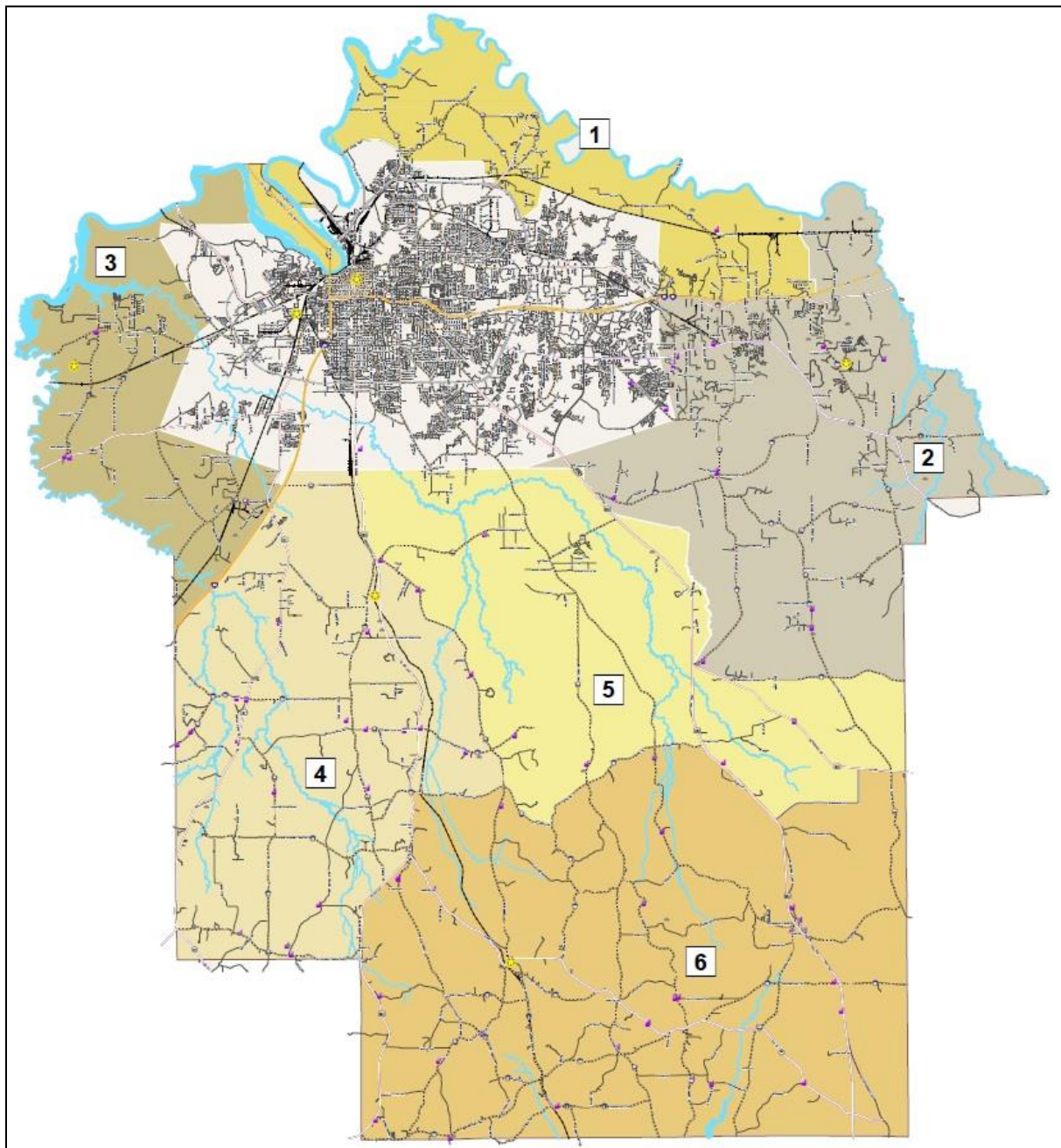

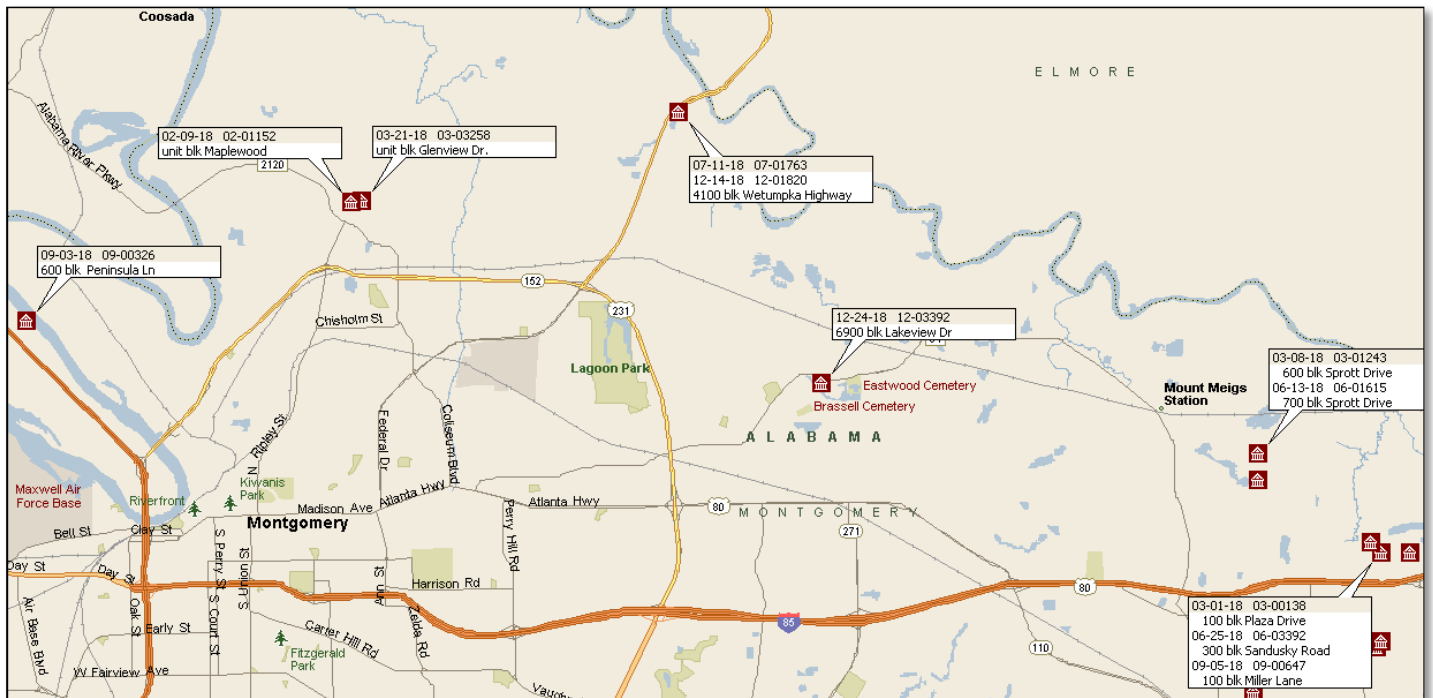

Red squares indicate locations of residential burglaries

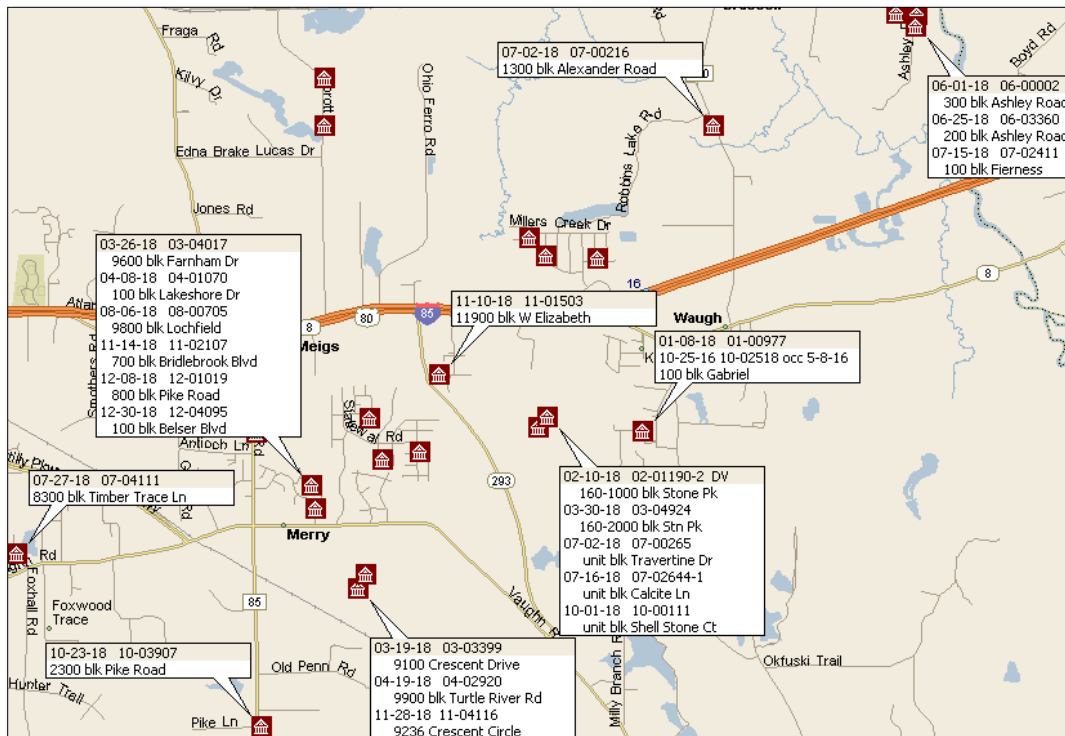

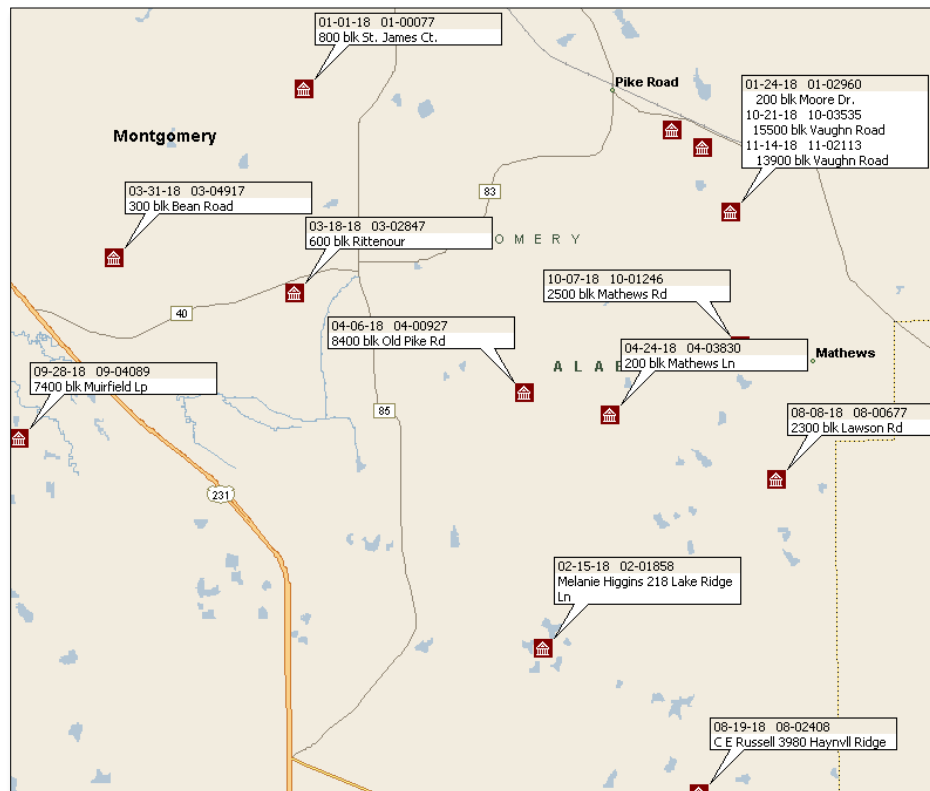

District 2 Arrests

The day after a District 2 burglary occurred, investigators received a tip that a suspect had been seen in the Woodland Creek area. Patrol and investigators saturated the area. A (stolen) suspect's vehicle was located in the area. Soon afterwards, a resident of the community notified dispatch of a suspicious person running through back yards. The suspect was spotted by deputies and apprehended after a brief foot pursuit. Most all of the stolen property has been recovered.

Arrested: Thomas Eugene Owens age 29, of Montgomery.

Charges: Burglary III (2 cts.), Property Theft I (2 cts.)

Neighbors and law enforcement working together to make our communities safer and crime free. Well done everyone!

Sgt. J. Woodfin was on patrol during the early morning hours in late December when he noticed a vehicle pulling an enclosed trailer, leaving a closed business in District 2. Noting that the trailer failed to display tail lights, Woodfin made a traffic stop. Further investigation revealed the trailer was stolen. The three vehicle occupants were charged in the theft.

An individual who had a history of accepting advance payments for work which he failed to perform, has been arrested for theft by deception in a complaint filed by a resident of District 2. Cpl. A. Painter was assigned the case and discovered surrounding law enforcement agencies had similar complaints on the suspect filed in their jurisdictions. Working together they were able to establish a pattern of deception by the suspect. Painter secured a theft warrant against Robert Brewster in the MCSO complaint. Brewster was located in Leeds, Alabama. He was arrested and returned to Montgomery for prosecution.

Arrested: Robert Edgar Brewster, Jr. age 41, of Brilliant, Alabama.

