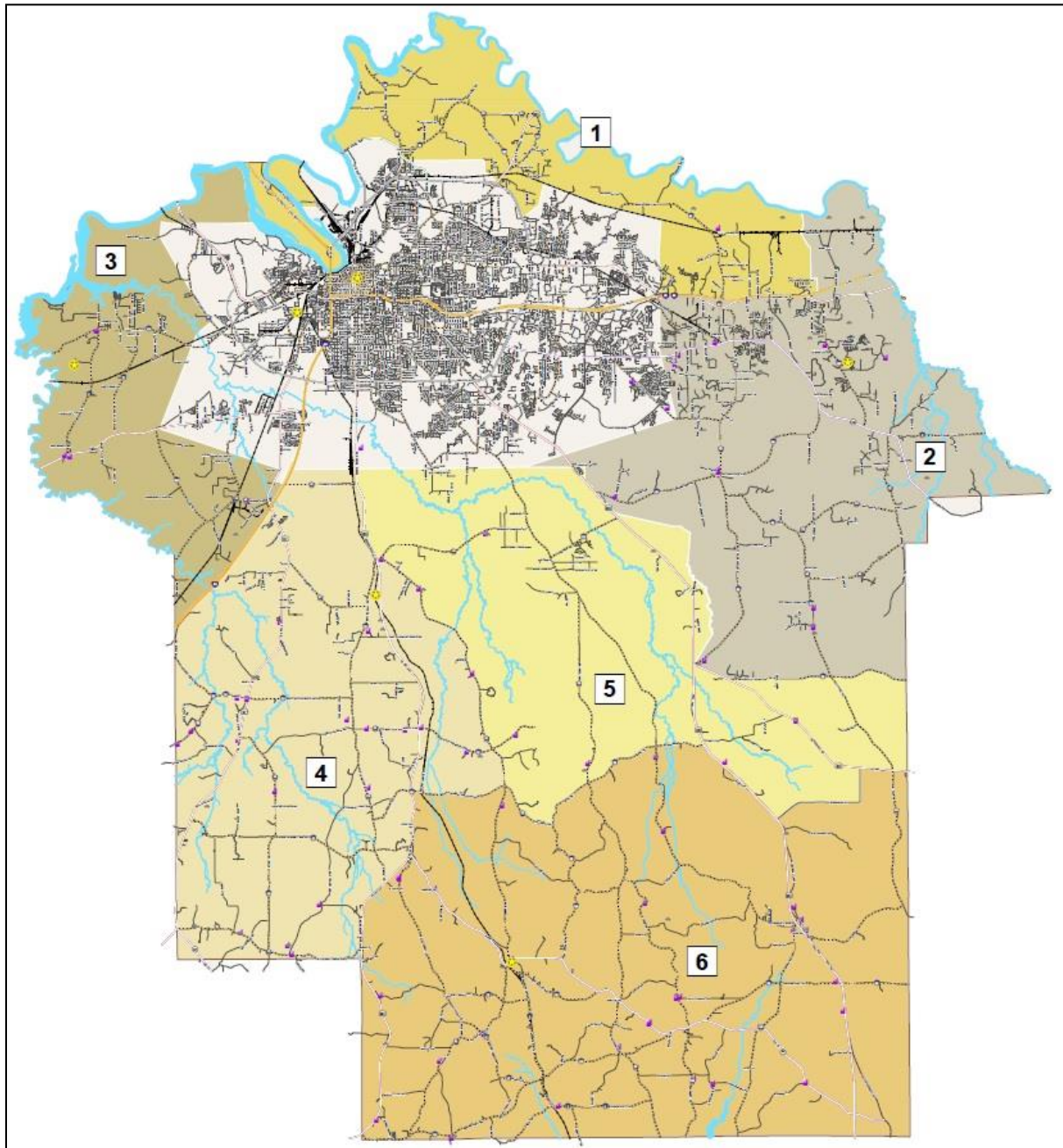

M.C.S.O. Corporal Stephen Z. Smith

2017 National Sheriff's Association Chaplain of the Year



In nominating Corporal Stephen Z. Smith Sheriff Cunningham said “Corporal Smith is actively involved with the chaplaincy program since he graduated the police academy in 1983. In 1992, he created the Cops for Christ program, a law enforcement lunch meeting and prayer service. Also, he invited a guest speaker to come to their meetings and speak about crisis situations involving law enforcement. Cops for Christ later expanded to Cops and Firefighters for Christ, to reach out to every public safety sector since stress and the witnessing of trauma-related incidents was on the rise in our area. This program allowed many public safety officials to have a way to release to talk about their concerns with ministers that could assist them. This led to churches sponsoring meetings and luncheons, recognizing law enforcement officers and firefighters of the year. Within two years, Alabama State

Troopers and state investigators joined, working with leaders to expand the program to other counties. Corporal Smith also worked as a chaplain with the Montgomery Police Department.

