Extra precautions are in place for poll workers and voters

- Face masks, face shields, temperature checks, hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes, etc.

Voters will be required to:

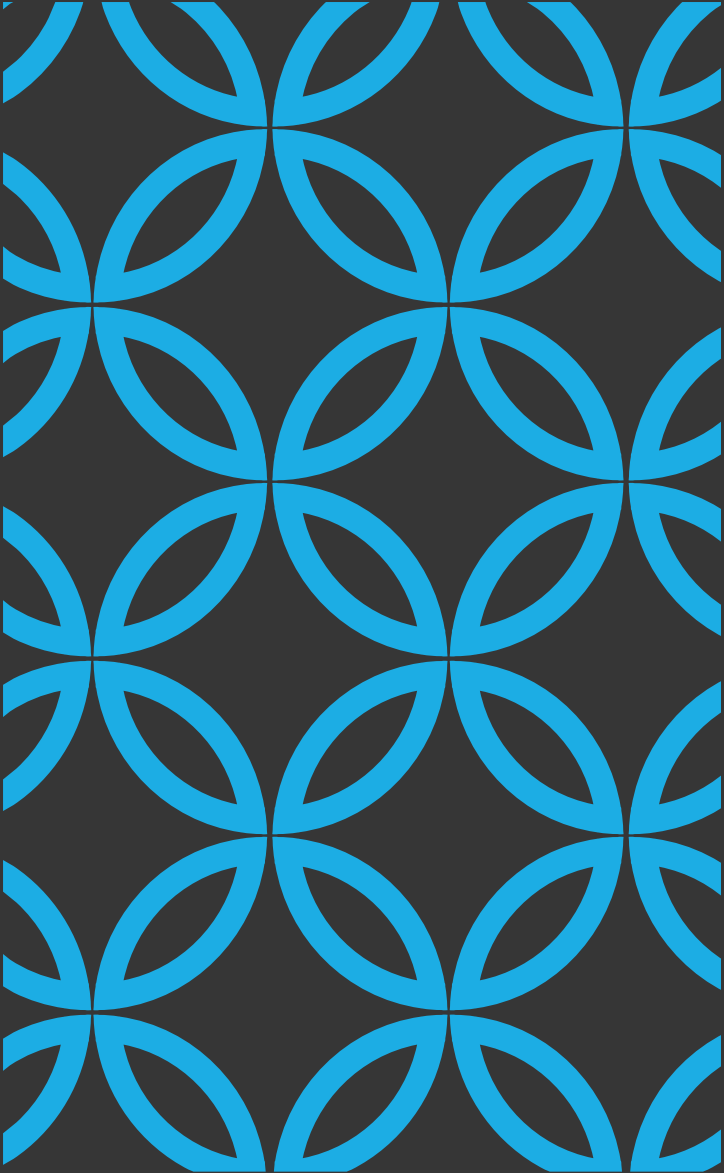
- Have their temperature checked prior to entry of voting area
- If running a fever, they will vote in a separate area
- Masks ***should*** be worn at all times within the facility
 - If the voter does not have a mask, one will be provided for them
 - If a voter refuses to wear a mask, they will vote in a separate area
- Issued a glove upon entry to wear and use for touching the stylus on the Poll Pad, the Poll Pad itself, and the ExpressVote
- Pens will be issued and disposed of upon exit of facility
- Hand Sanitizer stations placed within facility
- Social Distancing (6-foot spacing) must be enforced

Poll Workers will be required to:

- Wear MASK AND FACE SHIELD ***at all times***
- Wear gloves and use separate stylus from voters
- Practice Social Distancing as best you can

HOW IS THIS GOING TO WORK?





WHAT WILL STAY THE SAME?

Polls open at 7 AM and close at 7 PM

You need to be ON TIME – **6:00 AM.**

Dress appropriately

Set everything up! You *MUST* be up and running by 7:00 a.m.

Tabulators & ExpressVotes up and running

Poll Pads set-up with printer test done, ready for voters

Be sworn in

Signs where voters can see them

Don't forget payroll on the Help Desk Poll Pad!

