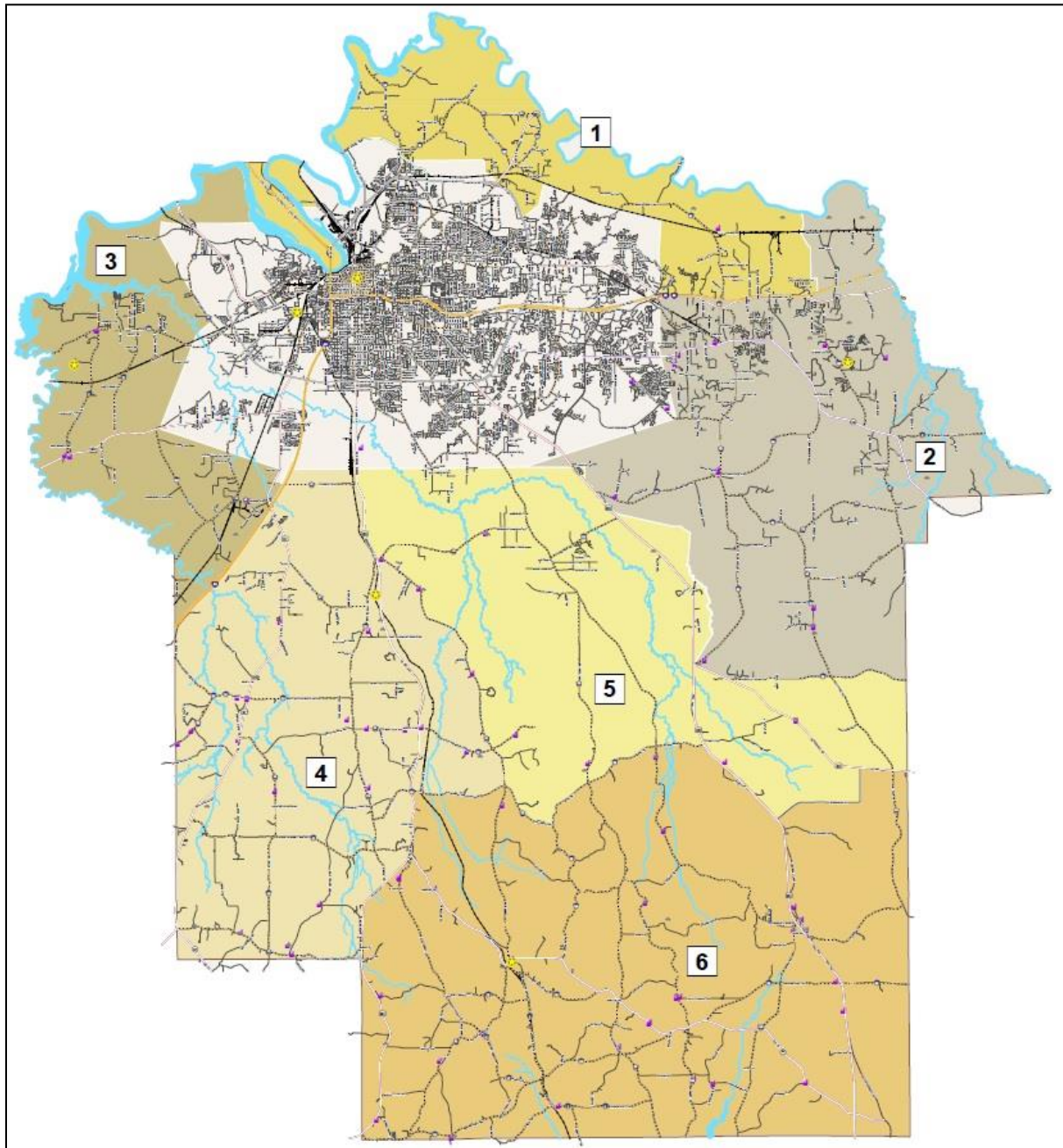

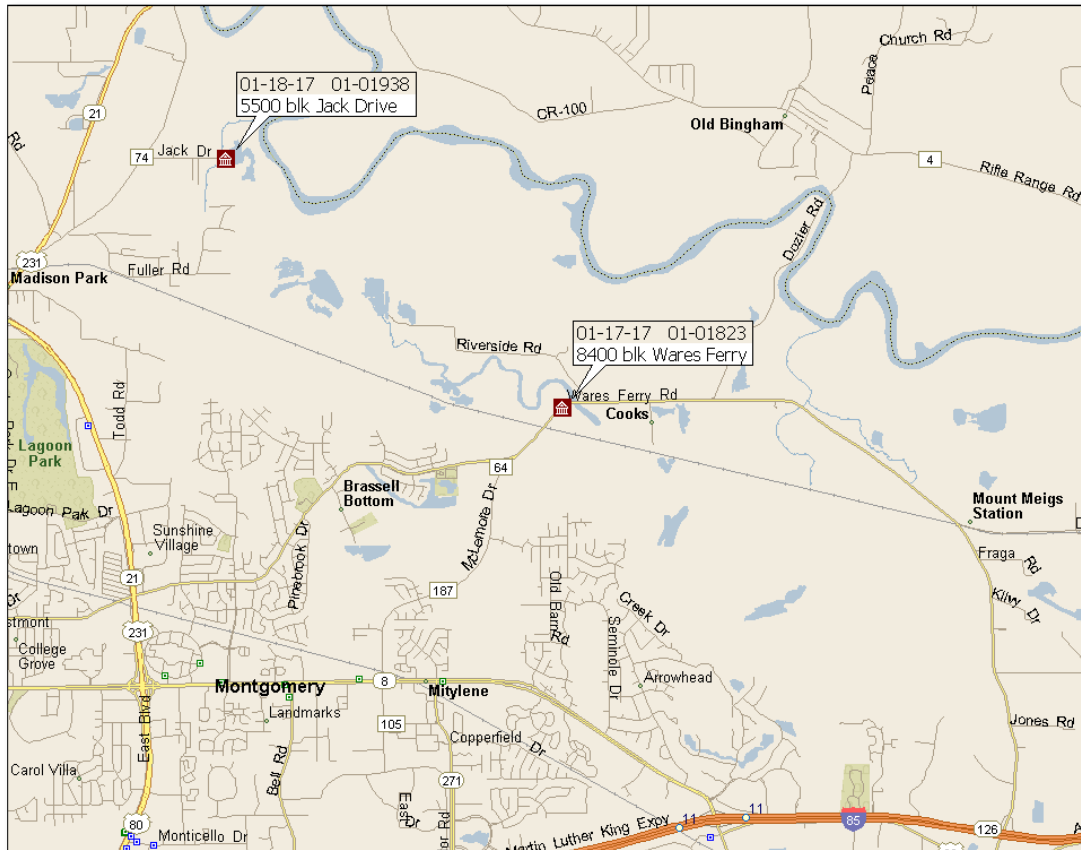

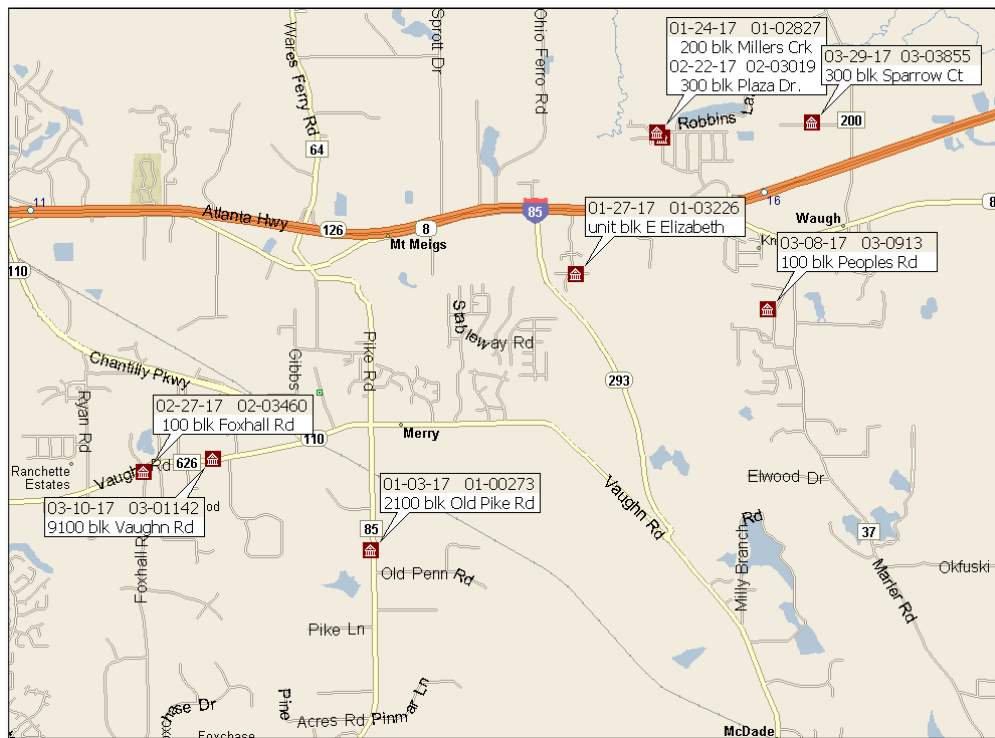

M.C.S.O. Deputy W. Wilkerson was on patrol in District 2 when he spotted a suspicious vehicle moving in the opposite direction. Wilkerson attempted to catch up to the vehicle and found an assortment of tools in the roadway upon entering a subdivision which the vehicle had entered. The vehicle was located abandoned nearby; the driver having apparently fled on foot. Cpl. K. Gordon of M.C.S.O. Investigations followed up on the vehicle chased by Wilkerson; determined who had been driving the vehicle; and matched some of the tools as having been stolen in a breaking and entering of a vehicle in District 2 earlier that night. Other tools were later identified as being stolen in the burglary of a work shop at a District 2 residence. The below have been arrested and charged in these cases.