Corporal Smith retired from the Montgomery Police Department and joined the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office in 2001, bringing the chaplain program to the sheriff's office. Corporal Smith received his certification as a police chaplain in 2001, and was one of the founding members of the River Region Chaplain Service Program, serving as its president since 2016. The River Region Chaplain Service Program currently has twelve acting chaplains that serve the Montgomery Police Department, Montgomery Communications, Montgomery Fire Department, Wetumpka Police Department, several volunteer fire departments in Elmore County as well as nine volunteer fire departments in Montgomery County. Furthermore, the River Region Chaplain Service Program provides services to the E911 Center at the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office and the Montgomery County Detention Facility, the Mac Sim Butler Detention Facility.

The River Region Chaplain Service Program provides a chaplain for the needs of all public safety entities in the River Region area, filling a void in families' lives, sometimes when they have no affiliation with a religious organization. Their services include handling funerals for family members, as well as law enforcement officers, and provide family support groups that meet when public safety officials are deployed on military assignments overseas. They provide Christmas for family members that have lost a provider, giving comfort to families who have lost a loved one. The chaplaincy service assists when a public safety official is injured in the line of duty, as well as those that have become disabled. The River Region Chaplain Service Program has local ministers from all demographics that are willing to be the “ear” for senior leaders, and make sure if families need to seek help through the Employee Assistance Program (EAP), giving the appropriate information to assist members. Corporal Smith has built a bridge within our religious community and River Region Chaplain Service Program. Corporal Smith has ministers that are willing to join the service. He actively participates in fundraising efforts, so that each chaplain is attending conferences for police chaplains, as well as receiving their certification as a basic police chaplain, which is taught by the International Conference of Police Chaplains (ICPC), of which Corporal Smith is a member. He is a certified instructor for law enforcement chaplains and death notification courses for the Alabama Peace Officers Standard and Training (A.P.O.S.T.). He teaches courses to current law enforcement officers and at police academies. Corporal Smith is an asset to the community, both civilian and sworn. He helps

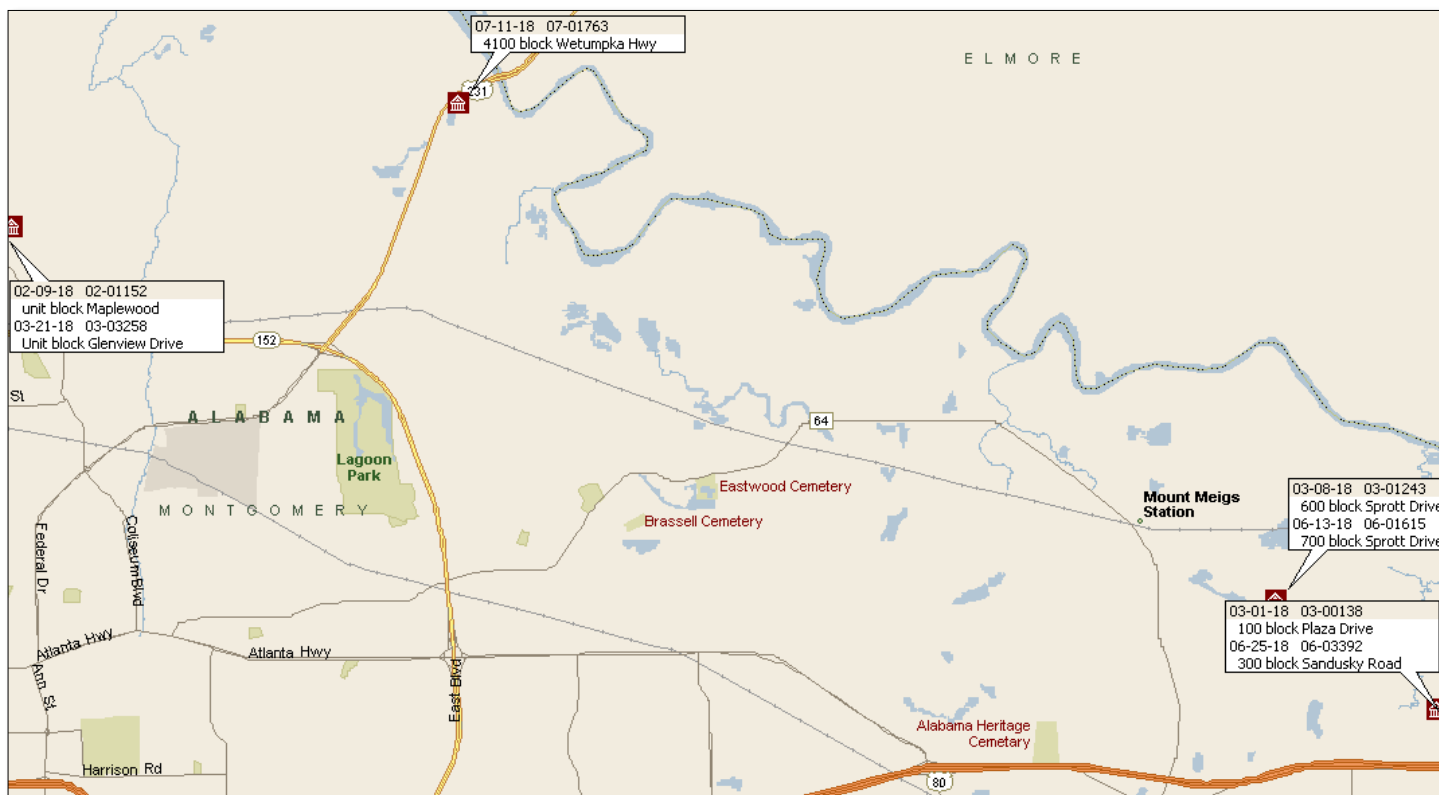
families overcome tragedy, when people are in mourning over a loss. He goes above and beyond the call of duty; for this reason, I believe he should receive the honor of **Chaplain of the Year.**”