CALL WHEN YOU ARE UP AND RUNNING!!!

WHAT WILL CHANGE?

Precincts will be disinfected and cleaned prior to and after Election Day

All equipment will be disinfected prior to Election Day

- **You will need to disinfect tables, Poll Pads & Stylus', Tabulators, and ExpressVotes throughout the day at 1 to 2-hour intervals (or more frequently if you or your Chief Inspectors feels necessary)**

You must wear a face mask and face shield

Voters must wear a face mask

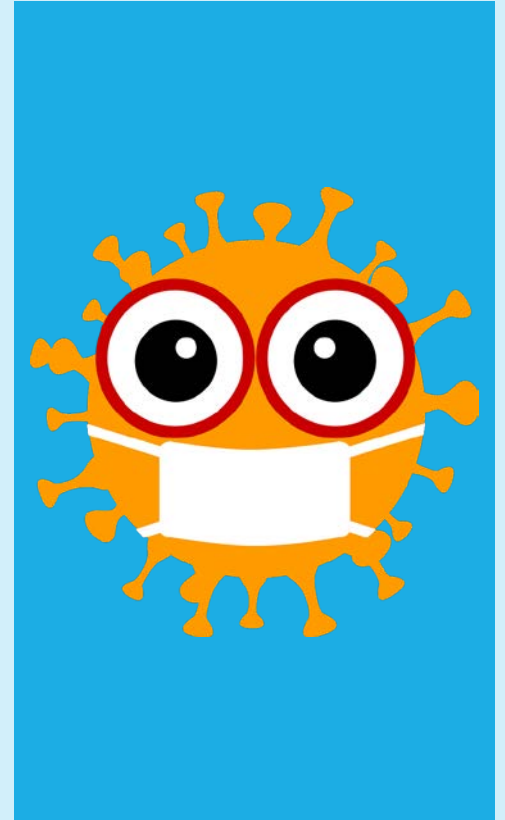
- **Any voter that does not have one will be issued one while supplies last**
- **Any voter that refuses to wear a mask will be asked to vote in a separate area**

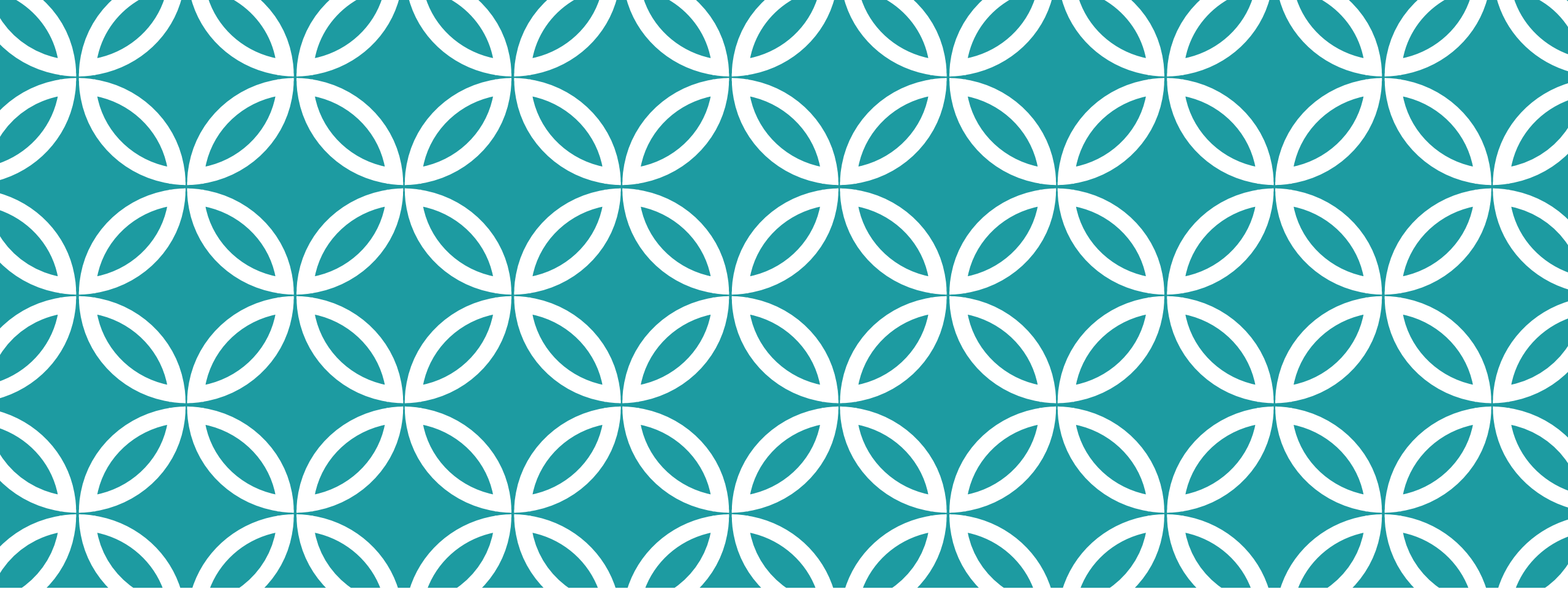
Hand Sanitizer will be on each table for you to use – and – gloves will be provided for you