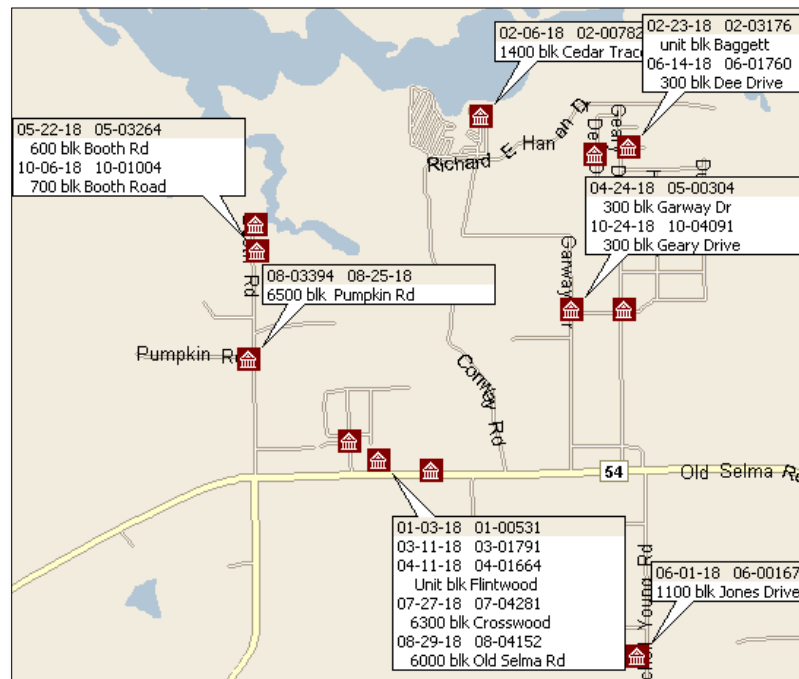

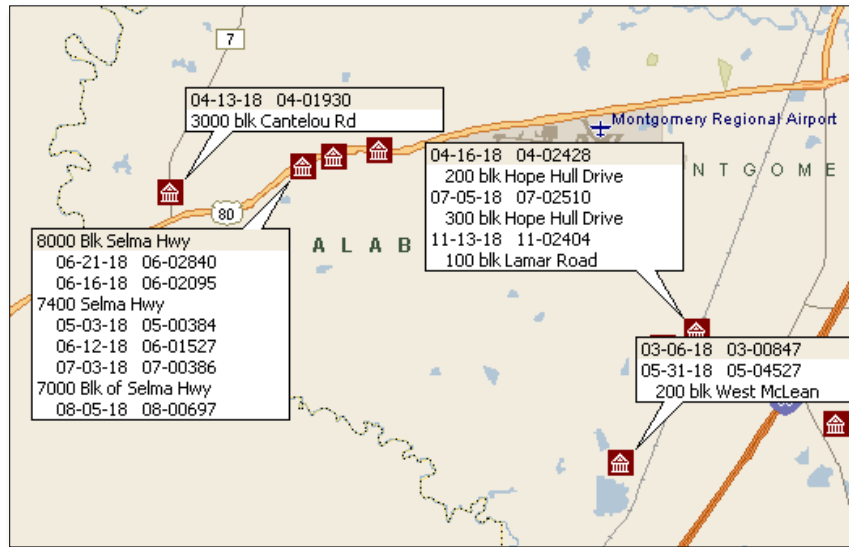

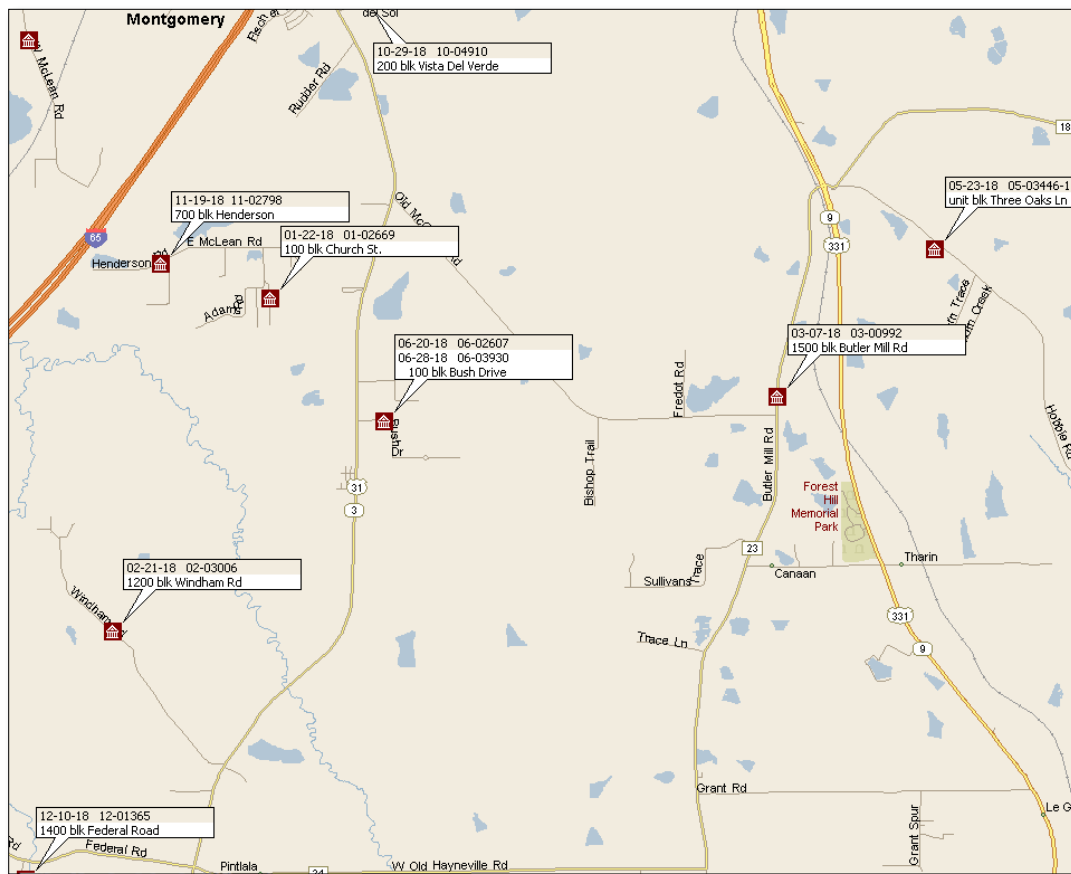

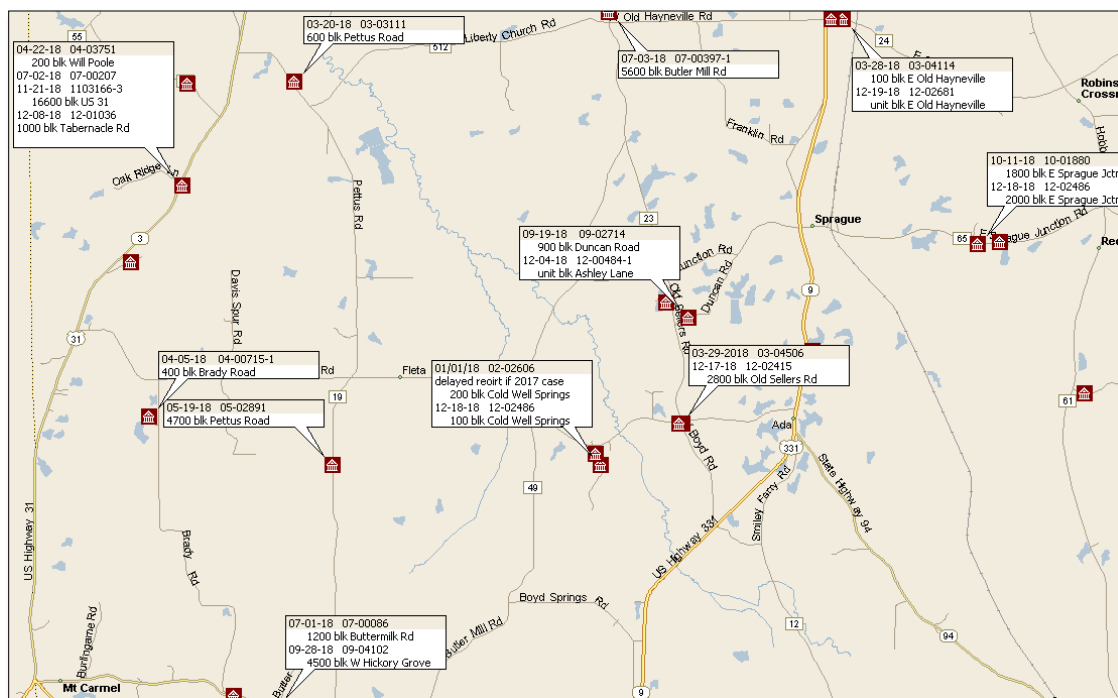

District 4 Arrests

JUVENILE OFFENDER age 15

No photograph is available due to the age of the offender.

In late November a series of crimes in District 4 were cleared by arrest due to the efforts of homeowners, deputies, and other area law enforcement agencies. A home owner on Will Poole Road reported his vehicle stolen and observed it at a nearby residence. A suspect was seen fleeing into the woods near the residence. Responding deputies located an abandoned vehicle nearby, reportedly stolen from Meridian, Mississippi.

A state dog-tracking team was summoned to the area, where the suspect was last seen, and started tracking him. The team located various items, later identified as from the stolen vehicle. The dog team lost the scent, ending the pursuit, however, deputies continued intensively searching the area. Law enforcement agencies statewide were also alerted.

Several hours later a US 31 resident reported an attempted burglary and provided a security video showing the suspect armed with a handgun while attempting to gain entry to his residence. As deputies were investigating the attempted burglary, a nearby resident reported another vehicle stolen in the area. This vehicle was later located in Enterprise, Alabama, where a juvenile, fitting the description of the Montgomery County suspect, was detained.

Arrested: Ashton Leigh King age 25, of Ramer.