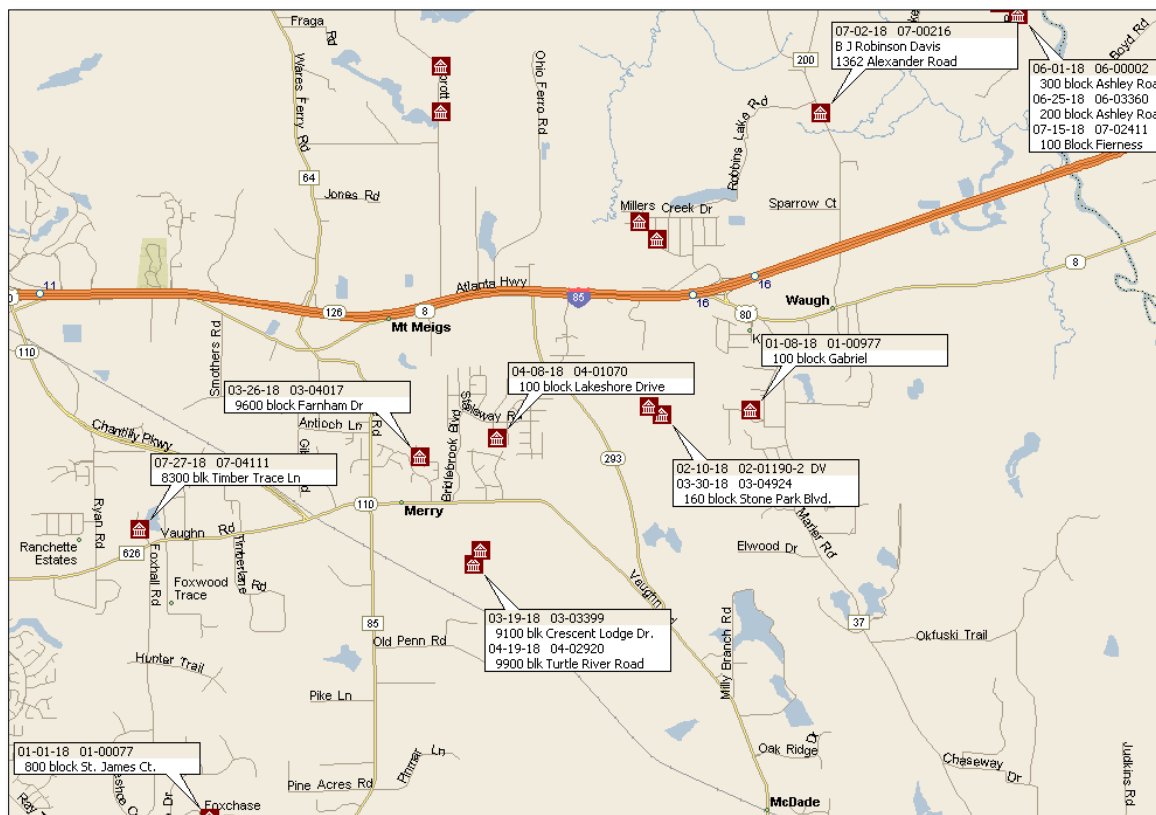

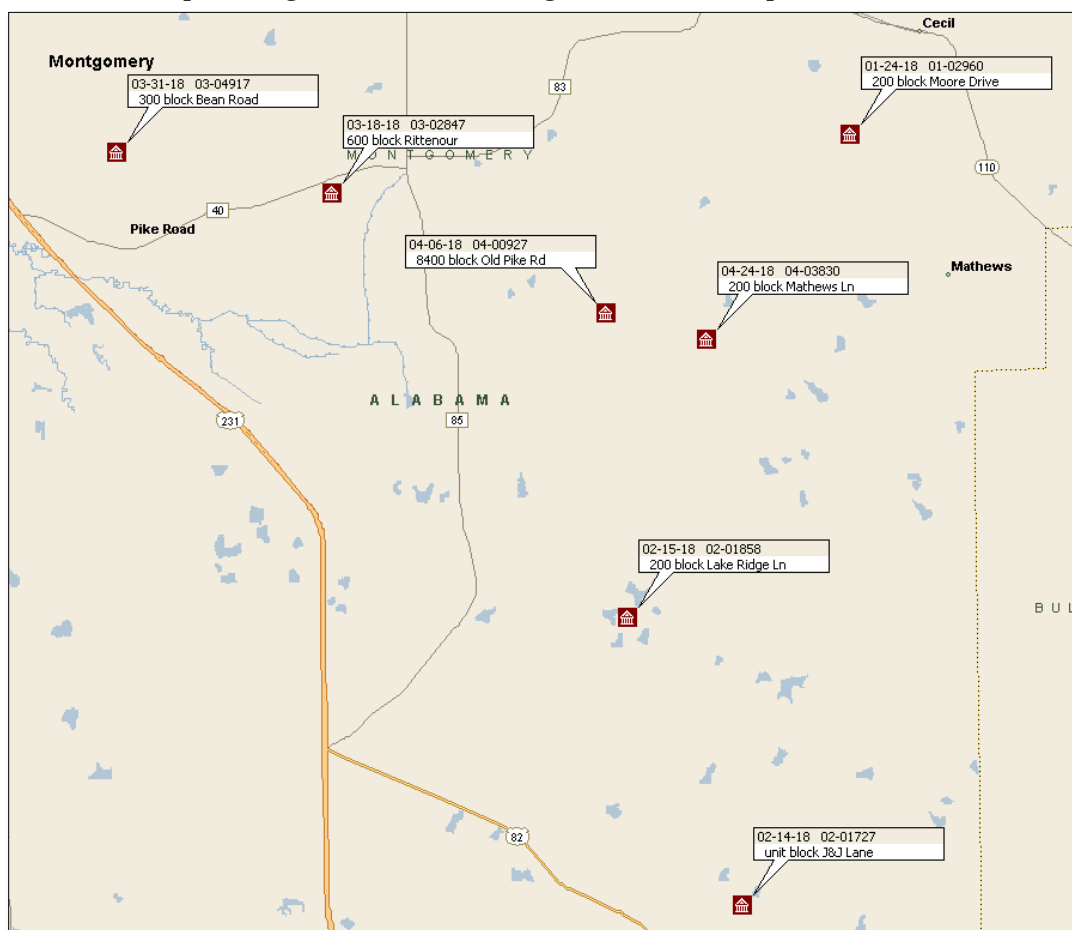

An early morning robbery of an individual in District 2 by acquaintances of the victim quickly resulted in an arrest. M.C.S.O. dispatchers were provided a vehicle description and the direction in which the suspects fled. M.C.S.O. Deputy Glover spotted the suspect vehicle driving southbound on I-85 and called for the assistance of other deputies. A short chase ensued in which the fleeing vehicle was “spiked” causing its tires to deflate. Three suspects fled on foot and were pursued by Deputies who detained J. L. Harrison and a juvenile, after a short chase. A third individual, who eluded Deputies during the chase, was identified as Edward Goldsmith of Montgomery. Warrants have been issued for his arrest.

