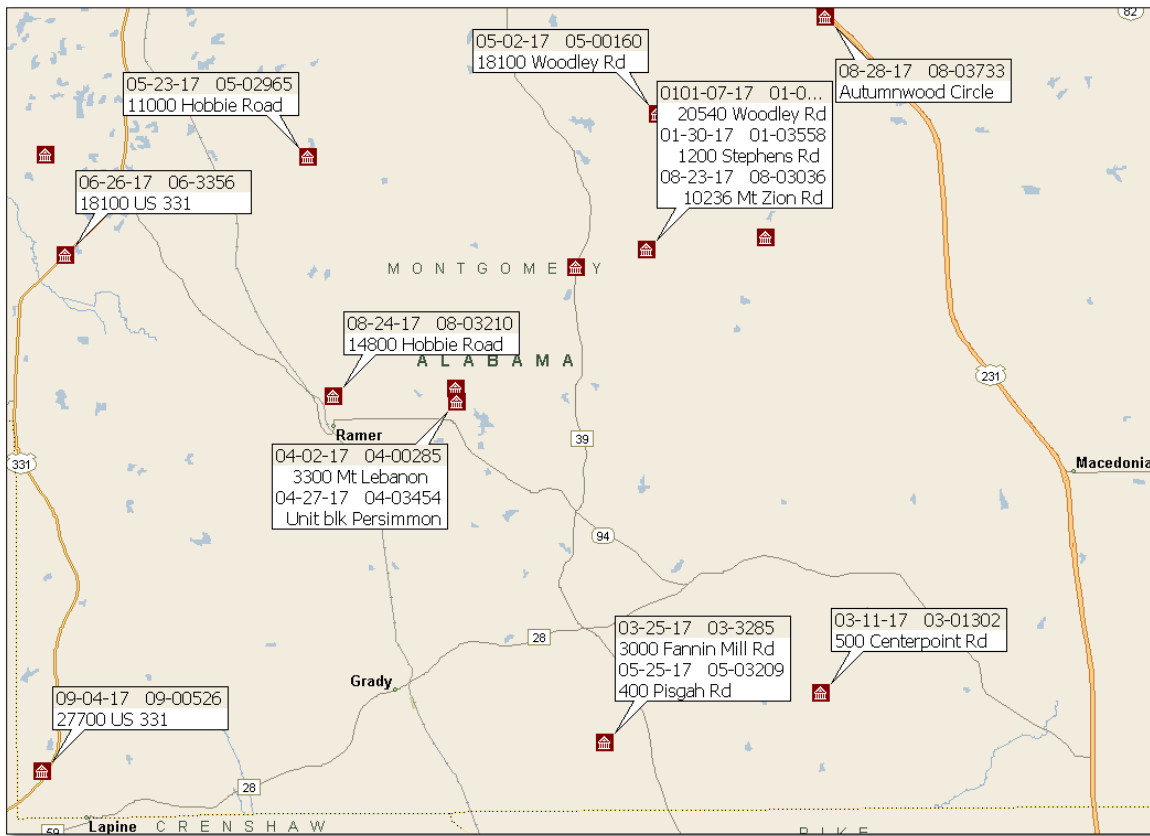

We would like to thank Assistant Chief David “Dave” Bryan for his many years of service and congratulate him on his retirement this past October after 44 years of service with the Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office. The photo to the left is “Deputy Sheriff Bryan” when he began his career with the Sheriff’s Office on October 5, 1973. In 1978 he was assigned to the Investigative Division where he spent the majority of his career as an Investigator. He advanced to the rank of Lieutenant during his tenure with the Investigative Division. On August 26, 1996 he was promoted to the rank of Captain and assigned to the Legal Services Division. August 1, 1998 he was assigned to the Patrol Division where he served for three years and seven months. March 11, 2002, he was promoted to the rank of Assistant Chief Deputy Sheriff.