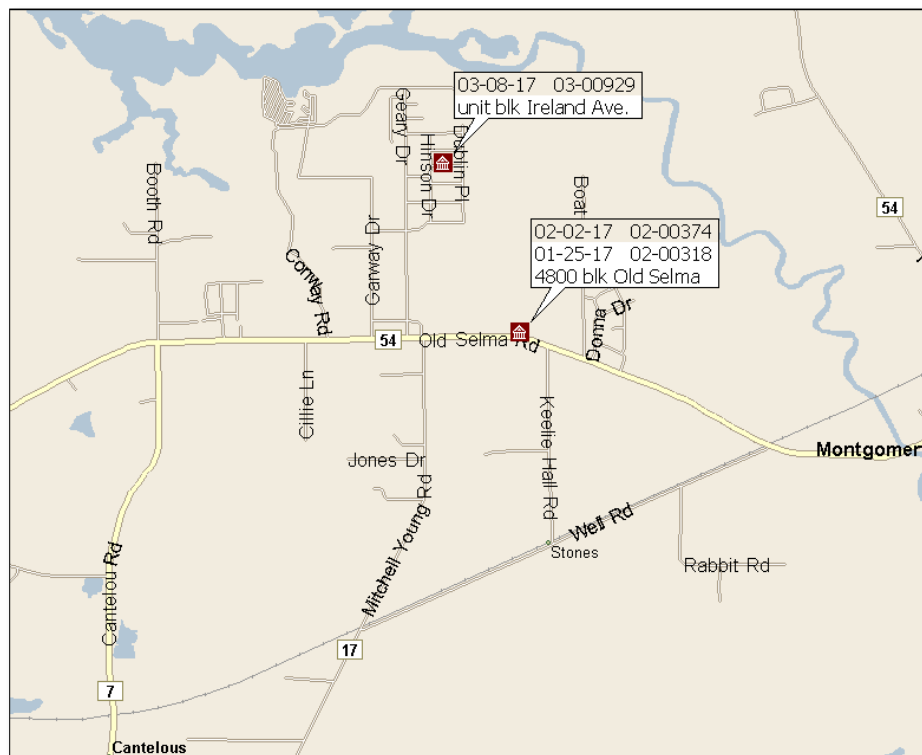

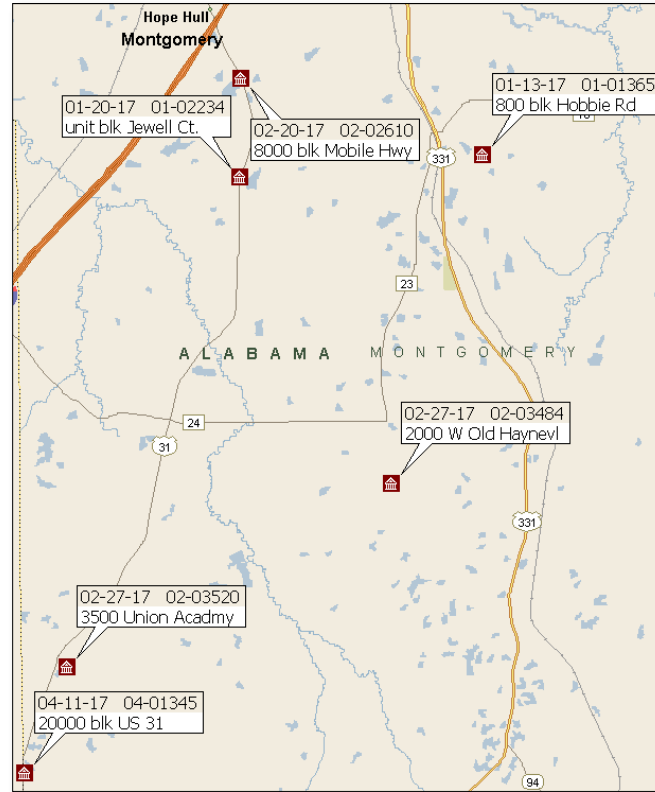

During February, Montgomery Police stopped the below person driving a vehicle stolen in their jurisdiction which had several pieces of yard equipment in the trunk. One of the items had a repair tag of a District 4 resident. The person on the repair tag was contacted; checked her garage area; and found it had been burglarized with the recovered lawn equipment stolen. M.C.S.O. was contacted; a report of the burglary was made; and Inv. Cpl. J. Davis developed evidence at the crime scene which further linked the defendant to the burglary.

In mid-February a theft was reported from a local business in Hope Hull. The business video system provided a description of a suspect and his vehicle. A few days later Off-duty Patrol Deputy J. Flowers spotted the vehicle and suspect at a Montgomery College Campus. Flowers contacted M.C.S.O. dispatchers who in turn alerted on duty personnel. Responding Deputies took the below suspect into custody who was ultimately charged with the theft.

Charges: Property Theft II.