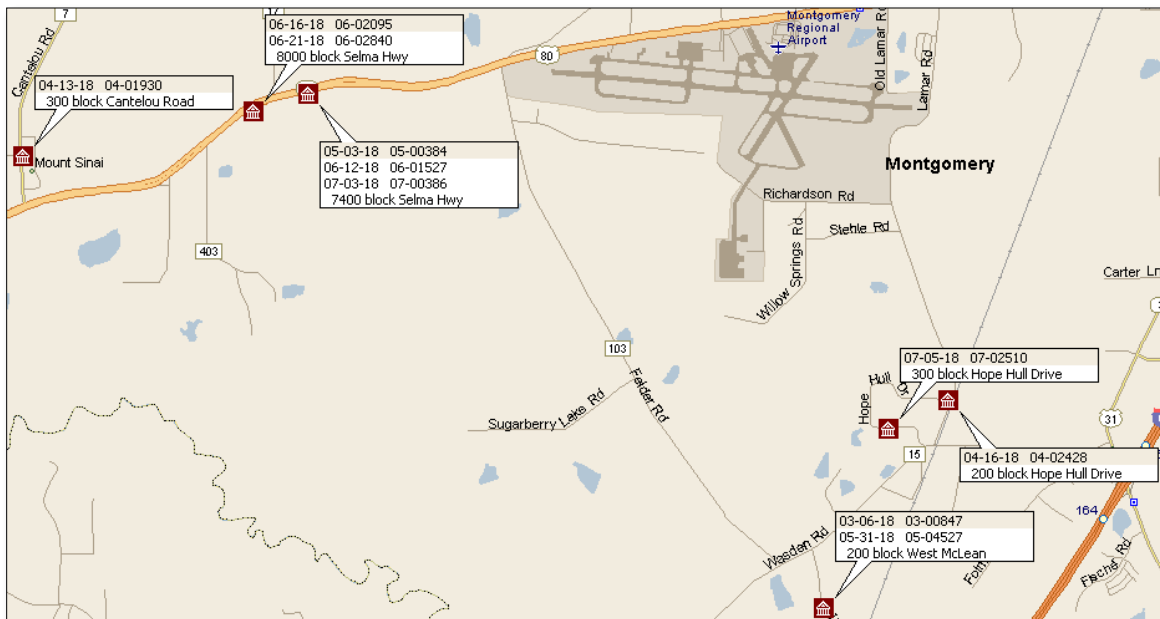

A neighbor of a District 3 resident observed a suspicious vehicle at a residence. Due to recent burglaries in the area, he checked with the property owner, who reported no one should be at the residence. The neighbor returned to the residence and observed suspects loading items into their vehicle. He contacted the M.C.S.O. Dispatchers, providing a description of the suspects and their vehicle. The suspects left the residence before deputies arrived. While staying on the phone with dispatchers, the witness followed the vehicle at a safe distance, providing information as to their location and direction of travel. M.C.S.O. Deputy Ivey intercepted and detained the vehicle and its occupants.

The home owner confirmed his residence had been burglarized and the items in possession of the suspects were stolen. Three adults and two juveniles have been charged in the case.