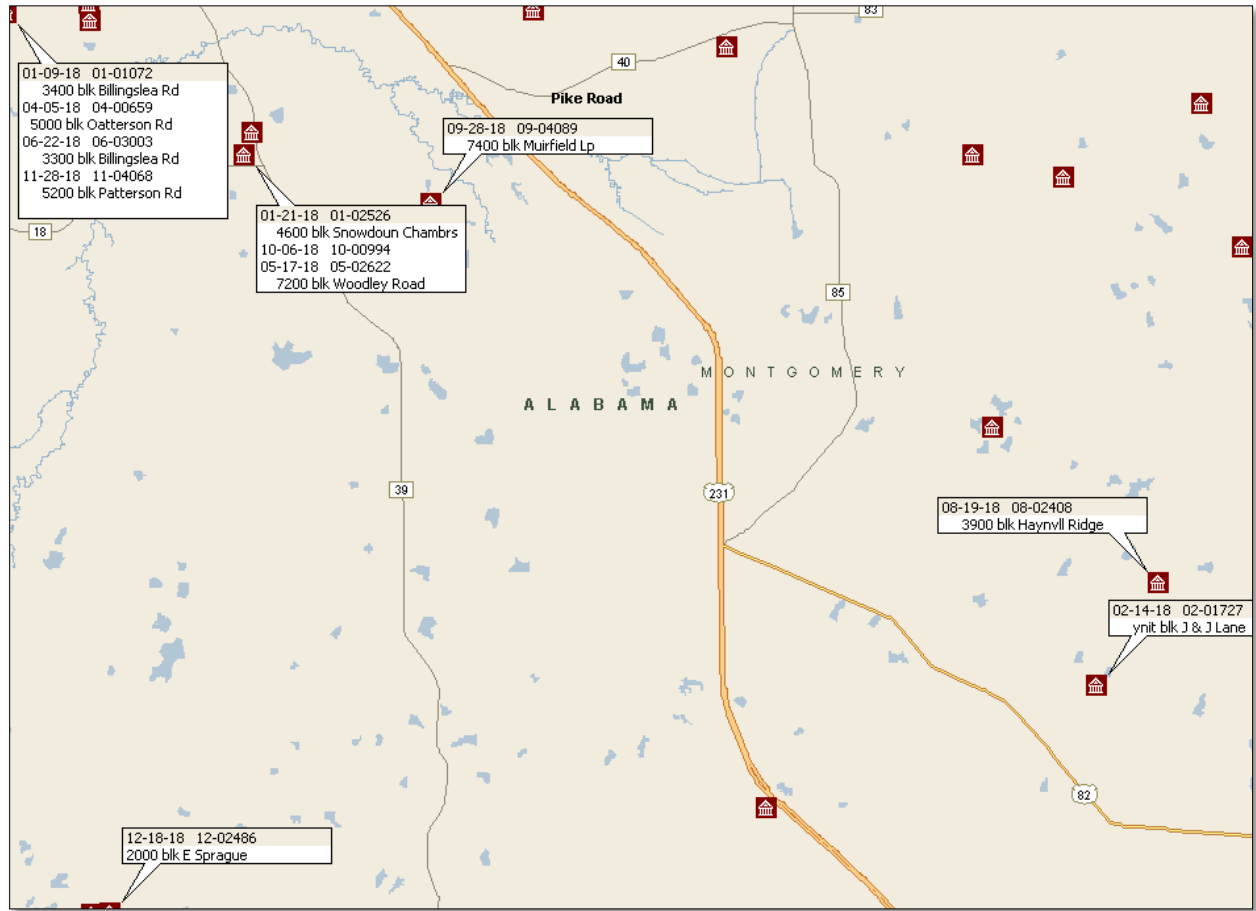

In November Montgomery Police and the Lowndes County Sheriff's office alerted area law enforcement of robberies occurring within hours of each other near I-65. The suspect and vehicle description were similar. Cpl. Gil Robinson located the vehicle in District 6 and detained the two suspects.

The male confessed to both robberies. The vehicle used in the offenses had been stolen several months earlier in Albertville, Alabama. Preston Swain and Kathryn King were charged with Receiving Stolen Property, related to the vehicle. Swain has been charged by Montgomery Police and Lowndes County with two counts of Robbery in the first degree.