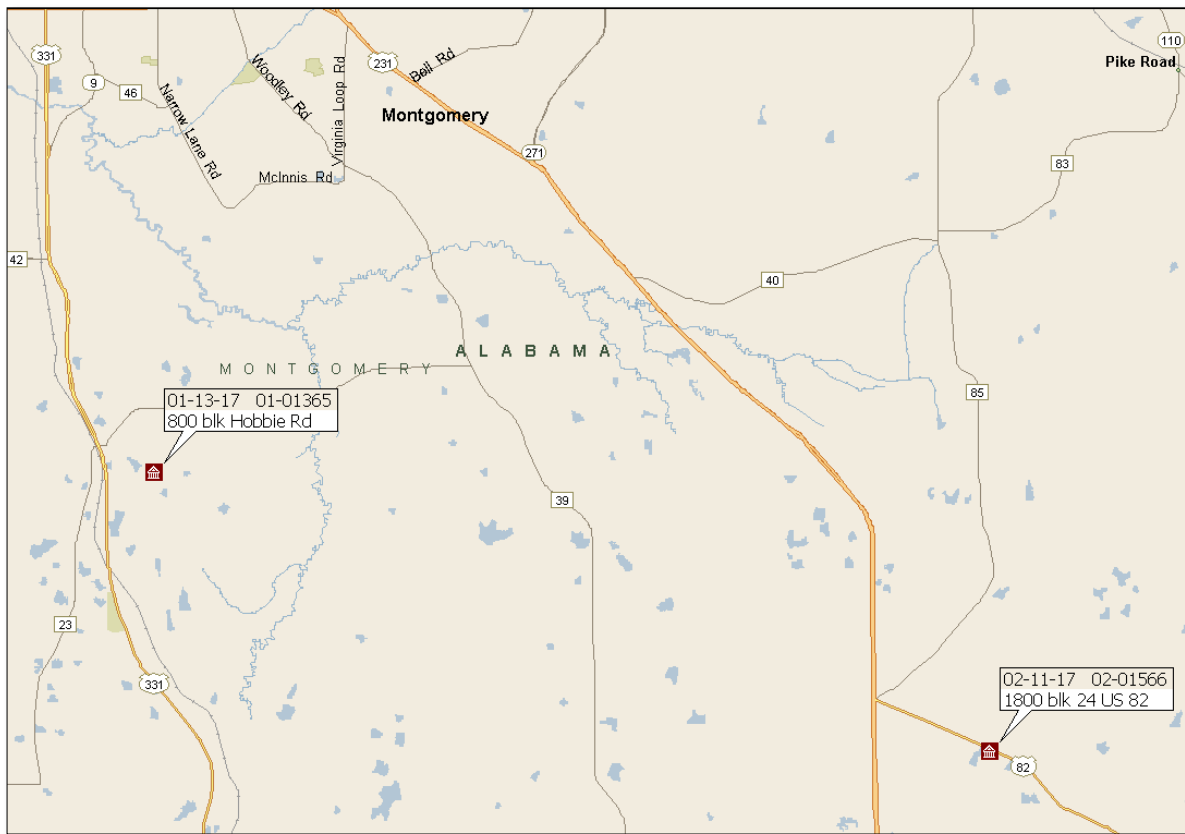

Map showing 2017 Residential Burglaries in District 5



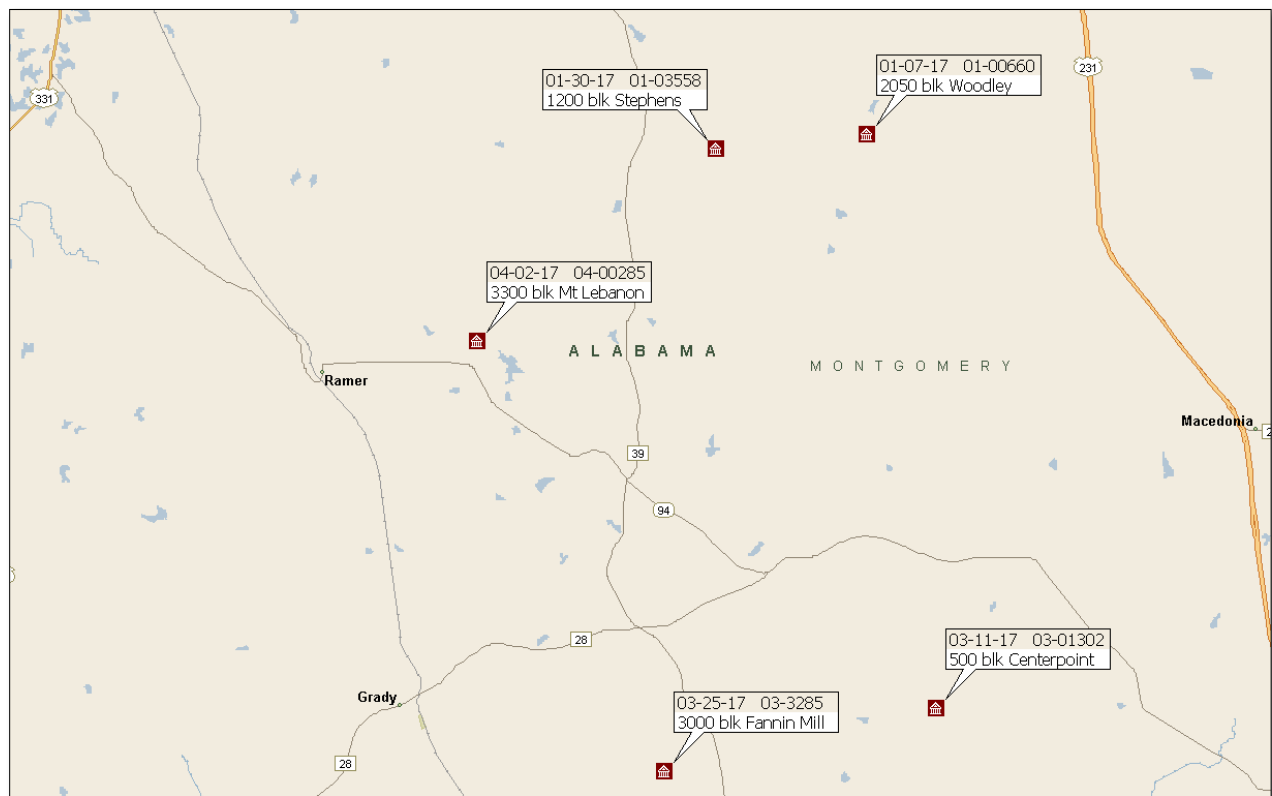

Montgomery County Sheriff's Office TO INCREASE ACCESS TO SAFE MEDICATION DISPOSAL WITH DRUG COLLECTION UNIT DONATED BY CVS HEALTH