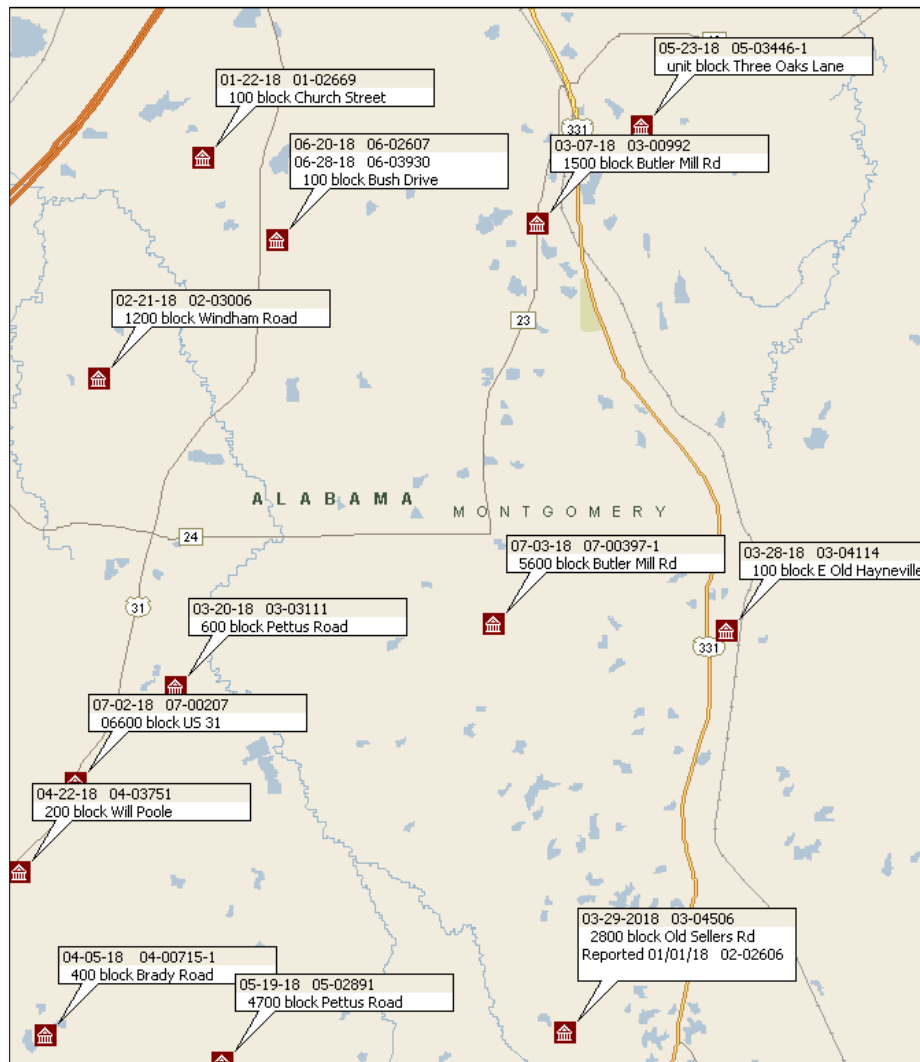

Map showing 2018 Residential Burglaries in District 4



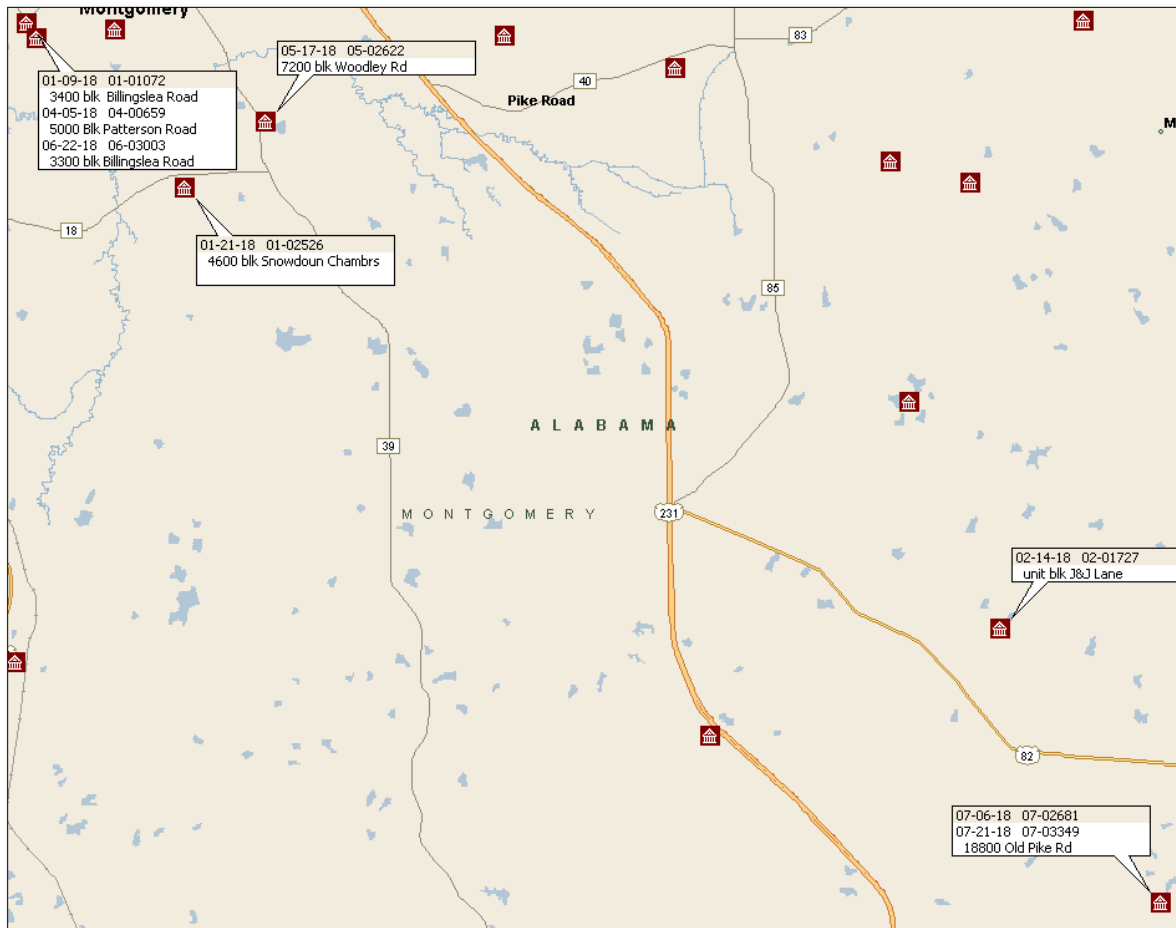

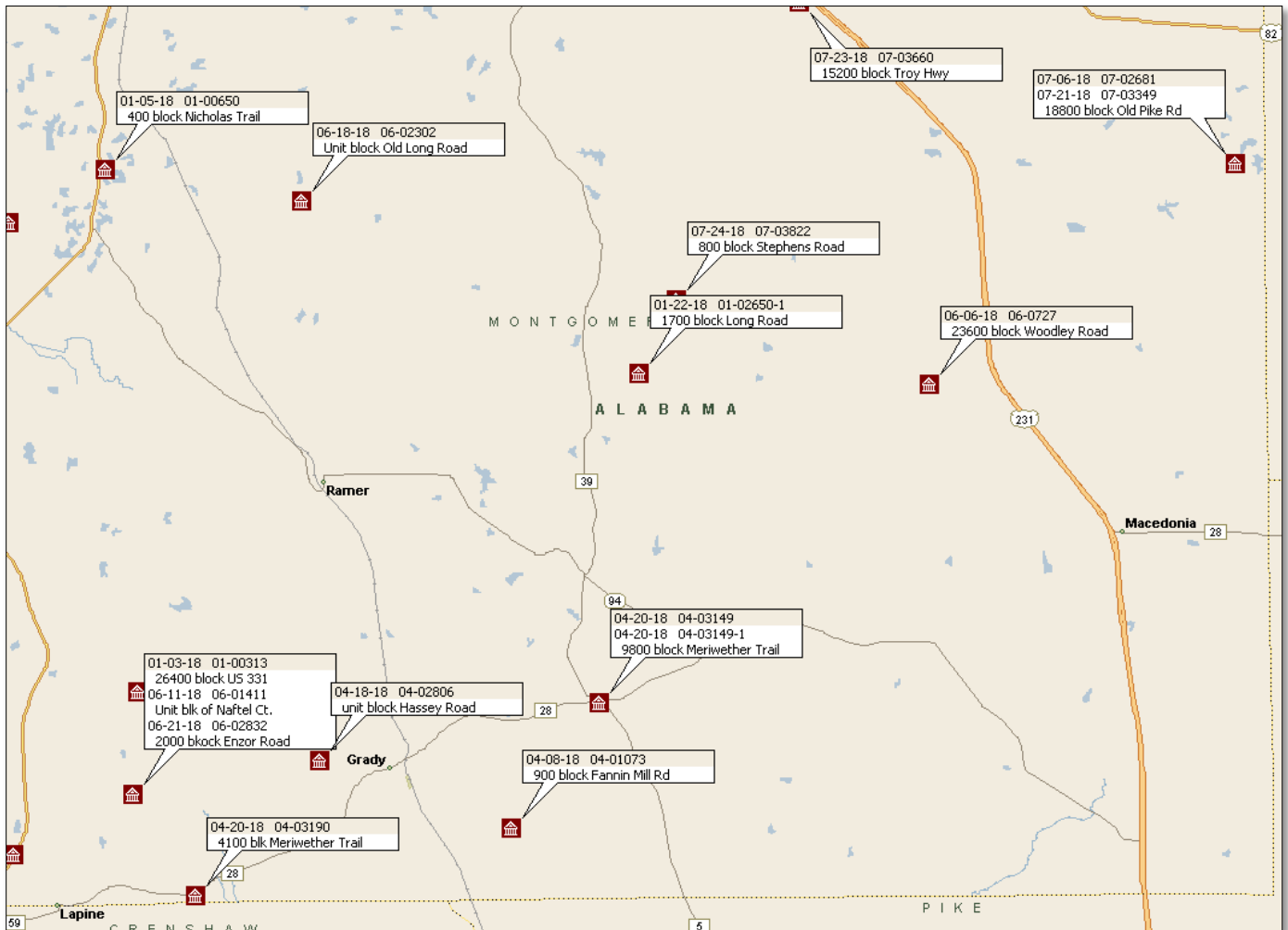

2018 First Quarter Deputy of the Quarter



In commending M.C.S.O. Deputy D. Moore, Sergeant R. Whitmore wrote: “On January 10, 2018 approximately 0430 hours, while patrolling Federal Road, Deputy D. Moore observed a 2002 Lincoln Navigator, maroon in color, towing a black enclosed trailer. Dep. Moore noticed the trailer did not have running lights. Dep. Moore followed the vehicle, observing it was not displaying a license plate. Dep. Moore initiated a traffic stop on Cloverfield Road. The vehicle pulled over and Dep. Moore exited his vehicle, the suspect vehicle fled a few hundred yards. The driver then stopped and ran into a wood line. The driver of the vehicle was not located. Upon further inspection of the trailer, it was observed that both hasps