You will have a separate stylus for you to use from the voter

Voters will be issued one glove to use while in the precinct for holding the stylus, for pens to mark the ballot, etc.

Temperature will be checked for anyone entering the facility – if the voter has a fever, they will vote in a separate area



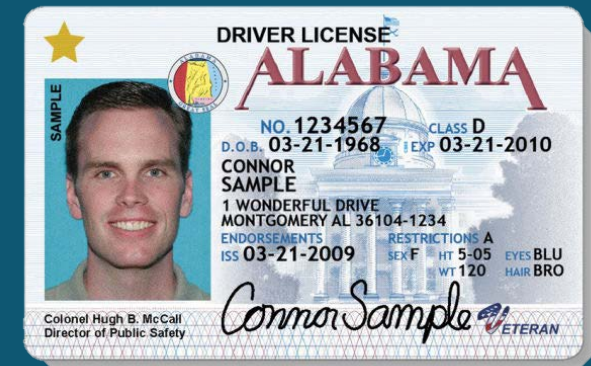


ELECTION DAY BASICS



VOTER IDENTIFICATION & POLL PAD

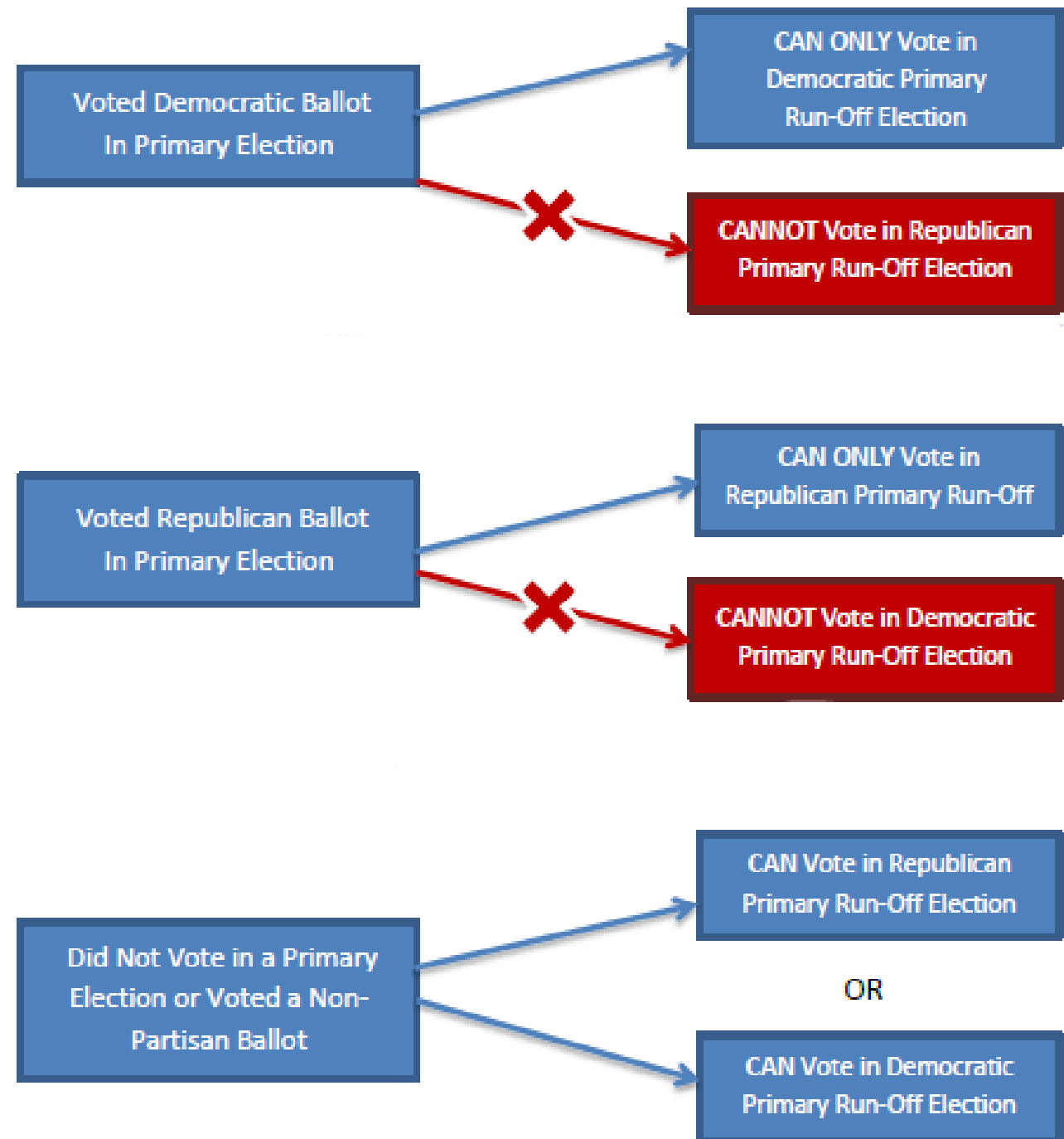
- Alabama Drivers License or Alabama Non-Drivers I.D. are the only I.D.'s that can be scanned
- All other forms of I.D. – you will have to do a manual search for the voter
- Please make sure that you double-check the person's ID against the voter on the Poll Pad!!!
- YOU SHOULD HAVE THE LIST OF I.D.'S FROM THE CHIEF INSPECTOR NOTEBOOK FOR YOUR TABLE
- NO CROSS-OVER VOTING (next slide)
- Absentee next to their name → send to Help Desk
- Listed as Inactive → send to Help Desk
- I.D. expired → send to Help Desk



* If it is anything out of the ordinary, you will send to the Help Desk *

CROSS-OVER VOTING

- Not all precincts will have a Democratic Ballot (103 & 303) and some split precincts will only have a few voters eligible for the Democratic Ballot.
 - Only State Board of Education District 5 is on the Democratic Ballot
- If a voter voted in the Primary, they **MUST** vote the same party in the Run-Off
- If a voter **DID NOT** vote in the Primary, then they may choose the party for their ballot

REMEMBER!!!

No campaigning within 30 feet from the entrance to the Facility

ONLY VOTERS can wear political apparel as long as they vote and leave – they cannot campaign while in line

Candidates CANNOT stop in and “see how things are going”, etc. – if they are not there to vote, they cannot be there

A voter CAN take a picture of their own BALLOT ONLY

Poll Watchers– 1 per candidate and must have a letter to Chief Inspectors

- They CANNOT socialize with voters or poll workers
- They CANNOT sit and talk on the phone or take pictures with their phone
- They CANNOT interfere with your job