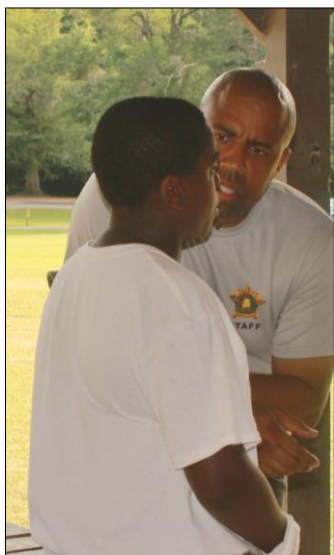
Assistant Chief Bryan served as a liaison between the Division Commanders and the Administration of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. He assisted the Sheriff, Chief Deputy and Captains with personnel, budgets, equipment and training for the department. In the late 1980's as a Lieutenant, Assistant Chief Bryan helped develop a recruiting / hiring procedure for the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office, as mandated by the Federal Court, which he supervised until his retirement.

Montgomery County Sheriff's Office TO INCREASE ACCESS TO SAFE MEDICATION DISPOSAL WITH DRUG COLLECTION UNIT DONATED BY CVS HEALTH

Joint effort by CVS Health and Partnership for Drug-Free Kids aims to combat drug abuse, encourage safe drug disposal in local communities

On Friday, March 17, 2017, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office unveiled their new drug collection unit they received as part of CVS Health's Medication Disposal for Safer Communities Grant Program. The new unit will be located at Administrative Office of the Sheriff, at 100 South Lawrence (2nd floor lobby) and will provide residents with a safe and environmentally responsible way to dispose of unwanted, unused or expired medication, including controlled substances.

"CVS Health is dedicated to helping the communities we serve address and prevent prescription drug abuse," said Tom Davis, R.Ph. Vice President of Pharmacy Professional Services at CVS Health. "Reducing the amount of unused and unwanted medication in the home is critical to preventing prescription drug abuse. We are proud to work with the Partnership for Drug-Free Kids and local leaders to increase convenient access to safe medication disposal."

The new drug disposal unit will help to reduce the amount of unneeded medicine in residents' homes and decrease the potential for prescription drug abuse, which has soared in recent years, especially among teenagers. More than 70 percent of teenagers say it is easy to get prescription drugs from their parents' medicine cabinets, according to a Partnership for Drug-Free Kids study. Proper drug disposal also helps to prevent the contamination of local landfills and water supplies from unused medication.

Over the last few years, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has participated with the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and their Drug Take Program. We have collected hundreds of pounds of unused or expired medication. "Sheriff Derrick Cunningham and the staff of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office are proud to partner with CVS and would like to thank them for providing this grant opportunity. This Drug Collection Unit will help us offer the citizens of Montgomery a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating them about the potential for abuse and misuse of medication". The Medication Disposal for Safer Communities program has donated more than 600 drug collection units to law enforcement agencies across the country, which have collected more than 47 metric tons or 100,000 pounds, of unwanted medication. CVS Health also assists law enforcement by supporting local drug take back events and promoting local drug disposal collection sites.

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office is now accepting applications for our *Citizens Academy*. The Citizens Academy was established in 1997 to educate the citizens of Montgomery County on how the Sheriff's Office operates and to promote public safety among our community members. Classes are designed to be interesting as well as informative. Citizens are given an opportunity to ride with a deputy on patrol, tour the County Jail, volunteer at events that are sponsored by the Sheriff's Office as well as train on the Firearms Training Simulator. The course is a free 6-week course that meets on Monday evenings from 6:00-7:00 p.m. at our office, located at 115 South Perry Street and is taught by Sheriff's Office deputies and Correctional Officers. All materials will be discussed during the meetings and neither homework nor physical activity is required.

Sheriff's Office APP

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has a new phone app called "Montgomery County AL Sheriff" that can be accessed through your phone's app store. Once you have added this app to your phone, you can easily set your phone up to receive important push notifications. Push notifications are quick, important messages that can notify you of road closure(s), blocked road(s), anything pertinent to your travel, escapee, etc. While our app can help you with many things including checking to see if someone is in the county jail, it is most helpful to receive push notifications. After you have downloaded the app, go through the follow steps to make sure your phone is set up to receive the push notifications:



- Go to your phone's setting icon
 - Scroll down and click "Applications"
 - Scroll down to "MCSO" or "Montgomery County Sheriff"
- OR
- Click "Application Manager", if it doesn't take you directly to the location
 - Click "Notifications"
 - Turn 'on' "Allow Notifications" and "Previews in pop-ups"