were broken, allowing access to the inside of the trailer. The trailer was discovered to be loaded with a large amount of power tools and assorted lawn equipment. It was discovered that the trailer and its contents were stolen from a hunting camp in Conecuh County, within hours of the traffic stop. The owner of the property expressed his gratitude that his property was recovered before he even knew it was stolen. The actions of Dep. Moore exhibited on this night were another prime example of his hard work and dedication to his chosen profession. Dep. Moore is very proactive during his patrol shift; he consistently leads his shift in traffic stops, arrests, and business checks. **Dep. Moore is a tremendous asset to the patrol division and he should be commended for a job well done.**

2018 Second Quarter Deputy of the Quarter



Lieutenant S. Cone, in his commendation of Deputy C. McGlown wrote: On June 12, 2018 at 1:41 p.m. Deputy McGlown was dispatched to a medical alarm call at Seven Oaks Drive in the Pike Road community. While en route to the call, dispatch gave an update and advised a female notified 911 that a vehicle had fallen on to a juvenile. When Deputy McGlown arrived on the scene, he observed an ATV turned on its side in a gravel driveway. The mother advised that her son was trapped under the vehicle, and no carjack was available. Deputy McGlown his carjack from his patrol vehicle and raced back to the scene. Due to the gravel driveway, the jack was ineffective. Deputy McGlown

used his body to lift the ATV off of the juvenile's body. This allowed the responding Pike Road paramedics and Haynes emergency personnel to get access to the victim. The ATV is weighed approximately 1,630 pounds. I would like to **commend Deputy McGlown** for his quick thinking and actions during this stressful event. His actions saved the life of a ten year old boy.