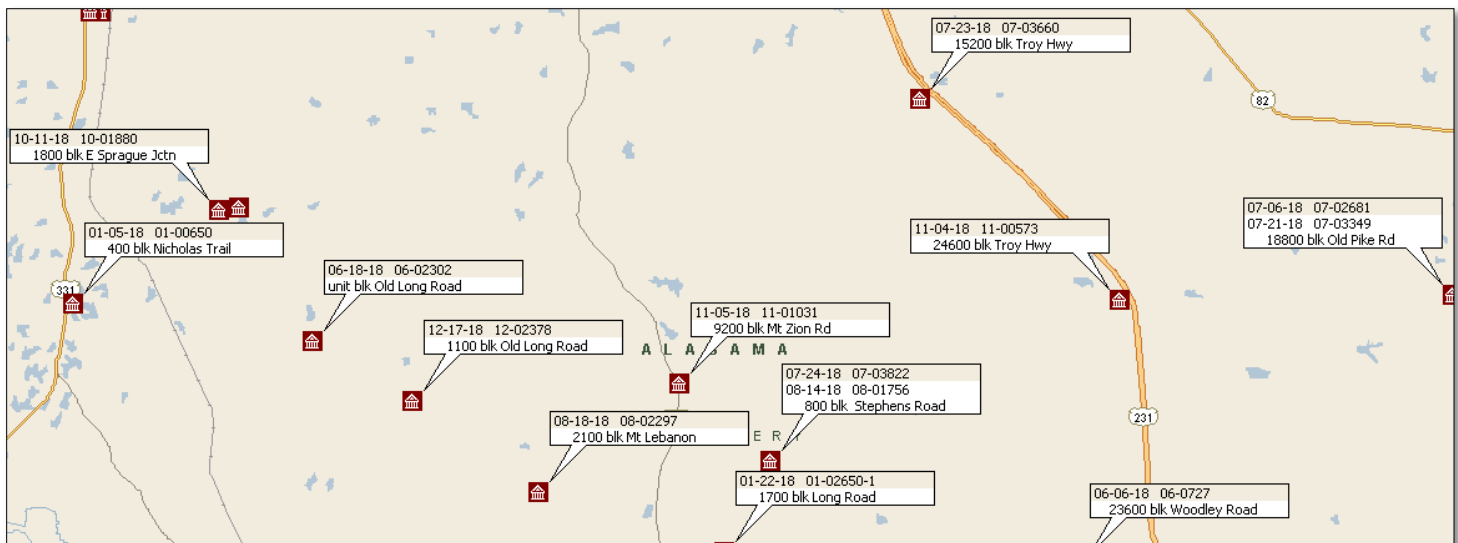

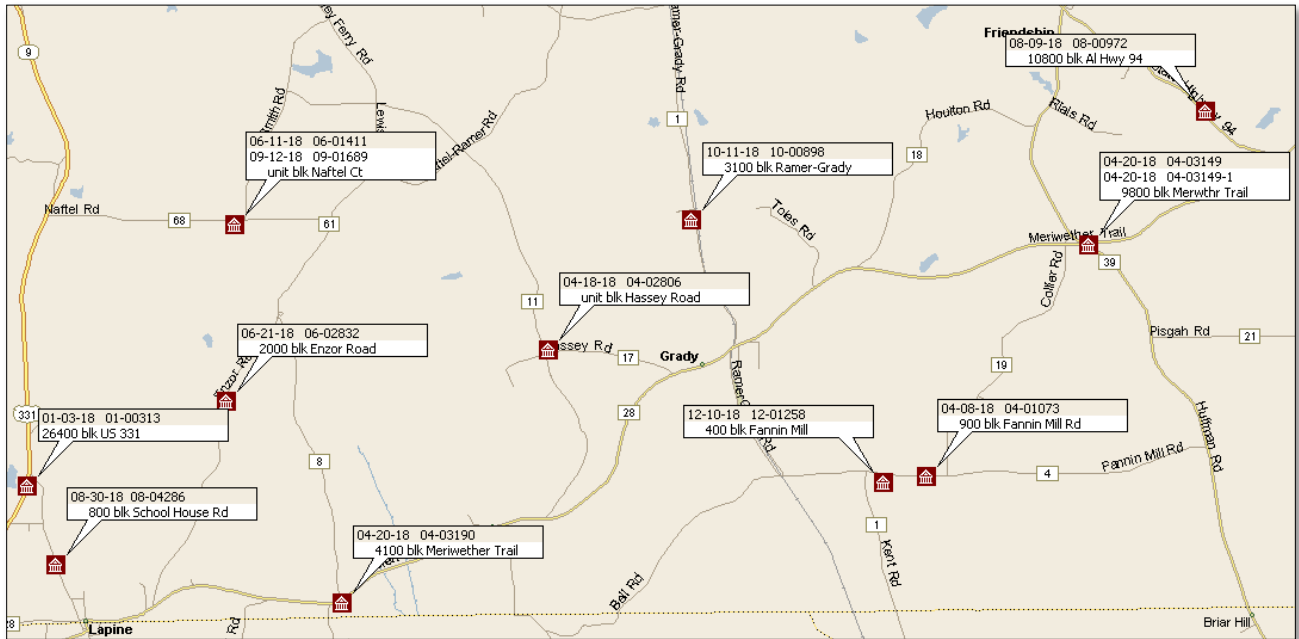

2018 Deputy of the Year

The family of a young accident victim and Sheriff Cunningham joined members of the Montgomery County Commission at its December meeting. Deputy Charles McGlown was commended for his actions during an emergency call that occurred in June. Deputy McGlown was dispatched to an accident in the Pike Road community. When Deputy McGlown arrived on the scene, he observed an ATV overturned in a gravel driveway, trapping a child underneath. The mother advised that her son was under the vehicle. Deputy McGlown lifted the ATV, which weighs 1,630 lbs., off of the juvenile, which allowed paramedics and emergency personnel to quickly treat the victim for trauma. Deputy McGlown's quick thinking and swift actions saved the life of a ten-year-old boy. Deputy Charles McGlown's heroism brought great credit to himself and the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. He was chosen as the 2018 Deputy of the Year.