Joint effort by CVS Health and Partnership for Drug-Free Kids aims to combat drug abuse, encourage safe drug disposal in local communities

On Friday, March 17, 2017, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office unveiled their new drug collection unit they received as part of CVS Health's Medication Disposal for Safer Communities Grant Program. The new unit will be located at Administrative Office of the Sheriff, at 100 South Lawrence (2nd floor lobby) and will provide residents with a safe and environmentally responsible way to dispose of unwanted, unused or expired medication, including controlled substances.

"CVS Health is dedicated to helping the communities we serve address and prevent prescription drug abuse," said Tom Davis, R.Ph. Vice President of Pharmacy Professional Services at CVS Health. "Reducing the amount of unused and unwanted medication in the home is critical to preventing prescription drug abuse. We are proud to work with the Partnership for Drug-Free Kids and local leaders to increase convenient access to safe medication disposal."

The new drug disposal unit will help to reduce the amount of unneeded medicine in residents' homes and decrease the potential for prescription drug abuse, which has soared in recent years, especially among teenagers. More than 70 percent of teenagers say it is easy to get prescription drugs from their parents' medicine cabinets, according to a Partnership for Drug-Free Kids study. Proper drug disposal also helps to prevent the contamination of local landfills and water supplies from unused medication.

Over the last few years, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has participated with the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and their Drug Take Program. We have collected hundreds of pounds of unused or expired medication. "Sheriff Derrick Cunningham and the staff of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office are proud to partner with CVS and would like to thank them for providing this grant opportunity. This Drug Collection Unit will help us offer the citizens of Montgomery a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating them about the potential for abuse and misuse of medication". The Medication Disposal for Safer Communities program has donated more than 600 drug collection units to law enforcement agencies across the country, which have collected more than 47 metric tons or 100,000 pounds, of unwanted medication. CVS Health also assists law enforcement by supporting local drug take back events and promoting local drug disposal collection sites.

The Citizens Academy was established in 1997 to educate the citizens of Montgomery County on how the Sheriff's Office operates and to promote public safety among our community members. The course is a 'free' 6-week course that meets on Monday evenings from 6:00-7:00 p.m. at our office, located at 115 South Perry Street and is taught by Sheriff's Office deputies and/or Correctional Officers. All material will be discussed during the meetings and neither homework nor physical activity is required.

We have already begun our firearms course to “familiarize” Montgomery County citizens about the laws and proper use of a firearm. We know that learning how to protect yourself is very important in today’s world. Our course is held one Saturday a month and has been scheduled for the following dates:

The class is held at our Firing Range and lasts all day and is **FREE** to Montgomery County citizens with a current pistol permit! The morning session is classroom instruction on firearm safety and firearm laws. The afternoon session allows citizens to practice shooting on our Firing Range for the remainder of the class. All classes are under the instruction of the Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office Range Master.

Sheriff's Office APP

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has a new phone app called "Montgomery County AL Sheriff" that can be accessed through your phone's app store. Once you have added this app to your phone, you can easily set your phone up to receive important push notifications. Push notifications are quick, important messages that can notify you of road closure(s), blocked road(s), anything pertinent to your travel, escapee, etc. While our app can help you with many things including checking to see if someone is in the county jail, it is most helpful to receive push notifications. After you have downloaded the app, go through the follow steps to make sure your phone is set up to receive the push notifications:



- Go to your phone's setting icon
 - Scroll down and click "Applications"
 - Scroll down to "MCSO" or "Montgomery County Sheriff"
- OR
- Click "Application Manager", if it doesn't take you directly to the location
 - Click "Notifications"
 - Turn 'on' "Allow Notifications" and "Previews in pop-ups"