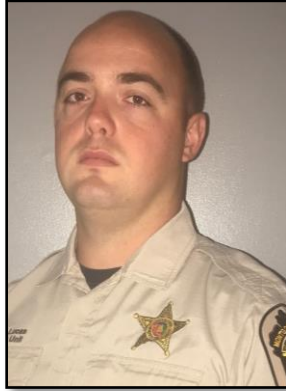

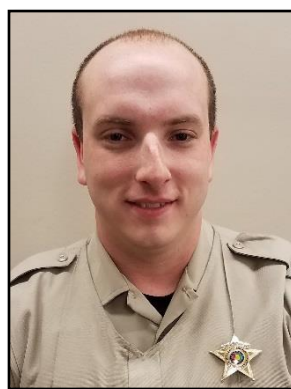

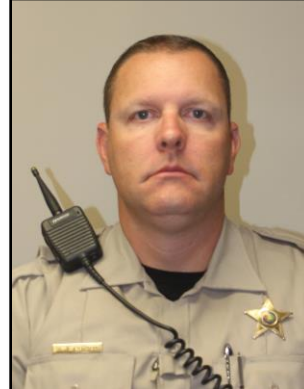

Montgomery County Sheriff's Office TO INCREASE ACCESS TO SAFE MEDICATION DISPOSAL WITH DRUG COLLECTION UNIT DONATED BY CVS HEALTH

Joint effort by CVS Health and Partnership for Drug-Free Kids aims to combat drug abuse, encourage safe drug disposal in local communities

On Friday, March 17, 2017, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office unveiled their new drug collection unit they received as part of CVS Health's Medication Disposal for Safer Communities Grant Program. The new unit will be located at Administrative Office of the Sheriff, at 100 South Lawrence (2nd floor lobby) and will provide residents with a safe and environmentally responsible way to dispose of unwanted, unused or expired medication, including controlled substances.

"CVS Health is dedicated to helping the communities we serve address and prevent prescription drug abuse," said Tom Davis, R.Ph. Vice President of Pharmacy Professional Services at CVS Health. "Reducing the amount of unused and unwanted medication in the home is critical to preventing prescription drug abuse. We are proud to work with the Partnership for Drug-Free Kids and local leaders to increase convenient access to safe medication disposal."

The new drug disposal unit will help to reduce the amount of unneeded medicine in residents' homes and decrease the potential for prescription drug abuse, which has soared in recent years, especially among teenagers. More than 70 percent of teenagers say it is easy to get prescription drugs from their parents' medicine cabinets, according to a Partnership for Drug-Free Kids study. Proper drug disposal also helps to prevent the contamination of local landfills and water supplies from unused medication.

Over the last few years, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has participated with the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and their Drug Take Program. We have collected hundreds of pounds of unused or expired medication. "Sheriff Derrick Cunningham and the staff of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office are proud to partner with CVS and would like to thank them for providing this grant opportunity. This Drug Collection Unit will help us offer the citizens of Montgomery a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating them about the potential for abuse and misuse of medication". The Medication Disposal for Safer Communities program has donated more than 600 drug collection units to law enforcement agencies across the country, which have collected more than 47 metric tons or 100,000 pounds, of unwanted medication. CVS Health also assists law enforcement by supporting local drug take back events and promoting local drug disposal collection sites.

MCSO Firearms Familiarization Course

Warner Road and most of the day and is **FREE** to Montgomery County citizens! The morning session is classroom instruction on firearm safety and firearm laws. The afternoon session allows citizens to practice shooting on our Firing Range for the remainder of the class (if you would like). All classes are under the instruction of the Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office Range Master.

Sheriff's Office APP

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has a new phone app called "Montgomery County AL Sheriff" that can be accessed through your phone's app store. Once you have added this app to your phone, you can easily set your phone up to receive important push notifications. Push notifications are quick, important messages that can notify you of road closure(s), blocked road(s), anything pertinent to your travel, escapee, etc. While our app can help you with many things including checking to see if someone is in the county jail, it is most helpful to receive push notifications. After you have downloaded the app, go through the follow steps to make sure your phone is set up to receive the push notifications:



- Go to your phone's setting icon
 - Scroll down and click "Applications"
 - Scroll down to "MCSO" or "Montgomery County Sheriff"
- OR
- Click "Application Manager", if it doesn't take you directly to the location
 - Click "Notifications"
 - Turn 'on' "Allow Notifications" and "Previews in pop-ups"