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office is now accepting applications for our *Citizens Academy*. The Citizens Academy was established in 1997 to educate the citizens of Montgomery County on how the Sheriff's Office operates and to promote public safety among our community members. Classes are designed to be interesting as well as informative. Citizens are given an opportunity to ride with a deputy on patrol, tour the County Jail, volunteer at events that are sponsored by the Sheriff's Office as well as train on the Firearms Training Simulator. The course is a free 6-week course that meets on Monday evenings from 6:00-7:00 p.m. at our office, located at 115 South Perry Street and is taught by Sheriff's Office deputies and Correctional Officers. All materials will be discussed during the meetings and neither homework nor physical activity is required.

Montgomery County Sheriff's Office TO INCREASE ACCESS TO SAFE MEDICATION DISPOSAL WITH DRUG COLLECTION UNIT DONATED BY CVS HEALTH

Joint effort by CVS Health and Partnership for Drug-Free Kids aims to combat drug abuse, encourage safe drug disposal in local communities

On Friday, March 17, 2017, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office unveiled their new drug collection unit they received as part of CVS Health's Medication Disposal for Safer Communities Grant Program. The new unit will be located at Administrative Office of the Sheriff, at 100 South Lawrence (2nd floor lobby) and will provide residents with a safe and environmentally responsible way to dispose of unwanted, unused or expired medication, including controlled substances.

"CVS Health is dedicated to helping the communities we serve address and prevent prescription drug abuse," said Tom Davis, R.Ph. Vice President of Pharmacy Professional Services at CVS Health. "Reducing the amount of unused and unwanted medication in the home is critical to preventing prescription drug abuse. We are proud to work with the Partnership for Drug-Free Kids and local leaders to increase convenient access to safe medication disposal."

The new drug disposal unit will help to reduce the amount of unneeded medicine in residents' homes and decrease the potential for prescription drug abuse, which has soared in recent years, especially among teenagers. More than 70 percent of teenagers say it is easy to get prescription drugs from their parents' medicine cabinets, according to a Partnership for Drug-Free Kids study. Proper drug disposal also helps to prevent the contamination of local landfills and water supplies from unused medication.

Over the last few years, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has participated with the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and their Drug Take Program. We have collected hundreds of pounds of unused or expired medication. "Sheriff Derrick Cunningham and the staff of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office are proud to partner with CVS and would like to thank them for providing this grant opportunity. This Drug Collection Unit will help us offer the citizens of Montgomery a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating them about the potential for abuse and misuse of medication". The Medication Disposal for Safer Communities program has donated more than 600 drug collection units to law enforcement agencies across the country, which have collected more than 47 metric tons or 100,000 pounds, of unwanted medication. CVS Health also assists law enforcement by supporting local drug take back events and promoting local drug disposal collection sites.

MCSO Firearms Familiarization Course



We have already begun our firearms course to “familiarize” Montgomery County citizens about the laws and proper use of a firearm. We know that learning how to protect yourself is very important in today’s world. Our course is held one Saturday a month. The next class has been scheduled for the following date:

The class is held at our Sheriff D. T. Marshall Firearms Training Center located at 6900 Janet

Warner Road and is **FREE** to Montgomery County citizens! The morning session is classroom instruction on firearm safety and firearm laws. The afternoon session allows citizens to practice shooting on our Firing Range for the remainder of the class (if you would like). All classes are under the instruction of the Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office Range Master.

Sheriff's Office APP

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has a new phone app called "Montgomery County AL Sheriff" that can be accessed through your phone's app store. Once you have added this app to your phone, you can easily set your phone up to receive important push notifications. Push notifications are quick, important messages that can notify you of road closure(s), blocked road(s), anything pertinent to your travel, escapee, etc. While our app can help you with many things including checking to see if someone is in the county jail, it is most helpful to receive push notifications. After you have downloaded the app, go through the follow steps to make sure your phone is set up to receive the push notifications:



- Go to your phone's setting icon
 - Scroll down and click "Applications"
 - Scroll down to "MCSO" or "Montgomery County Sheriff"
- OR
- Click "Application Manager", if it doesn't take you directly to the location
 - Click "Notifications"
 - Turn 'on' "Allow Notifications" and "Previews in pop-ups"
